HE 22 Instant arrived here from Inbonne Signior Durazzo, who is, to refide at this Court in quality of the Pape's Nuncio in the place of Cardunal Mellini. The Count Maximilian de Prifing, En-yoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Bavaria to Notifie his Electoral Highnesses Marriage with the Archdutches the Emperor's Daughter, had the 25th bis first Audience of the King. The Conde de Huma nez is made President of the Hazienda in the place of Don fluate de Corrat, upon whem the King has conferred the Presidentship of the Chamber of Ca-stille. We have advice from the West Indies that some Ships fitted out by order of the Viceroy of Peru, had taken three Veifels from the Pyrates in the

Crucow, Sept. 26. The Joth Instant the Forces of this Crown decamped from Oucze, and marched to meet those of Liebuaria, and having joyned with them the whole Army marched towards the River Pruth, near which they were encamped on the 20th Instant, the Generals being resolved to advance towards Czukaw to fight the Lham of Tartary, who they had advice was marching with a great, Body of Tartars to put 3000 Wagons laden with Provincins and Ammunition into Caminico. What was faid of the Enemies having about three weeks ago plentifully supplied that place with all thi gs necessary for the subsistance of the Garison, is since contradicted, and we are assured that the Convoy they then put into the place confided only in 30. Wagons, and that without the supply that's farther designed for them, the Turks there will be in a great want this Winter. The King of Poland was the 18th of this month at Pielascowitz in his Journey towards Russia; He had fent orders to several Troops, which have not yet joyned the Army, to hasten their march thither, and it's faid his Maj-fty intends to go and command the Army in Person, and that a great many of the Nobi-lity and other Persons of quality have put themselves in a readiness to attend him; but the weather grows so cold, beyond what it uses to be at this time of the year, accompanied with continual Raines, that its believed the Army will not be able to keep the field much longer, but will be obliged to betake them elves to their Winter-quarters. We have Letters from the Imperial Army in Groatia of the 18th of the 1st month, which was then fill encamped near Turanognits; They tell us that the Givernot of Garelfadt had made a great Incurrion into the Engines Terriories; I hat he had burnt feveral Califes and Villages. and was returned with a great deal of Boo'y; That the Turks h d put frong Garifons into Perthin, Oro-wisza, Valpo, and Effeck, while the la fa of Bosnia. kept the Field with the Forces under his Command to observe the Imperialis; but it was believed the ill weather would very quickly oblige both hid s to go into their Winter-Quarters. The Baron de Merch is before Agria, and has we hear done great execu-tion with his Bombs; In his march thither he possessed himself of Zatmar, and put a Garison into that place. The Emperor has sent the Sicur Majorshe'm to the Elector of Cologne to make a farther Treaty with him concerning his Troops which are now in his Imperial Majestics sourice.

Vienna, Ollob. 7. Last night arrived here an Express from the Imperial Camp, being sent by the Duke of Lorrain to give the Emperor an account that he had received advice from Upper Hungary that Tockar and Onotz had surrendred upon Articles; and that he was expecting to hear that Caschaw had done the like. That the Baron de Mercy having in his march towards Agria sound Zaimar abandoned by the Enemy, he had put a good Garifon into that place; That upon his coming before Agriz he was informed by some Prisoners he took that the Garison as well as the Inhabitants were in a very great diforder and confernation. they little expecting fuch a

visit; That having posted his Troops, and planted his Mortars, the Enemy made a Sally, out quickly retited again; That the Imperbilitis p Elently after beg n to shoot their Bomb, which caused a great Fire in the Town, but the Turks encouraged by their Baffa quenched it, though not till aft r f veral Houses were laid in Ashes. We have Letters from Turanowitz in Crostia of the 29th of the lait month, which tell us that the Serasquier Ibrahim was arrived at Mobatz, where he intended to stay about 15 days to give the necessary Orders about supplying Cantiza with Provisions and Ammunition, that they may be in a condition to sublist in case they should be blocke up this Winter; And that a Letter had been intercepred which a Country Fellow was carrying to Canisza, by which it appeared that the Enemy were drawing what Forces they could together on the fide of Creatia, with a resolution to fight the Imperialiss commanded at present by the Count de Lavergne; who we hear are removed from their Camp at Turanowitz nearer to their Bridge on the Drave, upon the advice their Lieutenant General had received that the Turks had a design to attack it. Prince Walderk and the other general Officers that are here have daily Conferences with the Prefident of the Council of War, and some other of the Emperor's Ministers about the Winter-Quarters, which are not yet finally fetled. The Troops of Lunenburg will return home; But we shall not know how those of Cologne will be disposed of till we have an account of what the Sieur Mayersheim, whom the Emperor has fent to that Elector, has Negotiated with his Electoral Highnels. His Impefial Majelly we are told defires they should Winter in and in confideration of their remaining in his Service a Sum of Money is offered his Electoral Highness. It is said at Court that the Elector of Brandenburg has declared that he will assist the Emperor the next Summer with 20000 Men; And that the Elector of Saxony will likewise assist his Imperial Majesty with a Body of 4000 Men. The Mareschal de Coningsmark has made, we are told, an agreement with the Ambalfador of Venice about his entring into the Service of that Republick, whose Forces he is to Command next to the Captain General. On Thursday last were presented to the Emperor the six Standards taken by Count Herberstein in the late Incurfion he made into the Province of Licea.

Ratubonne, Odob. 11. We continue to receive very good News from Hungary. General Caprara has reduced Tockay, Onotz, and some other Casses to the Emperor's Obedience, but we have not yet any certain advice of the surrender of Casebam. The Imperial Forces before Agria have laid part of the Town in ashes, and though they do not intend formally to beliege the place, yet they hope with their Bombs to oblige the Inhabitants to furrender. The 1 reaty between the Crown of Sneden and this State, which is now ready to expire, will, it's believed be renewed. We have an account by the last Letters from Vienna that Tockay, Onoth, and Serentz were surrendred to the Imperialists, That Caschaw did Capitulate; And that one of Count Teckeley's chief Officers had deserted him, and had put himself with 200 Men into the Emperor's Service. They write from Poland that the Army of that Crown was entred into Moldavia, and was within two hours march of the Enemy, commanded by the Serasquier Solyman.

Brusselles, Oldob. 19. The Letters we received by the last Spanish Ordinary told us that his Excellency Don Francisco Antonio d'Agurto will be continued in this Government. Don Fuan de Leyseca Superintendant of the Military Justice parted from hence this day for Madrid. being called by his Catholick Majesty to his Station in that Court. We gave you an account in one of our last, that one Taylor, who was in the late Rebellion in England, had been seized at Malines; This morning Captain Stanford was sent from hence with part of his Troop to constitut the Prisoner to Oseand, where a Yacht is arrived to tarry him for England.
