THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with cer-"tain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Re-" venues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act " to explain and amend two several Acts relating " to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twentieth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ec-"clesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " Act to explain and amend two " several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Com-"missioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for carrying into effect a certain agreement made by us, subject to the ratification of your Majesty in Council, for commuting the estate, right and interest of the Reverend George Oliver, Doctor in Divinity, in the manors, messuages, farms, lands, tithes, rent charges, and other commutations for tithes, tenements and hereditaments belonging to him in respect of his office of Sacrist of the collegiate church or royal free chapel of Wolverhampton, in the county of Stafford, for the sum of three hundred and fifteen pounds, to be paid to the said George Oliver on the thirteenth day of April then next, and also for the annual sum of fifty-four pounds, to be paid to the said George Oliver so long as he should continue to hold the said office of Sacrist.

"And whereas it is by the suid recited Acts enacted, that, for the purpose of fully carrying into effect the provisions thereof, any arrangement may from time to time be made, with the consent in writing under the hand of any prebendary or other dignitary or officer of any cathedral or collegiate church, for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments in the possession or

enjoyment of such prebendary or other dignitary or officer, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments:

"And whereas, under other provisions and for the purposes of the said Acts, the whole property belonging to the said office of Sacrist in the said collegiate church would, upon the next vacancy thereof, become absolutely vested in us; and the Reverend George Oliver, Doctor in Divinity, was, at the time of the passing of the first recited Act, and of the making of the said agreement, the Incumbent of the said office:

"And whereas the said agreement was duly executed by the said George Oliver, and the said sum of three hundred and fifteen pounds was paid to the said George Oliver, pursuant to the terms of the said agreement, but the said George Oliver hath since resigned the said office, and the said property is now vested in us discharged from the payment of the said annuity:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that the said agreement, and all acts, measures and things done, and to be done, for carrying the same into effect, shall be valid and effectual in law, and binding upon the parties thereto, and upon all other persons whomsoever, to all intents and purposes.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registera of the diocese of Lichfield.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An " Act to carry into effect, with certain modifica-" tions, the fourth report of the Commissioners " of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to explain and amend " two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical " Commissioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for substituting a money payment to the canon and prebendary of the prebend of Weighton, in the cathedral church of York, for the property belonging to him as such canon and prebendary.

"Whereas, by and under the provisions of the said recited Acts, the whole of the separate estates and endowments belonging to the said canon and prebendary as such, consisting chiefly of certain lands, tenements, and hereditaments, in the parish of Market Weighton, in the county of York, will (excepting any right of patronage) upon the first avoidance of his prebend and canonry become absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls, in parishes where such assistance is most required:

"And whereas, it is by the same Acts enacted, that by the authority therein provided, and for the purposes of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement may, from time to time, be made, with the consent in writing under the hand of any canon or prebendary of any cathedral church for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to him as such, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or other hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting, in any case, any lands, tithes or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments:

"And whereas it was, on the twenty-sixth day of June last, agreed between us and the Reverend William Henry Dixon, the present owner of the said lands, tenements and hereditaments as canon and prebendary of Weighton, in the cathedral church of York, that the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council, with a view to sooner carrying into effect the purpose of the said recited Acts hereinbefore particularly mentioned:

" We, therefore, with the consent of the said William Henry Dixon, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose, that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and after the day of such gazetting, all lands, tithes, tenements and other hereditaments and endowments whatsoever (except any right of patronage) now belonging to the said William Henry Dixon as such canon and prebendary as aforesaid, or to or in which as such he has or ought to have any right, title or interest, shall, together with all right, title and interest therein (except as aforesaid), be and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by and from the said William Henry Dixon to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or

and that in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance there shall be paid by us to the said William Henry Dixon in each and every year, so long as he shall continue such canon and prebendary as aforesaid and no longer, the annual sum of four hundred and eighty-one pounds, by equal half yearly payments, on the twenty-sixth day of June and the twenty-sixth day of December, the first of such payments to be made on the twenty-sixth day of December next; provided that no renewal of any lease, nor any new lease of such lands, tenements, and hereditaments as aforesaid, or of any part or parts thereof, shall since the said twenty-sixth day of June last have been or shall be made or granted by the said William Henry Dixon; and that if the next avoidance of the said canonry and prebend shall happen on any other day than one of such two half yearly days of payment then a proportionate sum only shall be paid to the said William Henry Dixon or his representatives.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to make better provision for the " spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and " amend an Act for making better provision for the " spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for altering the bounds of the district of the Weir in the city of Bristol, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.

"Whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first-recited Act, at any time or times, within twelve months after the date of the licence of the minister first licenced to any separate district, constituted under the provisions of the same Act, to alter the bounds of such district, although any alteration be not required with a view to the constituting of another separate district; provided always, that the scheme for making any such alteration shall be subject to all the provisions relating to schemes for constituting separate districts under the said first-recited Act, and that any portion of any such separate district which, by any such alteration as aforesaid, shall become detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the parish, chapelry, or district out of which such portion was taken, upon such separate district being originally constituted, or to and of any new district as shall be determined by the like authority:

- "And whereas the said district of the Weirwas duly constituted out of the parishes of Saint Paul, Saint Peter, and Saint Philip and Jacob, in the said city of Bristol and diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, by a scheme prepared by us, and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the nineteenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and since duly gazetted:
- "And whereas the Reverend Adam Clarke Rowley was duly licenced as the first minister of the said district on the first day of October last:
- "And whereas it has since been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that the boundary of such district on the northern side thereof should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:
- " Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Henry Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that the imaginary line described in the schedule to the last-mentioned scheme, now forming the northern boundary of the said district, shall be extended and altered as follows; that is to say, instead of continuing in a straight direction along the middle of Rosemary-street and Waterstreet, as in the said schedule described, such imaginary line shall extend along the middle of such first-mentioned street to a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed), opposite to the middle of Leek-lane, and thence northward along the middle of such lane to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Callowhill-street, and thence eastward along the middle of such last-mentioned street as far as Clarkstreet, and thence continuing as described in the said schedule; and that all that portion of the said parish of Saint Paul situate to the south of such imaginary line shall be henceforth included in and form part of the said district:
- "And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas due notice of the said scheme has been given in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the several registries of the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, at Bristol and Gloucester.
