condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion and in such manner as shall be approved by the like authority:

"And whereas, in addition to the benefaction hereinbefore mentioned, it is the intention of the said Mary Beckett and Elizabeth Beckett to contribute largely towards providing a church or chapel within the said district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and also a house of residence for such minister; and it has been proposed to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that, in consideration of the contributions aforesaid, the patronage of the said district or new parish should be assigned in manner hereinafter mentioned:

"We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that the right of patronage of and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate to the said district or new parish of Meanwood shall be assigned to, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Mary Beckett and Elizabeth Beckett, or their assigns, or by the survivor of them, the said Mary Beckett and Elizabeth Beckett, or the heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns of such survivor, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The district of Meanwood, being-

"All that part of the chapelry of Chapel Allerton, and also all that part of the chapelry of Headingley, in the parish of Leeds, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the north eastern boundary of the township of Headingley cum Burley, in the said parish, where such boundary is crossed

by Bentley beck, and thence extending towards the north east along the middle of such beck, as far as the middle of the bridge carried across the said beck in Stainbeck-lane, and thence towards the north west along the middle of the said lane to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the southern corner of the garden attached to Laurel cottage, the property of Joseph Henry Oates, of Meanwood aforesaid, Esq. and thence towards the north east across the said lane and along the south eastern boundary of the said garden, and of a certain close of land and plantation adjoining thereto (which close of land and plantation were, together with the garden, comprised in one close called the Allotment), and continuing in the same direction along the south eastern boundaries of four other closes of land, called respectively the Allotment, Eight Acres, House Close, and Low Oaks, as far as the eastern angle of such last-mentioned close, and thence towards the north west along the north eastern boundary of the same close and of two other closes, called respectively Herding and House Garth, and also the property of the said Joseph Henry Oates, as far as the middle of a certain public highway called Stonegate, and thence towards the north east along the middle of such public highway to a point (marked c as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of King-lane, otherwise called Allwoodley-road, and thence towards the north west along the middle of such last-mentioned lane or road as far as the northern boundary of the said parish of Leeds, and thence westward and northward along such last-mentioned boundary as far as the middle of the old turnpike road leading from Otley to Leeds, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such turnpike road to a point (marked d as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Spen-lane, and thence southward along the middle of such lastmentioned lane to a point (marked e as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the public highway leading from such lane to the Leeds and Otley turnpike road aforesaid, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such last-mentioned public highway and of the said Leeds and Otley turnpike road to a point (marked f as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the public footpath leading from such turnpike road to Weetwoodlane, and thence towards the east across the said
