TOTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness Prince Albert will, by the desire of Her Majesty, hold a Levee, at St. James's-Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Wednesday the 22d March instant, at two o'clock.

It is Her Majesty's pleasure, that presentations to His Royal Highness at these Levees shall be considered equivalent to presentations to the Queen.

Addresses to the Queen may either be forwarded to Her Majesty, through the Secretary of State for the Home Department, or may be reserved until Her Majesty shall hold a Levee.

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE LEVEES, AT St. JAMES'S-PALACE.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who purpose to attend the Levees, at St. James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, before twelve o'clock on the Monday previous to each Levee, in order that they may be submitted for approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall be made at the Levees, but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half past one o'clock.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the law respecting

"the office of county coroner," it is enacted, that when and so often as it shall seem expedient to the justices of any county in England, that their county should be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of that Act, it shall be lawful for them, in general or quarter sessions assembled, to resolve that a petition be presented to Her Majesty, praying that such division be made; and that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, if she shall think fit, with the advice of Her Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such petition, and any petition which may be presented to Her by any coroner of the same county concerning the proposed division, or whenever it shall seem fit to Her Majesty to direct the issue of a writ de coronatore eligendo, for the purpose of authorizing the election of an additional coroner above the number theretofore customarily elected, to order that such county be divided into such and so many districts, for the purposes of the said Act, as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and to determine at what place within each district the court for the election of coroner shall be holden; and whereas a petition of the justices of the peace of the county of Denbigh, in quarter sessions assembled, stating that only one coroner hath hitherto been appointed for that county, that the county is in length about sixty miles, and contains many mountainous districts, and praying that Her Majesty would be pleased to direct the issue of a writ de coronatore eligendo, for the purpose of authorizing the election of two coroners for the said county, and to order that the said county be divided for the purposes of the said Act into two districts; that one of such districts should comprise the parishes and places within the hundreds of Bromfield, Chirk, and Yale, in the said county, and be named the Wrexham District; and that the other should comprise the parishes and places within the hundreds of Isaled, Isdulas, and Ruthin, in the said county, and be named the Denbigh District; also to determine that the court for the election of coroner for the said Wrexham District should be holden within that district, at the town of Wrexham; and for the said Denbigh District, within that district, at the town of Denbigh; and whereas the said petition, certified under the hands and seals of two of the justices present when such petition was agreed to, hath been presented to Her Majesty:

Now, therefore, it appearing that the requirements of the said Act have been duly complied with, and Her Majesty having taken the said petition into consideration, doth, pursuant to the said Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, order and direct, that the said county of Denbigh shall be divided, for the purposes of the said Act, into two districts, as prayed by the said petition; that the district comprising the parishes and places within the said hundreds of Bromfield, Chirk, and Yale, shall be named the Wrexham District; and that the district comprising the parishes and places within the hundreds of Isaled, Isdulas, and Ruthin, shall be named the Denbigh District: and it is hereby ordered and determined. that the court for the election of coroner for the said Wrexham District shall be holden at the said town of Wrexham; and for the said Denbigh District at the said town of Denbigh: and it is hereby further ordered, that this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with " certain modifications, the fourth report of the " Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and " Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to alter and amend the law relating " to ecclesiastical houses of residence," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the third day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain "modifications, the fourth report of the Com"missioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Re"venues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled
"An Act to alter and amend the law "relating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for improving the precincts of the cathedral church of Gloucester.

"Whereas it is by the first recited Act, amongst other things, enacted, that by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any sum of money which shall have been invested in the public funds, or in other security or securities, in trust for any ecclesiastical body corporate, aggregate or sole, may, upon an application in writing to us, under the hand and seal of such body corporate, and, in the case of any chapter, with the consent of the visitor thereof, be directed to be sold, and the same shall be sold accordingly, and the produce of such sale shall be applied to such purpose and in such manner as shall appear most conducive to the permanent benefit of such body corporate:

"And whereas it is by the secondly recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful for the dean and chapter of any cathedral church, under the like authority, to purchase any house or site, being contiguous or near to such cathedral church, or any part of such house or site, and to add to, alter or improve any such house or to take down the same, and to build another house or more houses than one upon the site thereof, or to apply the site of any such house, or any part thereof, by and with the like authority, to the improvement of the cathedral or the precincts thereof:

"And whereas it is by the same Act declared and enacted, that the provisions of the first hereinbefore recited Act, relating to the sale and application of any sum of money invested in trust for any ecclesiastical body corporate, do and shall include and apply to all mones and securities for money, and to all stock in the government funds or elsewhere standing in the name of the Ac-

countant General of the Court of Chancery for or to the credit or for the benefit of or in trust for any dean and chapter, dean or cannon, whether for the purpose of being laid out in land or otherwise; and that the same provisions shall extend and may be applied to any of the purposes of the now reciting Act:

"And whereas there is now standing in the name of the Accountant General of the Court of Chancery, and to the credit of the said Dean and Chapter of Gloucester, in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, a sum of two thousand and fifty-seven pounds, twelve shillings and five pence, Three Pounds per Centum Conlidated Bank Annuities:

"And whereas by a certain indenture of lease, bearing date the twenty eighth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, and made between the Dean and Chapter of the said cathed al church of Gloucester, of the one part, and Henry Hooper Wilton, of the city of Gloucester, Esq. of the other part, the messuages or dwelling-houses, garden, and premises, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, were demised to the said Henry Hooper Wilton for the term of forty years from the Feast of Saint Michael the Archangel next before the making thereof, and the residue of such term is now vested in the said Henry Hooper Wilton:

