W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with eer-"tain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and "Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixteenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastial Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of "Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for relieving those canons of the collegiate church of Saint Peter, Westminster, who were in possession at the passing of the said Act, from the performance of additional duty by reason of the suspension of canonries in the said church.

"Whereas it was by the said Act enacted, that out of the proceeds of the suspended canonries in any chapter, provision might, from time to time, be made by the authority in the said Act provided, for relieving the then existing canons of such chapter from the performances of any additional duty by reason of such suspension, by the employment of substitutes to be approved by the respective bishops:

"And whereas application has been made to us by the Dean and Chapter of your Majesty's royal and peculiar collegiate church of Saint Peter, Westminster, to make provision for a substitute or subsitutes to be employed and approved according to and for the purpose specified by the said Act as aforesaid: "We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that, until the said chapter shall consist exclusively of canons appointed after the passing of the said recited Act, the said dean and chapter shall and may, from time to time, appoint a substitute or substitutes, to be approved by your Majesty, your heirs or successors, and by the dean, for the time being, of the said collegiate church, to perform the duties of a canon in residence for such calendar month or months, in the present and each future year, as shall remain unprovided for after the periods of statutable and customary residence by all the existing canons shall have been fixed.

"And we further recommend and propose, that it shall be lawful for the treasurer or other proper officer, for the time being, of the said dean and chapter to retain and pay, out of any monies receivable from him by us in each year as the proceeds of suspended canonries in the same church, the sum of fifty pounds for every calendar month, so remaining unprovided for, to the person or persons so appointed and approved, in such proportions, if more than one person, as shall be equal to the period of residence and duty by each of them actually kept and performed.

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> "And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of King George the Third, intituled " An Act " to amend and render more effectual an Act, " passed in the last session of Parliament, for " building, and promoting the building, of ad-" ditional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in that behalf vested in them under the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Wolverhampton, in the county of Stafford, and within the diocese of Lichfield, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Mary, situate in the township of Bilston, within the said parish of Wolverhampton, under or by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King intituled "An Act to George the Third, " amend and render more effectual an Act, " passed in the last session of Parliament, " for building, and promoting the building, of " additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners under the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should be named, " The Chapelry District of Saint Mary, Bilston," with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned :

" The chapelry district of Saint Mary, Bilston, is bounded on the north and north west by Bilston-

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brook; on the south west and south by the district parish of Coseley; on the east by the district of Moxley, formed by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England; and on the north east by the parish of Darlaston, as such proposed chapelry district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that it also appears to them to be expedient, that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be 'solemnized or performed in the said church of Saint Mary; and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the Incumbent thereof for the time being:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Lichfield (as the Bishop of the diocese within which the said church of Saint Mary, at Bilston, and parish of Wolverhampton aforesaid are situate), has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said John Lord Bishop of Lichfield has signed and sealed this representation :

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Paddington, in the county of Middlesex, and within the diocese of London, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church, called All Saints Church, situate in Cambridge-place, in the said parish of Paddington, under and by virtue of the power and authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of King George the Third, intituled " An Act to " amend and render more effectual an Act, passed " in the last session of Parliament, for building, " and promoting the building, of additional " churches in populous parishes," as enlarged and extended by the first section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to further amend the Church Building " Acts," and that such proposed district should be taken partly out of that portion of the said parish of Paddington which now remains or belongs to the parish church of such parish, and

partly out of the chapelry district of Saint John, Paddington, and that the same should be called, "The Chapelry District of All Saints, Paddington," with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned :

" The chapelry district of All Saints, Paddington, commences at the south west corner of the Grand Junction Canal at the point marked A on the map or plan hereinafter referred to, and proceeds along the south side of the said canal to the centre of the road at the east end thereof, and from thence in a south eastwardly direction to the centre of Praed-street, then proceeding south westwardly along the centre of Praed-street to Bouverie-street, south eastwardly along the centre of Bouverie-street to Star-street, and north eastwardly along the centre of Star-street to Upper Southwick-street, then again south eastwardly along the centre of Upper Southwickstreet to Somers-mews, and from thence south westwardly along the centre of Somers-mews to Somers-street, then south eastwardly along the centre of Somers-street and Radnor-place to Southwick-place, then proceeding south westwardly along the centre of Southwick-place and Gloucester-square to Sussex place, and continuing north westwardly along the centre of Sussex-place and Devonport-street to Grand Junction-street, then again proceeding south westwardly along the centre of Grand Junction-street to Spring-street, and north westwardly along the cenre of Springstreet and Eastbourne-terrace to the intersection of Charles-street, then returning north eastwardly across the ground belonging to the Great Western Railway Company, in a straight line from the centre line of Charles-street, to the south end of the Paddington Canal, from thence it proceeds north westwardly along the boundary fence dividing the properties of the Grand Junction Canal Company and the Great Western Railway Company to the point marked A on the said map where the district commenced, and as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured red and yellow, the portion coloured red being that taken from the said chapelry district of Saint John, Paddington :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it also appears to them to be expedient, that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings should be solemnized or performed in the said church called All Saints Church, and that the fees to arise therefrom should be equally divided between the Incumbent thereof for the time being and the Reverend Archibald Montgomery Campbell, the present Incumbent of the said parish church of Paddington, during the existing incumbency of such parish church, and that, upon the first or next avoidance of such parish church, the whole of the said fees should belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the said church called All Saints Church :

"That the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Lord Bishop of London (as Bishop of the diocese within which the said parish of Paddington is situate), has been obtained to the assignment of the said proposed district, and also to the appropriation of the said fees, as required by the two before-mentioned Acts and sections; in testimony whereof, the said Charles James Lord Bishop of London has signed and sealed this representation :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, and churchings, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
