The Kings most Excellent Majesty. And the Lords of His Majestics most Honorable Privy Council.

OR the preventing Tumultuous Disorders, which may happen bereafter upon pretence of Assembling, to make Bonfires, and kire-Works, and Disappointing the Evil Designs of Persons Disasseted to the Go vernment, who commonly make use of such occasions, to turn those Meetings into Riots and Tumusts: It is this Day Ordered by bis Majelty in Council, That no Perfon or Persons what soever, do presume to make or encourage the making any Bonfires, or other Publick Fire-Works, at or upon any Festival Day, or at any other time or times what sever, without particular Permission, Leave or Order, sirit had from his Majesty, or this Board, or signified to them by the Right Lionoura-ble the Lord Mayor of London, or by the Fustices of the Peace in their respective Limits, upon Pain of His Majerties Displeasure, and being Prosecuted with the utmost Severity of the Law; Whereof all Persons whom it may concern, are to take notice at their Perils.

Venice, Odob. 27. By a Vessel which arrived here four or five-days ago from Cephalonia, we were informed that the Inhabitants of Porto Vitulo had obliged the Turks in Garison there to send the Kyys of the Town to Captain G. neral Morofini, That those of Chielifa had done the like; and that it was believed several other places would follow their Example; which is not only confirmed by a Barque come from Zant, but we have by her farther advice, that the Forces of the Republick have likewise taken Passava, and Portoquaglia, and that the Turkith Garisons had been conducted to Napoli de Malvassa; That Signior Lorenzo Venier, was made Proveditore Extraordinary of Porto Vitulo, in which place the Ve retians found 60 pieces of Cannon, and a very considerable quantity of Ammunition; and that the Captain General, after having put good Garifonsinto these places, was gone with the whole Army towards Navarino. A Merchant Ship is arrived here from Alexandriz, from whence she came the 21st of the last month, the Master whereof reports, that fix days b fore his departure there Sailed out of that Port el ven Ships of Barbary, to convoy two other Vessels laden with Powder for Constantinople; That a great Turkish Ship, carrying above 60 Cuns, was not long before cast away, off of Senecapi, not one Man of those that were in her being saved. And that the Tripolins having taken a Ship belonging to Ragusa, bound hither from Alexandria, and carryed her to Rhodes, the Bassa would not suffer them to sell, or otherwile dispose either of the Ship or her lading, saying, They ought not to molest the Ships of Ragusa. This week arrived here 1000 Suiffers, part of the

made with the Senate, for the service of this Republick. The Convoy which we told you was preparing here, will fail on Saturday next, composed of 10 great Ships, which will carry to the Fleet 1500 Soldiers, a considerable sum of Mony, and a great quantity of Ammunition and Provisions of all forts.

Vienna, Octob. 28. Several Troops have within these sew days passed by this place, going to their Winter-quarters, among which, were those of Suabia, who are returning to take theirs in the Empire; The Sieur Cleinwachter the Emperors Principal Ingenier, is gone to the Siege of Caschaw, where his presence is the more necessary, for that the two Chief Ingeniers, who directed the attacks, are both become unferviceable for the present, the one being wounded, and the other fallen sick. The one being wounded, and the other fallen fick. Bissingers according to the last advices we have from the Camp, were railing two Batteries on the edge of the Ditch, and were making some works for the security of their Trenches; The Prince of Wirtemberg, who Commanded one of the Attacks, was killed the 18th instant, with a Cannon Bullet, as he was viewing a work he had ordered to be cast up. General Schultz has we doubt not by this time received the Emperors Orders, and is in pursuance of them marching to joyn the Imperial Camp before Caschaw. The Baion de Mercy was according to the last news we had of him, marching towards Zolnock; The Troops he has with him will take their Winter-quarters on that file, having for their security possessed themselves of several Caliles and other advantageous Posts, as well about Agria as Zolnock. The Ottoman Forces in Croatia being gone into their Winter-quarters, The Imperialits Commanded by General Leslie, are about doing the like. The Turks are making feveral new Fortifications for the defence of the Town and Caltle of Effeck, and are Fortifying some other Polls to secure the Bridge of Effeck. The Serasquier Ibrahim is it's said gone to Adri-anople, where as well as at Belgrade, Buda and other Turkish places, we are assured Provisions are very scarce, and the Janisaries very mutinous. Count de Herberstein, Governor of Carelstadt, is coming hither to take his leave of the Emperor, being made General of the Gallies of Malta. Duke of Lorrain will part from hence in two or three days for Infpruck. The Letters from Zolkiew which is within three miles of Leopol, of the 10th instant, tell us that the King of Po'and was arrived there, having left the Queen and the young Princes his Children at Wiesockay, and that the Castelan of Cracow had drawn 3000 Men together, and was marching with them to joyn the Army of the Crown.