"And whereas the said Dean and Chapter are entitled to the fee simple and inheritance in the same premises, subject to the said lease:

"And whereas the said messuages or dwelling-houses, garden and premises are immediately adjoining to the eastern end of the said cathedral church of Gloucester, and are situate within the precincts of the same, and it has been made to appear to us that it would be for the permanent benefit of the said Dean and Chapter, and to the improvement of the said cathedral church and precincts, if the said Dean and Chapter were enabled forthwith to purchase all the estate of the present lessee therein;

"And whereas an application has been made to us in writing, under the seal of the said Dean and Chapter, for the investment of an adequate portion of the said Consolidated Bank Annuities, in such purchase:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Henry Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, as the Visitor of the said cathedral church of Gloucester, testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme, that so much of the said sum of two thousand and fifty-seven pounds, twelve five pence, Three Pounds per shillings and Centum Consolidated Bank Annuities, as shall be required by the said Dean and Chapter for the purpose aforesaid, may and shall be sold, and that the proceeds of the sale thereof shall be applied to and invested in the purchase by the said Dean and Chapter of all that the said outstanding term so granted as aforesaid in the messuages or dwelling-houses, garden and premises particularly described in the said schedule hereunto annexed, and that the said Dean and Chapter shall and may so deal with and appropriate the same, and each and every part thereof, as shall in their judgment be most conducive to the improvement of their cathedral and the precincts thereof, in conformity with the provisions of the said secondly recited Act.

. "And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" A messuage or dwelling house, with the outbuildings, garden, stable, coach-house and appurtenances thereto belonging, late in the occupation of Henry Hooper Wilton; and another messuage or building adjoining thereto, and situate in a lane called Grace-lane, otherwise Saint John's-lane, and lately occupied by the said Henry Hooper Wilton and his partner as law offices. All which said premises are situate within the precincts of the cathedral church of Gloucester, and are bounded on the south west by lands late in the occupation of John Gough; on the south, in part by the said lane called Grace-lanc, and by lands of the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester, in the occupation of William King, or his under tenants; on the north east, by a brook called Full-brook; on the west, by a piece of ground of the said Dean and Chapter, called the Common-orchard or grove, part of the said cathedral church, and by a garden in the occupation of Paris Dick, Doctor of Medicine."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the two several registries of the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, at Bristol and Gloucester.

WHEREAS a Treaty has been concluded between Her Majesty and His Royal Highness the Grand Duke of Oldenburg, whereby due protection has been secured within the said duchy for the authors of books, dramatic works, or musical compositions, and the inventors, designers, or engravers of prints and articles of sculpture, and the authors, inventors, designers, or engravers of any other works whatsoever of literature and the fine arts, in which the laws of Great Britain and of Oldenburg do now or may hereafter give their respective subjects the privilege of copyright, and for the lawful representatives or assigns of such authors, inventors, designers, or engravers, with regard to any such works first published within the dominions of Her Majesty:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her reign, intituled "An Act to amend the law relating to international "copyright," doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the day of the date hereof, the authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers of any of the following works (that is to say), books, prints, articles of sculpture, dramatic works, musical compositions, and any other works of literature and the fine arts, in which the laws of Great Britain give to British subjects the

privilege of copyright, and the executors, administrators, and assigns of such authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers, respectively, shall, as respects works first published within the said grand duchy, after the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, have the privilege of copyright therein for a period equal to the term of copyright which authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers of the like works, respectively, first published in the United Kingdom are by law entitled to, provided such books, dramatic pieces, musical compositions, prints, articles of sculpture, or other works of art have been registered, and copies thereof have been delivered according to the requirements of the said recited Act, within twelve months after the first publication thereof,

in any part of the said duchy:

And it is hereby further ordered, that the authors of dramatic pieces and musical compositions which shall, after the said first day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, have been or be first publicly represented or performed within the said duchy, shall have the sole liberty of representing or performing in any part of the British dominions, such dramatic pieces or musical compositions, during a period equal to the period during which authors of dramatic pieces and musical compositions first publicly represented or performed in the United Kingdom are entitled by law to the sole liberty of representing or performing the same; provided such dramatic pieces or musical compositions have been registered, and copies thereof have been delivered according to the requirements of the said recited Act, within twelve calendar months after the time of their being first represented or performed in any part of the

for Her Majesty, if she think fit, from time to time, by an Order in Council, to declare that, from and after a day to be named in such Order, in lieu of the duties of Customs from time to time payable on the importation into the United Kingdom of books, prints, and drawings, there shall be payable only such duties of Customs as

are mentioned in the said Act:
And whereas Her Majesty hath this day, by virtue of the authority vested in Her for that purpose, declared that the authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers of books, prints, and certain other works of art, first published within the grand duchy of Oldenburg, shall have

the privilege of copyright therein:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the day of the date of this Order, in lieu of the duties of Customs now payable upon books, prints. and drawings, published at any place within the said duchy, there shall be payable only the duties of Customs following (that is to say):

On books originally produced in the United Kingdom, and republished at any place within the said duchy, a duty of two pounds ten shillings per hundred weight.

On books published or republished at any place within the said duchy, and not being books originally produced in the United Kingdom, a duty of fifteen shillings per hundred weight.

On prints and drawings, plain or coloured, published at any place within the said duchy,

Single, each, -Bound or sewn, the dozen, $\int \frac{1}{2}d$.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.
