or plan hereunto annexed) on the boundary between such parishes, and in the middle of the road from Street-an-nowan to Trereif, and thence extending towards the north west along the middle of such road to the middle of the high road from the Land's End to Penzance, and thence towards the north east along the middle of such lastmentioned road to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Love-lane, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such lane as far as the Lariggan river, and thence southward following the course of such river as far as the south eastern boundary of the said parish of Madron, and thence towards the south west along such boundary to the eastern boundary of the said parish of Saint Paul otherwise Paul, and thence southward along such last-mentioned boundary to a point (marked c as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain lane leading from the road from Mousehole to Newlyn to the orchards and garden ground of Pembroke-lodge, the property of Philip Marrack, Esquire, of Penzance, Banker, and thence westward along the middle of such lane to the western end thereof, and thence towards the north west in a straight direction twelve chains or thereabouts to a point (marked d as aforesaid) in the middle of Gwavaslane and opposite to the middle of another lane or road commonly called Treworvenneth-walk, leading to the estate and house called Treworvenneth, the property of Seymour Tremenheere, Esquire, and thence northward along the middle of Gwavaslane aforesaid, and westward along the middle of Church-lane and Adit-lane, across the road to Penzance, and along the middle of Treworvenneth Vean-lane to a certain hedge or fence (marked e as aforesaid) extending direct from Treworvenneth, Vean-town-place to the village of Tredavoe, and separating the fields (south west of such hedge or fence) numbered and called in the tithe apportionment book and map 396 Harvey's Meadow, 397 Croft Meadow, 398 Lower Park Grouse, and 399 Upper Park Grouse, all belonging to the Reverend Thomas Leah, from the fields on the north east of the said hedge or fence, numbered and called on the said map 246 Barnfield, 247 Park Venton and End (now in one), 248 Dewlale, and thence towards the north west in the same direction as the said hedge or fence to the road leading from the village of Tredavoe aforesaid, and thence first westward along the southern

boundary of such village, and northward and eastward along the western and northern boundary thereof, to the middle of Saint Golders-lane, and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned lane and of Smelting-house-lane to the middle of the said road from Street-an-nowan to Trereif, and thence westward along the middle of such last-mentioned road to the point where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such incumbents and patrons have respectively consented to the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Exeter.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to alter and amend the law re-"lating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the ninth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty seven, in the words following, that is to say:
