WHEREAS by a certain Order in Council, made on the twenty-sixth day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, for regulating the trade and commerce of the district of Natal, in South Africa, certain duties of Customs were directed to be levied upon certain goods, wares, and merchandizes imported into the said district; and whereas it is expedient to exempt agricultural implements imported into the said district from the payment of such duties:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the date of the publication of this Order in the said district, no duties of Customs shall be levied in the said district upon agricultural implements imported into the said district, any thing in the said first-mentioned Order in Council to the contrary notwithstanding:
