

convenient to communicate to him by Letter, therefore desired he would repair to *Waradin*, that he might inform him thereof by word of mouth, and that he might come with all Security, the Bassa sent him a Passport. Hereupon *Teckeley* resolved to go thither, accompanied with *Petrozzy* and some others of his principal Adherents, and 500 Horse; The Bassa came out to meet him, and received him with all the appearance of Kindness and Esteem, and conducted him into the Town, with only eight of his Attendants, causing all the Cannon of the place to be discharged, with other marks of respect, and entertained him at Supper; which being ended, an Aga with his Janizaries enter'd the Room, and having told *Teckeley* he had Orders from the Grand Signior to seize him, and to carry him to *Adriano-ple*, caused Irons to be put upon his Hands and Feet: at the same time the Bassa told *Petrozzy* (who next to *Teckeley* was the Chief of the Rebels) that the Grand Signior gave him the Principality and Command which *Teckeley* had had, and that he would assist him with all his Forces; which *Petrozzy* seem'd to accept of, but being got out of the place, and coming to the 500 Horse that attended *Teckeley* thither, he informed them of what had happen'd, and exhorted them to return to their Duty to the Emperor; and to put themselves immediately into his Service; which they agreeing to, *Petrozzy* marched directly to the Camp before *Caschau*, and sent to the rest of their Party to advise them to follow their example, which they accordingly did; and we are told, that 7000 of the Rebels came with *Petrozzy* into the Imperial Camp; General *Caprara* having granted them the benefit of the General Amnesic, sent *Petrozzi* into *Caschau*, to give the Inhabitants an account of what had befallen *Teckeley*, which he having done, and withal acquainting them that the Mines at the Foot of the Wall were ready to Spring, they presently resolved to surrender the place upon Articles, most of the Garrison entering into the Imperial Service. After which General *Caprara* sent to the Princess of *Rogotzi*, Wife to Count *Teckeley*, to require her to surrender the strong Castle of *Mongatz*, which its not doubted she will do, in the circumstances she now is in.

Hamburg, Nov. 7. The King of *Denmark*, after having given Audience at *Gluckstadt* to the Envoy from the Duke of *Zell*, and the Deputies of this City, is returned to *Copenhagen*. They write from *Berlin*, that the Sieur *Grasson* was arrived there with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Sueden*, to adjust the Differences concerning the Limits in *Pomeran*. And that the Elector of *Brandenburgh* will have a considerable Army on foot in the Spring; of which, it's said, he will send 10000 Men, under the Command of the Duke of *Saxe Lawenburg*, to serve the next Campaign in *Hungary*.

Cologne, Nov. 10. Since our last, the Sieur *Juden*, Secretary of this City, has been seized by Order of the Imperial Commissioners, being charged with having falsified the publick Acts. The said Commissioners have this Week examined several other persons, some of which, it's believed, will be likewise secured. It's said that 600 Men of the Circle of *Westphalia* are coming hither to remain in *Garison* here for some short time, to preserve the publick Peace.

Mague, Nov. 6. The Prince of *Orange* returned

hither this Evening from the *Veluwe*, and the Princess is expected here to morrow. The Sieur *Moreau Vertelly*, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Poland*, has communicated to the States General the News he has receiv'd of a great Victory obtained by the Forces of that Crown against the Turks. The Baron de *Bodschwincke* is come back from *Friesland*. The Heer *Van Heemsberk* Ambassador Extraordinary from the States General at *Madrid*, has obtained leave to return home; and its believed the Heer *Falkenier*, who has for several years resided on their part at *Ratisbonne*, will succeed him in the same Quality at that Court. Prince *Cassimir* Stadthoeler of *Gronngen* and *Friesland* is expected here in two or three days. The Letters from *Venice* of the 2d. of this Month, confirm the news of the *Venetians* having taken *Porto Vitulo*, *Chielisa*, and *Passava*; and consequently of their being Masters of the whole Province of *Mayna*, of which the Captain General had made Signior *Lorenzo Venier* Governor.
