

the Imperial Troops, except those which are in Upper Hungary, under the Command of General Caprara, Count Schultz, and the Baron de Mercy, being gone into their Winter-quarters. The Town of Caschau, which would not accept the General Amnestie upon the conditions proposed, has been besieged since the beginning of this month; The Garrison we are told is composed of 4000 Men Commanded by the best Officers Count Tockley has left; They have made several sallies, and seem resolved to defend the place to the last extremity. Peterhafi who came over to General Caprara with 600 Horse, went into the Town under pretence that he would persuade the Inhabitants to embrace the Pardon offered them by the Emperor, leaving all his Baggage, which is valued at above 100 thousand Florins; as a Pledge of his Fidelity in the Imperial Camp; but there is not since any news of him. It is certain that General Schultz has taken Tokay by Composition, and thereby opened the passage of the River Tysza. That some Troops sent out by the Baron de Wallis Governor of Zatzmar, have made themselves Masters of the Fortress of Calvos and the Castle of Isbran, as likewise of little Waradin situate between Tokay and Zatzmar. And that a party of Croas Commanded by Captain Muther have surprized the Castles of Szbel and Baldok. General Mercy having destroyed the Country about Agris, and possessed himself of several Posts in the Neighborhood of that place, is marched towards Zolnock. The Duke of Lorraine will go from hence the next week for Inspruck, where he will pass the Winter. The Emperor upon the repeated Proposals made by the Serisquier Ibrahim and the Visier of Buda in order to the signing on foot a Treaty of Peace, has directed this Answer to be returned, *That he will not grant any Passport or enter into any Conference of Peace without the concurrence of his Allies the King of Poland, and the Republick of Venice.*

Colagne, Octob. 27. The Express which the Imperial Sub-Commissioners sent to give the Emperor for an account of their Proceedings against several persons who are accused of being the Authors of the late disturbances here, and particularly against Gulick, Sabs, and Metchowias, the Chief of them, is returned with his Imperial Majesties directions thereupon; And it's believed Sentence will now in few days be pronounced against the said three persons; In the mean time an Imperial Mandate has been published and affixed in several places of this City, by which all persons are forbid on pain of death, to oppose the course of Justice against these disturbers of the publick Peace, upon any pretext whatsoever; And we are told that some Troops of the Circle of Westphalia, are ordered to come hither, to prevent any disorder of the Rabble at the time of their Execution. They write from Dresden, that the Elector of Saxony has given out Commissions for the Raising three new Regiments of Horse, and as many of Foot; And that his Electoral Highness has promised to assist the Emperor the next Summer with 4000 Men at his own charge, and offered further to go himself for Hungary, at the head of 12000 Men, one half of them to be maintained by the Emperor, and the other half by himself.

Brussels, Novemb. 2. We have an account that the Most Christian King has given Orders for the Sequestering the Rents of the Estates which the Subjects of Spain have within the Breach Con-

quests; by way of Reprizal for a French Ship which being bound from Cadix for Dunkirk with a considerable sum of money for the account of the Merchants of Lille, Tournay, &c. was lately seized at the Groyne by order of the Viceroy of Galicia. The Letters from Vienna of the 21st. past inform us, that the Emperor had sent the Count de Berka, to the Princes of Italy to sollicite subsidies for the carrying on the War against the Turks: That Caschau was besieged, the Trenches opened, and several Batteries raised against the Town; but that General Caprara had not yet suffered the Bombs to play, hoping the Burghers, who are very numerous, would oblige the Garrison to surrender rather than to see the Town destroyed: And that the Baron de Mercy, and Colonel Heusler, had taken and put Garisons into all the Castles about Agris for the security of their Winter-quarters, which they are to have on that side.

London, Octob. 29. This day Sir Robert Jeffreys Lord Mayor of this City for the year ensuing, was Sworn before the Barons of the Exchequer at Westminster, whither he went by Water, accompanied by the late Lord Mayor, the Recorder, Aldermen, and Sheriffs, and attended by the several Companies in their respective Barges in the usual manner, His Majesty doing them the Honor to be upon the Leads at Whitehall, when they passed by. My Lord Mayor being come back from Westminster, was received at his Landing at Black-Friers by the Artillery Company, and from thence passed with the accustomed Solemnity to Grocers Hall, where a very Splendid Dinner was provided, at which were the Lords of His Majesties most Honorable Privy Council, with many others of the Nobility, the Judges, and other Persons of Quality.

Whitehall Octob. 30. The Right Honorable the Earl of Plymouth, was this day Sworn of His Majesties most Honorable Privy Council, and accordingly took his place at the Board.

London, Octob. 30. This day Richard Nelthorpe and John Ayloff were Executed, the first before Grays-Inn, and the latter before the Temple Gate.
