the Emperors fervice. And that Coult Teckeley, having in the delperate condition he was reduced to, r tired to Great Waradin, to follicite the Affi dance of the Turks, The Baffa of that Place had on the 15th p ft, made him a Pritoner, and had fent him with Irons on his Hands and Feet to Adrianople. And to this great news, is added that of the taking of Zolnock by the Baron de Mercy, (which we have likewife by an Express) the Turkifh Garifon having upon his approach, abandoned the place, and retiring to Agria; And of Leutsch by Colonel Heusser. The same Express brings the Confirmation of the Imperialids being Polleffed of Little Waradin, Ca'o, Ibraby, St. Nicolas, Onoth, Debrecin, Tockay and Potocke, is that they are now Masters of all Upper Hungrary, except Agria, and one or two places more, which are ftill in the hands of the Turks and the Rebells.

Hambourg, Oflob 29. The King of Denmark arrived the 26th of this month at Iszar, about feven German miles from hence; The 27th his Majefly went from thence to Gluck fladt, intending to return this day to ligar. The Migilirates of this City have feat thicker two of their Body to Compliment his Majefty, and to make him the ufual prefent of Wine; From thence his Majefty will go to Gottorp, and after a few days flay there, will return to Copenbagen. The Sieur de Guldenstolp, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sueden to the States General of the United Provinces, is anrived here, and will in a day or two continue his Journy for Hollant. The laft Letters from Poland give an account that the Seralquier Soliman and the Cham of Tartary were joyned together, that their Chief aim feemed to be to fupply Caminiec with Provisions and Ammunition; And that the Polish Army was within a days march of them.

Hamburg, Nov. 6. We had Letters by the laft Post from Po'and, which told us, that the Turks and Tertars b ing joined together, and making an Army of 60cos men, had er deavoured feveral t mes to enclose and fall upon the Poles, who, with the Forc's of Lithuania, were not above 25000 ftrong; That from the first to the tenth of the last month the two Armies had been every day in Action; That they came at laft to a general Battle; and that after a very oblinate and bloody Fight, the Poles obtained an abfolute Victory, entir-ly defeating the Enemy, and taking their Cannon and Baggage, and all the Provisions designed for Caminiec. Of which we hope our next Letters will bring

us the co. fit mation with the further particulars. Cology Nov. 6. The Emperor having fent a Cologn Nov. 6. The Emperor having fent a Munication of the Magistrates of this City, by which they sette required on pain of the Imperial Ban, to deliver Gulick, Sacks, and Mechovius, into the hands of his Committioners here, They refolved, after fome difficulty, to comply with it, and accordingly the 4th Inflant very carly in the morning the faid three perions were put into a Boar, and carried under a Guard of 30 Soldiers belonging to the Duke of Newbourg, to Duseldorp, where they will be k-pr, under close imprifonment, till this place be cleared of those Mutiaeers, that continue to diffurb the publick Peace, when it is faid they will be brought back to be punished according to their demerit. They write from Alface that the new Fortifications at Fribourg, Brifac Schieftadt and Colmar, are quite finithed, and that the French continue to work with great diligence on those of Strasbourgh and Hunnirghen.

Bruffels, Novemb. 3. The 1sth inftang arrived here the Prince de Steinbeufe, who ferves the laft Campagne in Hungary, coming Polt from Vienna, the good News with that Cafeban was furrendred to the Imperialis the 25th past; That Teckeley, who fled to Great Waradin, was

made a Prifoner by the Baffa or that place, and font bound in Irons to the Grand Siguior; And that General Mercy and Colonel Heufler had taken Zolnocke and Leuisch, both which places were abandoned, the first by the Turks, and the other by the Hungarians, that were in them.

Hague, Nov. 13. The Silur Campricke, the Imperial Minifler, hath communicated to the states General the late happy Succeffes of the Imperial Arms in Upper Hungary, in the taking of Cajchaw, Zolnock, Leutsch, and several other places; and that the Bills of Great Waradin having got Teckeley into his hands, had fent him Prifoner to Adrianople,

Paru, Novemb. 10. The Kirg has had a fit of the Gout, which took him in the Foot and the Hand, but the pain thereof has at present left him. The Princels de Conit is pretty well recovered, but the Prince de Conti her Husband dyed. laft night of the Small-Pox. The fifth of this month dyed Messire Jean de Montpesor de Carbon, Arch-Bilhop of Sens, in the 79th year of his agr. the rithop of Soiffons is likewile dead.

Paris, Novemb. 14. The Ambailador of Poland at this Court, has received advice of a great Victory obtained by the Forces of that Crown against the Turks and Tartars, who, though above double the number of the Christians, were totally defeated, and their Camp and Cannon taken: Of which we expect the particulars by the lext Letters.
