The Sieur Caunitz, the Branden-burg Minister, is now at Zall, endeavouring to accommodate the Differences between the Duke of Zell and this City, but we do not know what success he has in his Negotiation.

Hague, Odob, 23. The States of Holland and Well-Friefland are adjourned sill the 15th of the next month. This work arrived here the Baron Bodelswing, being lent by the Elector of Brandenburg, to notify to this State, and the Prince of Orange, the birth of the young Electoral Prince. The Deputies of the States General who went to Schenck Scans to view the work that's now in hand for the cleans, ing the Lower Rbin, and the Mel, are come back and have made their report to the States. The Letters from Germany do not only confirm the News of the furrender of Tackay, Onath, and other places in Upper Hungary, but farther tell us that the Sieur Peterbasi, one of Techeley's chief Confidents, has put himself with 600 Men into the Emperor's Service; And that the Imperiality had faken Count Teckeley's belt Goods, and a great Sum of Money, which he was fending to Polard to secure them.