Vienna, Novemb. 1. This day about Noon arrived here the Prince de Piccolomini, being fent by General Caprara, to give the Emperor an account, that Caschaw the Capital City of Upper Hurgary, which was provided with all things necesfary for a long defence, surrendred the 25th of the last month upon Articles; And that the whole Garison, consisting of 4000 men, as well Officers 4000 which are raising according to an agreement I as Soldiers, had voluntarily put themselves into

the Emperors service. And that Count Teckeley, having in the desperate condition he was reduced to, r tired to Great Waradin, to follicite the Assidance of the Turks, The Bassa of that Place had on the 15th p ft, made him a Pritoner, and had fent him with Irons on his Hands and Feet to Adrianople. And to this great news, is added that of the taking of Zolnock by the Baron de Mercy, (which we have likewise by an Express) the Turkish Garison having upon his approach, abandoned the place, and retiring to Agria; And of Leutsch by Colonel Heusler. The same Express brings the Confirmation of the Imperialids being Polleffed of Little Waradin, Ca o. Ibrahy, St. Nicolas, Onosh, Debrecin, Tockay and Potocke, to that they are now Masters of all Upper Hungrary, except Agria, and one or two places more, which are full in the hands of the Turks and the Rebelis.

Hambourg, Octob 29. The King of Denmark arrived the 26th of this month at Itzar, about feven German miles from hence; The 27th his Majesty went from thence to Gluck stadt, intending to return this day to Itear. The Migillrates of this City have feet thicher two of their Body to Compliment his Majesty, and to make him the usual present of Wine; From thence his Majesty will go to Gottorp, and after a few days stay there, will return to Copenbagen. The Sieur de Guldenftolp, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sueden to the States General of the United Provinces, is arrived here, and will in a day or two continue his Journy for Holland. The last Letters from Poland give an account that the Scrafquier Soliman and the Cham of Tartary were joyned together, that their Chief aim seemed to be to supply Caminies with Provisions and Ammunition; And that the Polish Army was within a days march of them.

Hamburg, Nov. 6. We had Letters by the last Post from Po'and, which told us, that the Turks and Tartars b ing joined together, and making an Army of 60000 men, had endeavoured several t mes to enclose and fall upon the Poles, who, with the Forc's of Lithuania, were not above 25000 strong; That from the first to the tenth of the last month the two Armics had been every day in Action; That they came at last to a general Battle; and that after a very oblimate and bloody Fight, the Poles obtained an absolute Victory, entirely defeating the Enemy, and taking their Cannon and Baggage, and all the Provisions designed for Caminiec. Of which we hope our next Letters will bring

us the co. firmation with the further particulars.

Cologn Nov. 6. The Emperor having fent a Cology Nov. 6. The Emperor having fent a Mundation of the Magistrates of this City, by which they affer required on pain of the Imperial Ban, to deliver Gulick, Sacks, and Mechovius, into the hands of his Commissioners here, They resolved, after some difficulty, to comply with it, and accordingly the 4th Inflant very carly in the morning the said three persons were put into a Boat, and carried under a Guard of 30 Soldiers belonging to the Duke of Newbourg, to Duseldorp, where they will be k-pr, under close imprisonment, till this place be cleared of those Mutiacers, that continue to disturb the publick Peace, when it is faid they will be brought back to be punished according to their demerit. They write from Alface that the new Fortifications at Fribourg, Brifac Schlesfadt and Colmar, are quite finithed, and that the French continue to work with great diligence on those of Strasbourgh and Hunnirghen.

Bruffels, Novemb. 3. The inthinitang arrived here the Prince de Sieinbeuse, who served the last Campagne in Hungary, coming Post from Vienna, the good News that Castbaw was furrendred to the Imperialiss the 25th past; That Teckeley, who fled to Great Waradin, was

made a Prisoner by the Bassa of that place, and fent bound in Irons to the Grand Signior; And that General Mercy and Colonel Heufler had taken Zolnocke and Lewisch, both which places were abandoned, the first by the Turks, and the other by the Hungarians, that were in them.

Hague, Nov. 13. The Si ur Campricke, the Imperial Minister, hath communicated to the States General the late happy Successes of the Imperial Arms in Upper Hungary, in the taking of Cajchaw, Zolnock, Leutsch, and several other places; and that the Bills of Great Waradin having got Teckeley into his hands, had fent him Prisoner to Adrianople,

Paru, Novemb. 10. The King has had a fit of the Gout, which took him in the Foot and the Hand, but the pain thereof has at present left him. The Princess de Contis pretty well recovered, but the Prince de Conti her Husband dyed. last night of the Small-Pox. The fifth of this month dyed Messire Jean de Montpesor de Carbon, Arch-Bithop of Sens, in the 79th year of his agr. The rithop of Soiffens is likewife dead.

Paris, Novemb. 14.
