And notice is hereby further given, that it is intended to apply for the insertion in the said Bill, with reference to the said last-mentioned branch railway and works, of powers for the compulsory purchase of lands and houses, and to vary and extinguish all rights and privileges in any manner connected with the lands and houses proposed to be taken for the purposes aforesaid; and also to levy tolls, rates, and duties upon or in respect of the said branch railway and works; and to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from the payment of tolls, rates, and duties, and other rights and privileges.—Dated this 28th day of April 1848.
