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Venice, Novemb. 10.

ON Thursday last arrived here General *Degenfeld*, with the Commissary General of the Troops of *Saxony*, by whom we are informed, That Captain General *Morosini* had caused the Fortrefs of *Passava* in the Province of *Maina*, to be demolished, but had put good Garisons into *Coron*, *Zarnana*, *Chielisa*, and *Porto Vitulo*; That he had sent the Troops of *Saxony* and *Brunswick* to winter at *Corfu* and *Zam*, and that he intended to go himself with the Gallies to *Sta. Maura*; That Signior *Molino* was cruising with the Squadron under his Command in the Sea of *Sapienza*, and Signior *Delfino* in the *Archipelago*; And that the Captain *Bassa* was gone with his remaining Troops which were not above 3000 Horse into *Arcadia*. By a Vessel come from *Durazzo* we have advice, that the *Bassa* of *Scutari* having got a body of Men together marched with them towards *Cattaro*, with a design to attack that place, but that the *Heydukes* and *Moriaques* having notice of it, had assembled such a Force as to oblige him to retire in much haste.

Genova, Novemb. 10. We have an account from *Leghorn* that a *Tartane* was arrived there from the Coast of *Barbary*, with advice that the two Brothers *Haly* and *Mehemet* Sons of *Morad Bey* had defeated the Forces of the Dey of *Tunis*, who not thinking himself safe in that City, was fled into the Country.

Warsaw, Octob. 25. The Forces of this Crown having by their courage and resolution freed themselves from the danger that threatened them (being so enclosed by the *Turks* and *Tartars* who were treble their number, that they could hardly have subsisted any longer) and opened, with the Slaughter of 8 or 900 of the Enemy, a way for their retreat towards the *Niester*, have since, as the last Letters from *Lembourgh* inform us, repassed that River, and are going into their Winter-quarters. The Militia of the several Palatinates are drawing together in pursuance of the Kings Orders, and some of them have already begun their march, but it's believed they will now be Countermanded; And that the King will return hither with the whole Court to pass the Winter here. The Sicur *Mobila* General of the faithful *Cossacks*, having received advice that *Solinko*, who Commanded the *Cossacks* that have revolted to the *Turks*, was with 2000 Men at *Soborlitz* in the *Ukrain*, of which whole Province the Grand Signior had made him Governour, he sent thither a detachment of 4000 Men, who marching with great diligence surprized the said place; which they Plundered and afterwards burnt; Among the Prisoners they took was the said *Solinko*, who offered 12000 Ducats for his

Ransome, which the *Cossacks* would not accept of, but brought him to their General *Mobila*, who has lent him to the King of *Poland*.

Oedembourg, Novemb. 2. The Count *de Peradeijer* Viceroy of *Croatia*, being taken very ill with the Gout, gave lately to his Nephew Count *Francis Erded*; the Command of 2000 men, which he intended to have led himself, to make an incursion into the Enemies Territories; Accordingly he began his march the 17th of the last month towards the Town of *Uranograb*, which he attackt the 19th, and after some resistance made himself Master of it, but the *Turks* who retired into the Castle defended it so well that he did not think fit to stay any longer there, but continuing his march destroyed all the Country for several miles round, and having Plundered and burnt several Villages, returned the 25th with a great deal of booty and 50 Prisoners, having in this expedition lost but five Men, besides 10 or 12 wounded.

Vienna, Novemb. 11. The ninth instant Cardinal *Bonvisi* the Popes Nuncio at this Court received Letters by an Express from *Rome*, and the next day had Audience of the Emperor, to acquaint his Imperial Majesty that the Most Christian King has referred to the Arbitrage of his Holiness, the Pretensions of the Dutchess of *Orleans* upon the Allodial Lands of the Palatinate. The Marquis *de Luzara* is arrived here in the Quality of Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of *Manua*, to compliment the Emperor upon the happy successes of his Arms in *Hungary*, and the Birth of the young Arch-Duke. The Princess *Rogotzi* has it's said surrendered the Castle of *Mongatz* to General *Carpvara*; The Imperial Troops on that side are now preparing to enter into their Winter-quarters, though there is a discourse that before they separate they will make another attempt upon *Agria*, the Popes Nuntio having promised to give 50000 Crowns in case they take that place this Winter. The Turkish Aga who we told you in our last, was arrived at *Comorra*, is still there, not being able to obtain a Passport to come hither; but it's believed that some person will be sent to him to know his business.

