the first-mentioned Act, of such an annual sum as shall, upon due inquiry, appear to be a just and reasonable compensation for such diminution :

“ And whereas by certain duly gazetted Orders of your Majesty in Council for confirming certain schemes prepared by us, pursuant to the same Act, certain new parishes have been duly constituted, and the perpetual curates thereof respectively have become entitled to receive certain fees, dues and other emoluments arising therein, and we deem it just and reasonable, that compensation should be made to the incumbents of the churches or chapels hereinafter mentioned whose fees, dues or other emoluments have been diminished by or in consequence of such proceedings, and that the annual sums hereinafter mentioned should be assigned to such incumbents :

Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that, in respect of the new parishes men-

tioned in the first column of the schedule hereunto annexed, there shall be paid by us to the several parties mentioned in the second column of the same schedule, the annual sums mentioned in the third column thereof by way of such compensation as aforesaid, by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year; and that the first payment in each case shall be made on the first day of May next, and shall be calculated from the day on which the said fees became by law receivable by the perpetual curates of such new parishes respectively.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"Commissioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for substituting a money payment to the Treasurer of the cathedral church of Exeter, for certain property belonging to him as such Treasurer.

"Whereas, by and under the provisions of the said Acts, the whole of the separate estates and endowments belonging to the dignity or office of Treasurer in the cathedral church of Exeter will (excepting any right of patronage), upon the first avoidance of such dignity or office, become absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required :

"And whereas it was by the same Acts enacted that, by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement might, from time to time, be made, with the consent, in writing, under the hand of any dignitary or officer of any cathedral church, for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to such dignitary or officer or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or other hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments :

"And whereas it has been agreed between us and the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Exeter, the present Treasurer of the said cathedral church of Exeter, that, with a view to sooner carrying into effect the purpose of the said recited Acts hereinbefore particularly mentioned, the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council :

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry Bishop of Exeter, testified by his having signed this scheme as such Treasurer as aforesaid, humbly recommend and propose that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law, other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and after the day of such gazetting, all lands, tithes and other hereditaments (except any right of patronage) belonging to the said Henry Bishop of Exeter as Treasurer of the

said cathedral church of Exeter as aforesaid, and which now are demised and granted by and under the several leases and grants mentioned in the schedule hereunto annexed, shall, together with all estate, right, title and interest therein (except as aforesaid), be and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by and from the said Henry Bishop of Exeter as such Treasurer to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to the said leases and grants thereof; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance, there shall be paid by us to the said Henry Bishop of Exeter, so long as he shall continue to be such Treasurer as aforesaid and no longer, the annual sum of six hundred and forty pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the twenty-second day of January and the twenty-second day of July; and that the first such half-yearly payment shall be made on the twenty-second day of July next; provided that no renewal of any or either of the said leases or grants, nor any new lease or grant of the said lands, tithes or other hereditaments, or of any part thereof, shall, since the twenty-second day of January now last past, have been or shall be granted or made by the said Henry Bishop of Exeter; and that if the next avoidance of the said treasurership shall happen on any other day than one of the said two half-yearly days of payment, then a proportionate sum only shall be paid to the said Henry Bishop of Exeter, or his representatives:

IT is hereby notified, that Viscount Palmerston, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a dispatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Vienna, enclosing a note from Count Fiquelmont, the Austrian Minister for Foreign Affairs, containing the following announcement of the blockade of Venice:

[Translation.]

Count Fiquelmont to Viscount Ponsonby, dated Vienna, the 30th April 1848.

THE city of Venice having raised the standard of revolt, the Government of His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty has found itself compelled, with the view of reducing it again to obedience, to place the port of Venice under effective blockade, from the 23d of the present month.

In expressing the hope that this measure will not be of long duration, and that it will cause only a short interruption to commercial relations, the undersigned, Minister for Foreign Affairs, has the honour to request that his Excellency Viscount

Ponsonby, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Her Britannick Majesty, will bring this measure to the knowledge of his Government.

IT is hereby notified, that Viscount Palmerston, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from the Danish Minister at Her Majesty's Court, a note, announcing the blockade of the German Baltic ports of Stettin, Stralsund, Rostock, Wismar, Pillau, and Danzig; and further announcing, that the Elbe will be blockaded on the 10th instant.

The tenor of the Danish Minister's note is as follows:

[Translation.]

MY LORD,

IN execution of the instructions which I have just received from my Government, I have the honour to notify to you the blockade of the following ports of the Baltic, by the forces of His Danish Majesty, namely:

and to request that the Government of Her Britannick Majesty will cause the usual publication of the same to be made, in order to obviate all future complaint or reclamation on the part of the trade.

Every neutral vessel will be informed, on its entry into the Baltic, that those ports are effectively blockaded.

I am informed, by the same dispatch, that the blockade of the mouth of the Elbe has been provisionally fixed for the 10th of May, but that a further notification will be forwarded to me.

In making your Excellency acquainted with the measures adopted by my Government, I have the honour to enclose a copy of the dispatch from my Court, which directs me to make the communication; and I avail myself of this opportunity of renewing the assurances, &c.

MONSIEUR LE COMTE,

YOU are aware that the differences which have for some time prevailed between Denmark and Prussia, as well as the other Powers of the North of Germany, have recently broken out into open hostilities.

It is not owing to the King our august Master, that they have not been terminated by means of conciliation; every proposition made with that view has unfortunately failed, in consequence of the obstinacy and precipitation of the Cabinet of Berlin.

His Majesty, being at present attacked upon His own territory by the German troops, finds himself under the painful necessity of employing all the means of defence in his power; and he has therefore resolved, in the first place, to cause the ports and the mouths of the rivers belonging to the enemy, to be blockaded by his naval forces.

I have the honour, Monsieur le Comte, to announce to you, in consequence, that the effective blockade of the following ports will take place,

For Stettin, Stralsund, Rostock, and Wismar,	} from the 2d of May.
For Pillau and Dantzic,	

For Pillau and Dantzic,	} from the 3d of May.

With regard to the mouth of the Elbe, the blockade thereof is provisionally fixed for the 10th of May; but I reserve to myself to transmit to you a further notification in this respect, as well as with regard to other ports, the blockade of which may be determined upon.

While I request you, Monsieur le Comte, to bring these arrangements to the knowledge of the Government to which you are accredited, I have to add, that every neutral vessel will be warned, on her entry into the Baltic, that those ports are effectively blockaded.

The royal ordinance which, in determining the measures to be taken relative to the blockaded ports, and the seizure of vessels belonging to the enemy, recognizes and guarantees the rights of neutrals, is in the press, and will be communicated to you as soon as possible. Neutral packets, charged with the conveyance of mails, will be allowed to pass freely, and will only be warned not to bring in articles contraband of war.

Westminster, May 5, 1848.
