Posted with 2000 Men at Orovizza, about a days march fro a Turanowits, where the Imperial Forces were encamped, and that the Count de Lavergne, had resolved to march with his Horse and Diagoons toattack him there, before the succors he expected had joyned him. The Letters from Cracow, affure urthat the Polish Army had pissed the Niester, but do not say that the Forces of Lithuania had yet joyned them; There is a discourse still that the King would go and Command the Army in person, but it Is believed the ill State of his health would not

permit it.

Hambough, Ollober 9. The Sieur Minders, Envoy from the Blector of Brandenburgh, and the Sieur de Groot the Duke of Hanouers Minister, having formed a Project of an Accommodation, between the Duke of Zell and this City, they have put it into his H ghhesses hands, whose re-olution thereupon, we are now expecting. We have an account from Berlin that the Electoral Princels of Brandenburgh brought to bed the fixth instant of a Son, to the extraordinary joy of that Court. The last Letters from Warfin told us that the Court was gone to Zolkiew, where it was believed their Majeslies would pass a month or fix weeks. That the Arch-Bishop of Guefus Primare and first Senator of the Kingdom was dead of an Apoplexy, having by his Will given greateft part of his Effate to the King. That the Prince of Courland was gone to the Army with some other persons of the first Quality, but that it was thought the time of the year would not fuffer them to enter upon any great Action. They had an account that the Ottoman Forces Commanded by the Scrasquier Solymin had passed the Danube, and were on their march towards the Niester; And that a considerable Body of Tartars was likewise marching that way. have had several advices from Poland that the Czars of Moscowy were disposed to enter into the Alliance between the Emperor, the Crown of Poland and the Republick of Venice, against the Turks, but the Letters that come directly from Moscow, say the Inclination of that Court at present is altogether to

Cologne, October 9, Things are at present here in some suspence, the Imperial Commissioners expecting farther Instructions upon the account they have given the Emperor of their Proceedings here. The Deaceus that were put out of their Places about three years ago continue their instances to be restored, but have not yet obtained any answer from the Commissioners to their satisfaction; And it's believed they will not, because of the pretence all the old Magistrates would then have to be likewise restored; This week the Sindick Gulick, who was made a Prisoner at the demand of the said Commission.rs for having been one of the chief promoters of the dirorders that have fo long diffurbed the Peace of this City, was yesterday examined before them for the first time and it's said a Process is ordered to be made against him. They write from Fienna that the Sicur Mayersheims, was parted from thence in Quality of Envey Extraordinary from the Emperor to the Elector of Cologne. Don Juan de I'imentel. Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Spain, to the El Ctor Palatin, arrived here the 7th instant from Bruffels, and the next day continued Lis Journy for Eydelbergk.

Hague, Ollober 16. The Members of the States of Holland and Welf Frizeland, who adjourned the last week, are most of them arrived here this day in order to their re-affembling to morrow. The Prince of Orange came hither last night but intends in two or three days to go back to the Velume to pass some farther time there. The Deputies of the States General have had a Conference with the Council of Talbot Lin in Southwark, thall be well rawarded, Hague, Oflober 16. The Members of the States of

State, about giving the necessary Orders for the cleansing the lower Rhin, which work will now forth-with be taken in hand. The Landtgrave of Hesse Cassel, parted the 10th instant from Rotterdam, 111 a Yacht for Antwerp. The Letters from Vienna of the fourth instant confirm the news we had of the furrender of Caschaw.

Paris, October 17. The Marelchal a' Estrees is re. turned with the Fleet under his Command from the Coalt of Barbary to Thoulan, and is in few days expected at Court. The Princess de Comi has the Small-Pox. Monsieur de St. Romain, who was the Kings Amba Tador in Portugal, is arrived at Rochel in his return hither. The Letters from Germany give an account that the Town of Cafehaw in Upper Hungary had fent Deputies to General Caprara to accept of the General Amnestie; That Tockey was about doing the same; That Teckeley was dayly abandoned by those that were most his Considents, and that he himself did very earnestly sollicite the Emperors Pardon.