Cologne, Novemb. 20. The Imperial Commissioners have begun to examine the matters in dispute between the old and present Magistrates, and have summoned the *Sindicke* *Judendonck* and some others, who are able to give an account of the publick proceedings here since the year 1680. to appear before them. The Sicur *Bisstein* is come to *Vienna* on the part of this City; And it's believed he has likewise a Commission to some Princes of the Empire. We are told from *Franckfort*, that orders have been sent to the Troops of *Franconia* now in the Emperors service, to Winter in the Hereditary Countries; And that the States of that Circle intend to recruit the said Troops against the next Campaign.

Campagne. The Letters from *Hungary* give an account, that the strong Castles of *Mongatz* and *Ungwar* are surrendered to the Imperialists; And that the Prince of *Transylvania* was sending an Envoy to *Vienna* to Treat as is believed an Alliance with the Emperor. They write from *Vienna* that great preparations are making for the next Campaign; That the Turks had sent another Aga with Proposals of Peace, but that he had been stopt at *Comorra*.

Hamburg, Nov. 16. The Sieur *Kaunitz* the *Brandenburgh* Minister, came hither the last week from the Court of *Zell*, where he hath been some time endeavoring to accomodate the differences between the Duke of *Zell* and this City; since his arrival here he hath had several Conferences with Deputies appointed for that purpose by our Magistrates, in order to remove the difficulties that hinder the Conclusion of this matter. The Equipage of the Count *de Nostitz*, whom the Emperor is sending in quality of his Ambassador to the King of *Sweden*, is arrived here, and he himself is expected in few days; It's said he will pass through *Denmark* to Negotiate some Affairs at that Court. We are told from *Dresden* that the Elector of *Saxony* has sent to *Vienna* to desire that the *Lunenburg* Troops may not in their return home pass through his Territories. This Prince as well as the Elector of *Saxony* are it's said going to raise several new Troops. The Letters from *Poland* inform us that the Army of that Crown had repass'd the *Niesster* and that the King had sent Orders to the great General to put the Troops into their Winter-quarters.

Hague, Novemb. 27. Her Royal Highness the Princess of *Orange*, returned hither the 19th instant from the *Velluwe*. The 22d arrived here Prince *Casimir* of *Nassaw* Stadtholder of *Vriesland* and *Groningen*. The 23d the States of *Holland* and *West Vriesland*, met for the first time since their last adjournment; The Deputies of the Admiralties came hither the same day, and have since had a conference with the Deputies of the States General. The Heer *Van Citters* is preparing for his return to *England* to continue his Residence there as Ambassador, from this State. The Count *d'Avaux* Ambassador of *France*, returned hither the 25th instant. The Heer *Guldenfoppe* the Swedish Envoy, hath notified his arrival to the Foreign Ministers here; And it's believed he will in few days have Audience of the States General. The Prince of *Orange* and Prince *Casimir* were present yesterday in the Council of State, to form the State of the War for the next year. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 15th instant give an account, that the Emperor had sent the Sieur *Menniski* to *Comorra*, to hear what the Turkish Aga, who was come thither, had to propose, and then to dispatch him with this answer, That the Emperor would not bearken to any Quarrels of Peace, but what were made jointly to him and his Allies (the King of *Poland*) and the Republick of *Venice*. That an Express arriv'd the 14th at *Vienna*, with the news that the Imperialists had taken *Gyula*; And that they would endeavor to possess themselves of some other places on that side, before they went into their Winter-quarters. And that they had an account that *Teckley* had been carry'd under a strong Guard from *Waradin* to *Belgrade*, lying with Irons on his hands and feet, on a little Straw in an open Wagon drawn by two Oxen.

Paris, Novemb. 24. The Sieur *Girardin*, Ambassador from this Crown to the *Quoman* Port, embarked the 3d of this month at *Toulon*, on a Man of War called the *Vaillant* commanded by the Cheva-

lier *de Mene*, which is to carry him to *Constantinople*, being accompanied with another of the Kings Ships command'd by the Sieur *Bidoult*. Signior *Ranucci* the Pop's Nuncio had the 20th Instant a private Audience of the King at *Versailles*. The Marquis *de Marini* Envoy extraordinary from the Republick of *Genoua*, has had his Audiences of Leave. The differences between the Inhabitants of *Andaye* and *Fenterabia* are compos'd by a Treaty lately made with the Ambassador of this Crown at *Madrid*, by which it is agreed, that the Subjects of both Nations shall have liberty to Fish in the River *Bidassoa*.

Westminster, Novemb. 20. His Majesty, being this day seated on His Throne in the House of Lords, with the usual Solemnity, and the Commons attending, Commanded my Lord Chancellor to let Both Houses know, That it was His Royal Pleasure, for many weighty Reasons, That the Parliament should be Prorogued to the tenth day of *February* next, and accordingly the Parliament was Prorogued to the tenth of *February* next.
