The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners VV for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to "piscopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry " into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth "report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical
Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid
before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighteenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King "And whereas by the secondly recited Act it William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for was enacted, that in any case in which it should

T the Court at Windsor, the 22d day of [" carrying into effect the reports of the Commis-" sioners appointed to consider the state of the " Established Church in England and Wales, "with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into "effect, with certain modifications, the fourth " report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical " Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now hundly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, respecting the diocese of Ripon.

- " Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty in Council, bearing date the fifth day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, duly made, registered, and gazetted, under the first recited Act, all that part of the county of York, which then formed part of the archdeaconry of Richmond, was separated from the diocese of Chester, and was included in the diocese of Ripon:
- " And whereas by the said first recited Act it was provided, that the existing deanries and archdeaconries should be newly arranged, so that every parish and extra-parochial place should be within a rural deanty, and every deanry within an archdeaconry, and that no archdeaconry should' extend beyond the limits of one diocese:
- " And whereas by the secondly recited Act it

appear upon the representation of the bishop to be proper to divide any archdeaconry or rural deanry on account of the magnitude thereof or any other peculiar circumstances connected therewith, such archdeaconry or rural deanry might, by the authority in the same Act provided, be divided into two or more portions, and each of such portions might be constituted a separate archdeaconry or rural deanry, as the case might be, and a district might be assigned thereto; provided always, that no such division should be made without the consent of the bishop, under his hand and seal:

"And whereas by the said first recited Act it was also enacted, that it should be competent to us to propose in any scheme prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council, under the provisions thereof, that all parishes, churches, or chapelries locally situate in any diocese, but subject to any peculiar jurisdiction other than the jurisdiction of the bishop of the diocese in which the same were locally situate, should be only subject to the jurisdiction of the bishop of the diocese in which the same were locally situate:

"And whereas a portion of the deanry of Kirkby Lonsdale is within that part of the arch-deaconry of Richmond, which was so as aforesaid separated from the said diocese of Chester and included in the said diocese of Ripon, and it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon that it would be and we deem it to be expedient, that such portion should be constituted a separate deanry, and we further deem it expedient that all peculiar and exempt jurisdictions within the said diocese of Ripon should be abolished:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripers, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that that portion of the deanry of Kirkby Lonsdale, which is included in the diocese of Ripon, shall be constituted a separate deanry, and shall be named the deanry of Clapham, in the archdeaconry of Richmond and diocese of Ripon.

"And we further recommend and propose, that, upon and after the first day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, all parishes and places then locally situate within the limits of the said diocese of Ripon, and of the several archdeaconrics thereof respectively, and all churches and chapels, and the whole clergy and otherit your Majesty's subjects, locally situate within the limits of such parishes and places respectively, shall, notwithstanding any peculiar or other ecclesiastical jurisdiction or exemption from jurisdiction which any of such parishes, places, churches, chapels or clergy may possess or be subject to, or claim to possess or be subject to, be respectively under and subject only to the jurisdiction and authority of the Bishop of Ripon, and of the Archdeacons of the several arch-

deaconries of the said diocese of Ripon, within the limits of which they shall respectively be so locally situate, except the cathedral church of Ripon, which shall remain and be subject to the jurisdiction and visitation to which the same is now by law subject, and to none other; and we further recommend and propose, that, with the like exception, all and each of such parishes, places, churches and chapels, so possessing or being subject or claiming to possess or be subject to any such peculiar jurisdiction or exemption from jurisdiction, and all other parishes, places, churches and chapels, locally situate within the diocese of Ripon, shall severally and respectively be included in, and form part of, the said diocese, and of the archdeaconries thereof respectively within the limits of which they shall respectively be so locally situate.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

CONTRACT FOR WELSH COALS FOR THE PACIFIC.

Department of the Storekeeper General of the Navy, Somerset-Place, January 13, 1848.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that, on Thursday the 27th instant, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering

At Valparaiso, or at any Port in Chili or Peru (as may be directed by the Commander in Chief on the Station, or Senior Naval Officer at Valparaiso), 1500 Tons of Welsh Coals, fit for the service of Her Majesty's Steam Vessels.

The conditions of the contract and a form of the tender may be seen at the said Office.
