The Kings most Excellent Majesty. And the Lords of His Majellics most Honorable Privy Council.

OR the preventing Tumultuous Diforders, which may happen bereafier upon pretence of Affembling, to make Bonfires, and Fire-Works, and Difappointing the Evil Defigns of Persons Disaffested to the Go vernment, who commonly make use of such occasions, to turn those Meetings into Riots and Tumults : It is this Day Ordered by b.s Majelly in Council, That no Perfon or Perfons what forever, do prefume to make or encourage the making any Bonfires, or other Publick Fire-Works, at or upon any Festival Day, or at any other time or times what loever, without particular Permiffion, Leave or Order, first had from his Majefty, or this Board, or fignified to them by the Right Honoura-ble the Lord Mayor of London, or by the Fusices of the Pease in their respective Limits, upon Pain of His Majedies Difpleafure, and being Profecuted with the utmult Severity of the Law ; Whereof all Perfons whom it may concern, are to take notice at their Perils.

Venice, Odob. 27. By a Veffel which arrived here four or five days ago from Cephalonia, we were informed that the Inhabitants of Porto Vitulo had obliged the Turks in Garifon there to fend the Kyss of the Town to Captain G. neral Morofini; That mole of Chielifa had done the like; and that it was believed feveral other places would follow their Example; which is not only confirmed by a Barque come from Zant, but we have by her farther advice, that the Forces of the Republick have likewile taken Pafava, and Portoquaglia, and that the Turkith Garifons had been conducted to Napoli de Malvafia; That Signior Lorenzo Venier, was made Provedicore Extraordinary of Porto Vitulo, in which place the Vesetians found 60 pieces of Cannon, and a very confiderable quantity of Ammunition ; and that the Captain General, after having put good Garifonsinto these places, was gone with the whole Army towards Navarino. A Merchant Ship is arrived here from Alexandriz, from whence she came the 21ft of the laft month, the Mafter whereof reports, that fix days b fore his departure there Sailed out of that Port el ven Ships of Barbary, to convoy two other Veffels laden with Powder for Constantinople; That a great Turkish Ship, tarrying above 60 Cuns, was not long before cast away, off of Sellecapi, not one Man of those that were in her being faved. And that the Tripolins having taken a Ship belonging to Ragufa, bound hither from Alexandria, and carryed her to Rhodes, the Balla would not fuffer them to fell, or otherwile difpole either of the Ship or her lading, faying, They ought not to moleft the Ships of Ragula. This week arrived here 1000 Suiffers, part of the 4000 which are raising according to an agreement as Soldiers, had voluntarily put themselves into

mide with the Senate, for the fervice of this Republick. The Convoy which we told you was preparing here, will fail on Saturday next, composed of 10 great Ships, which will carry to the Fleet 1500 Soldiers, a confiderable sum of Mony, and a great quantity of Ammunition and Provisions of all forts.

Vienna, Octob. 28. Several Troops have within these few days passed by this place, going to their Winter-quarters, among which, were those of Suabia, who are returning to take theirs in the Empire ; The Sicur Cleinwachter the Emperors Principal Ingenier, is gone to the Siege of Calchaw, where his prefence is the more neceffary, for that the two Chief Ingeniers, who directed the attacks, are both become unferviceable for the prefent, the one being wounded, and the other fallen fick. Bifiegers according to the laft advices we have from the Camp, were railing two Batteries on the edge of the Ditch, and were making fome works for the fecurity of their Trenches; The Prince of Wirtemberg, who Commanded one of the Attacks, was killed the 18th infant, with a Cannon Bullet, as he was viewing a work he had ordered to be call up. General Schultz has we doubt not by this time received the Emperors Orders, and is in pursuance of them marching to joyn the Imperial Camp before Caschaw. The Baion de Mercy was according to the last news we had of him, marching towards Zolnock; The Troops he has with him will take their Winter-quarters on that file, having for their fecurity poffelled themfelves of feveral Caliles and other advantageous Posts, as well about Agria as Zolnock. The Ottoman Forces in Croatia being gone into their Winter-quarters, The Imperialitis Commanded by General Leflie, are about doing the like. The Turks are making feveral new Fortifications for the defence of the Town and Callle of Effeck, and are Fortifying fome other Polls to fecure the Bridge of Effeck. The Serasquier Ibrahim is it's faid gore to Adri-anople, where as well as at Belgrade, Buda and other Turkish places, we are assured Provisions are very fcarce, and the Janifaries very mutinous. The Count de Herberstein, Governor of Carelstadt, is coming hither to take his leave of the Emperor, being made General of the Gallies of Malta. The Duke of Lorrain will part from hence in two or three days for Infpruck. The Letters from Zolkiew which is within three miles of Leopol, of the 10th instant, tell us that the King of Po'and was arrived there, having left the Queen and the young Princes his Children at Wiefockay, and that the Caftelan of Cracow had drawn 3000 Men together, and was marching with them to joyn the Army of the Crown.

Vienna, Novemb. 1. This day about Noon arrived here the Prince de Piccolomini , being fent by General Caprara, to give the Emperor an account, that Cafebaw the Capital City of Upper Hurgary, which was provided with all things necesfary for a long defence, furrendred the 25th of the laftmonth upon Articles; And that the whole Garifon, confifting of 4000 men, as well Officers
