

visit; That having posted his Troops, and plasted his Mortars, the Enemy made a Sally, but quickly retired again; That the Imperialists presently after began to shoot their Bombs, which caused a great Fire in the Town, but the Turks encouraged by their Balla quenched it, though not till after several Houses were laid in Ashes. We have Letters from *Turanowitz* in *Croatia* of the 19th of the last month, which tell us that the Serafquier *Ibrahim* was arrived at *Mohatz*, where he intended to stay about 15 days to give the necessary Orders about supplying *Canizza* with Provisions and Ammunition, that they may be in a condition to subsist in case they should be blockt up this Winter; And that a Letter had been intercepted which a Country Fellow was carrying to *Canizza*, by which it appeared that the Enemy were drawing what Forces they could together on the side of *Croatia*, with a resolution to fight the Imperialists commanded at present by the Count de *Lavergne*; who we hear are removed from their Camp at *Turanowitz* nearer to their Bridge on the *Drave*, upon the advice their Lieutenant General had received that the Turks had a design to attack it. Prince *Waldeck* and the other general Officers that are here have daily Conferences with the President of the Council of War, and some other of the Emperor's Ministers about the Winter-Quarters, which are not yet finally settled. The Troops of *Luzenburgh* will return home; But we shall not know how those of *Cologne* will be disposed of till we have an account of what the Sieur *Mayerheim*, whom the Emperor has sent to that Elector, has Negotiated with his Electoral Highness. His Imperial Majesty we are told desires they should Winter in *Hungary*, and in consideration of their remaining in his Service a Sum of Money is offered his Electoral Highness. It is said at Court that the Elector of *Brandenburg* has declared that he will assist the Emperor the next Summer with 20000 Men; And that the Elector of *Saxony* will likewise assist his Imperial Majesty with a Body of 4000 Men. The Marschal de *Coningmark* has made, we are told, an agreement with the Ambassador of *Venice* about his entering into the Service of that Republick, whose Forces he is to Command next to the Captain General. On *Thursday* last were presented to the Emperor the six Standards taken by Count *Herberstein* in the late Incur-sion he made into the Province of *Licca*.

Ratibonoe, *Octob.* 11. We continue to receive very good News from *Hungary*. General *Caprara* has reduced *Tockay*, *Onorb*, and some other Castles to the Emperor's Obedience, but we have not yet any certain advice of the surrender of *Caschau*. The Imperial Forces before *Agria* have laid part of the Town in ashes, and though they do not intend formally to besiege the place, yet they hope with their Bombs to oblige the Inhabitants to surrender. They write from *Croatia* that the Turks had formed a design to attack the Bridge the Imperialists have on the *Drave*, but that they had been disappointed by the Count de *Lavergne's* sending a Detachment to reinforce the Troops that were appointed for the guard of it. The Letters from *Poland* give an account of the Conjunction of the Forces of *Lithuania* with those of *Poland*; That the Army had afterwards passed the *Niester*, and advanced into *Moldavia* with a resolution to fight the Enemy, so that we expect to hear of some considerable action from that side. The States of *Franconia* and *Suabia* are, it's said, unwilling to let their Troops

Winter in *Eurgaty*, which is desired by the Emperor that they may be the readier for the next Campaign: The Sieur *Bestran* is arrived here to reside at the Dyet as second Deputy from the Elector of *Menix*.

Coogne, *Octob.* 12. On *Tuesday* and *Wednesday* last the Sindick *Gulick* was again examined before the Imperial Sub Commissioners, and its probable we shall in few days hear farther of him. The two other Prisoners *Sacks* and *Meckorius* will be likewise examined before the said Commissioners; Who are still expecting farther orders from *Vienna*. The Letters from *Strasbourg* of the 7th Instant tell us, that the Marquis de *Courtenvaux* was arrived there, and that having viewed the Fortifications, and taken a review of the Troops of that place, he would go and visit in like manner *Schiefflar*, *Brisfac*, *Fribourg* and *Hunningen*, and that in his return he would pass through *Zawene*, *Phaltsbourg*, *Nancy*, *Metz* and *Luxembourg*.

Hague, *Octob.* 19. The Sieur de *Moureau de Vertelly*, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Poland*, had the 16th Instant Audience of the States General. The Heer *Goes* is going in the same Quality from this State to the King of *Denmark*, and will in few days begin his Journey. The Treaty between the Crown of *Sweden* and this State, which is now ready to expire, will, it's believed, be renewed. We have an account by the last Letters from *Vienna* that *Tockay*, *Onorb*, and *Serenz* were surrendered to the Imperialists; That *Caschau* did Capitulate; And that one of Count *Teckley's* chief Officers had deserted him, and had put himself with 200 Men into the Emperor's Service. They write from *Poland* that the Army of that Crown was entred into *Moldavia*, and was within two hours march of the Enemy, commanded by the Serafquier *Solyman*.

Brussels, *Octob.* 19. The Letters we received by the last Spanish Ordinary told us that his Excellency Don *Francisco Antonio d'Agurto* will be continued in this Government. Don *Juan de Leyseca* Superintendent of the Military Justice parted from hence this day for *Madrid*, being called by his Catholick Majesty to his Station in that Court. We gave you an account in one of our last, that one *Taylor*, who was in the late Rebellion in *England*, had been seized at *Malines*; This morning Captain *Stanford* was sent from hence with part of his Troop to conduct the Prisoner to *Offend*, where a Yacht is arrived to carry him for *England*.
