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Madrid, Sept. 27.

THE 22 Instant arrived here from *Lubonne* Signior *Durazzo*, who is to reside at this Court in quality of the Pope's Nuncio in the place of Cardinal *Mellini*. The Count *Maximilian de Prising*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of *Bavaria* to Notifie his Electoral Highnesses Marriage with the Archduchess the Emperor's Daughter, had the 25th his first Audience of the King. The Count *de Humez* is made President of the *Hazienda* in the place of Don *Fuax de Corral*, upon whom the King has conferred the Presidentship of the Chamber of *Castilla*. We have advice from the *West Indies* that some Ships fitted out by order of the Viceroy of *Peru*, had taken three Vessels from the Pyrates in the *South-Sea*.

Cracow, Sept. 26. The 30th Instant the Forces of this Crown departed from *Oucze*, and marched to meet those of *Lithuania*, and having joyned with them the whole Army marched towards the River *Pruth*, near which they were encamped on the 30th Instant, the Generals being resolved to advance towards *Czukaw* to fight the Ham of *Tartary*, who they had advice was marching with a great Body of Tartars to put 3000 Wagons laden with Provisions and Ammunition into *Caminice*. What was said of the Enemies having about three weeks ago plentifully supplied that place with all the necessary for the subsistence of the Garrison, is since contradicted, and we are assured that the Convoy they then put into the place consisted only in 30 Wagons, and that without the supply that's farther designed for them, the Turks there will be in a great want this Winter. The King of *Poland* was the 18th of this month at *Pielascowitz* in his Journey towards *Russia*; He had sent orders to several Troops, which have not yet joyned the Army, to hasten their march thither, and it's said his Majesty intends to go and command the Army in Person, and that a great many of the Nobility and other Persons of quality have put themselves in a readiness to attend him; but the weather grows so cold, beyond what it uses to be at this time of the year, accompanied with continual Raines, that its believed the Army will not be able to keep the Field much longer, but will be obliged to betake themselves to their Winter-quarters. We have advice that the Cossacks have defeated a great party of Tartars near *Braclaw*, and that they have taken a Vessel in the *Black Sea*, in which were two Bassas who were going as Ambassadors with a great Sum of Money to the Grim Tartars to encourage them to joyn with the

Ottoman Forces, to make head against the Army of this Crown; That the two Bassas were killed in defending the said Vessel, but that the Money and their Letters of Credence with all their other Papers were taken, and that the latter were sent to the King of *Poland*. The Serasquier *Solzman* accorded upon last advices, had not with him above 12000 Turk, and these were in a great Consternation having heard of the defeat of their Army in the Bay and of the taking of *Nembeski*.

Vienna, Octob. 4. On Sunday 13th there the Elector of *Prince Palatin*. On the 10th the Archduke was christened by the King of *Poland's* Nuncio, being named *Joseph Wenzelau*, *Balthazar*, *Ferdinand*. We have had no Letters from *London* since the account we gave you in our last, that the Town of *Casibaw* had sent Deputies to General *Schultz*. The Duke of *Lorraine* continues encamped near the River *Gran*, to reinforce as there may be occasion the Detachements that have been already sent to *Upper Hungary* and *Agria*. We have Letters from the Imperial Army in *Croatia* of the 28th of the last month, which was then still encamped near *Turanowitz*; They tell us that the Governour of *Sarelsadt* had made a great Incurtion into the Enemies Territories; That he had burnt several Castles and Villages, and was returned with a great deal of Booty; That the Turks had put strong Garisons into *Peribin*, *Orowitza*, *Valpo*, and *Esseck*, while the *Bassa of Bosnia* kept the Field with the Forces under his Command to observe the Imperialists; but it was believed the ill weather would very quickly oblige both sides to go into their Winter-Quarters. The Baron *de Mercy* is before *Agria*, and has we hear done great execution with his Bombs; In his march thither he possessed himself of *Zatmar*, and put a Garrison into that place. The Emperor has sent the *Sieur Mayorshem* to the Elector of *Cologne* to make a farther Treaty with him concerning his Troops which are now in his Imperial Majesties service.

Vienna, Octob. 7. Last night arrived here an Express from the Imperial Camp, being sent by the Duke of *Lorraine* to give the Emperor an account that he had received advice from *Upper Hungary* that *Tockav* and *Onotz* had surrendered upon Articles; and that he was expecting to hear that *Casibaw* had done the like. That the Baron *de Mercy* having in his march towards *Agria* found *Zatmar* abandoned by the Enemy, he had put a good Garrison into that place; That upon his coming before *Agria* he was informed by some Prisoners he took that the Garrison as well as the Inhabitants were in a very great disorder and consternation, they little expecting such a
