The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for enabling ecclesiastical corporations, aggregate and sole, to grant leases for long terms of years," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the third day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth

years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for enabling ecclesiastical corporations, aggregate and sole, to grant leases for long terms of years," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for determining the portion of the improved value to be made payable to us in a certain mining lease about to be granted by the Vicar of Tavistock, in the county of Devon.

"Whereas by the said last-recited Act it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole (excepting as therein is excepted, which exception does not include the case of a vicar), from time to time, with the consents in that behalf thereby required, and subject to the provisions in the same Acts contained, to grant or demise by lease, for any term not exceeding sixty years, any mines, minerals, quarries or beds belonging to such corporation:

“ And whereas, in pursuance of the power contained in the said recited enactment, it is proposed by the Reverend Edward Atkins Bray, as the Vicar of Tavistock aforesaid, with the consents required by the same Act, to grant and demise by lease certain mines, with the produce thereof, in and under certain lands, being part and parcel of the glebe lands of the vicarage of Tavistock aforesaid, and situate in the parish of Whitchurch, in the said county of Devon :

“ And whereas by the same Act it is further enacted, that in case of any lease of mines, minerals, quarries or beds granted thereunder, such portion of the improved value accruing under such lease, as by the authority provided in the first-recited Act shall be determined, not being more than three fourth parts, nor less than one moiety of such improved value, shall forthwith, and from time to time as the same shall accrue, be paid to us, and shall be subject to the provisions relating to monies payable to us :

“ And whereas the improved value to accrue under the lease so proposed to be granted as aforesaid will, according to the meaning of the same Act, be the whole of the rents, royalties or other reservations which will become payable thereunder :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that one half of the whole net amount of the reservation or reservations to be made in the said lease so to be granted, whether consisting of rent, royalty or otherwise, shall, by such lease, be made directly payable to us ; and that we shall have all the like remedies in respect of such one half of any such reservation as aforesaid, as if the same were a separate rent reserved to us as lessors or grantors and reversioners of the premises comprised in such lease, independently of the rights and remedies of the said Edward Atkins Bray, and his successors, vicars of Tavistock, in respect of the remaining one half thereof, without any priority or preference between us and the said Vicar of Tavistock for the time being ; and further, that we shall have full benefit and advantage, either jointly with or separately from the said Edward Atkins Bray and his successors, vicars of Tavistock, of all or any of the covenants, conditions and agreements in the

said lease contained on the lessee's part, in like manner as if we had been grantors, lessors and reversioners as aforesaid, and as in such lease shall be expressed ; and that, for effectuating such objects, the said lease shall and may be framed in such manner, and contain all such clauses and provisions as we shall approve, and shall have full force accordingly, any rule of law, statute or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been given to the said Edward Atkins Bray, as such Vicar as aforesaid, in accordance with the provisions of the first recited Act, and he has made no objection thereto :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts ; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Exeter.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for substituting a money payment to the canon of the ninth canonry, in the cathedral church of Durham, for certain property belonging to him as such canon, and for authorizing the sale of such property, and of certain other property lately belonging to the second canonry in the same cathedral church.

"Whereas it is by the first herein recited Act, amongst other things, enacted, that, subject to the provisions therein contained, all the estate and interest which the successor to any canonry, suspended by or under the provisions of the same Act, would have had in any lands, tithes and other hereditaments (except any right of patronage) annexed or belonging to or usually held or enjoyed with such canonry, or whereof the rents

and profits had been usually taken and enjoyed by the holder of such canonry, as such holder separately, and in addition to his share of the corporate chapter revenues, should, upon the vacancy of such canonry, without any conveyance thereof or any assurance in the law other than the provisions of the same Act, accrue to and be vested absolutely in us and our successors, for the purposes of the same Act :

"And whereas the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required :

"And whereas it is by the said Acts enacted, that by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement may from time to time be made, with the consent in writing under the hand of any canon of any cathedral church, for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to such canon, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments :

"And whereas it has been agreed between us and the Reverend William Stephen Gilly, the present Canon of the said ninth canonry in the said cathedral church of Durham, that, with a view to the sooner carrying into effect the purpose of the said Acts hereinbefore particularly mentioned, the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council :

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said William Stephen Gilly, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose, that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and after the day of such gazetting all the lands and hereditaments described in the schedule hereunto annexed and numbered 1, now belonging to or forming part of the endowment of the said ninth canonry, or to or in which he the said William Stephen Gilly, as such canon, has or ought to have any estate, right, title or interest separately and in addition to his

share in the corporate revenues of the chapter of Durham, shall, together with all such estate, right, title and interest therein, be and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by and from the said William Stephen Gilly to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance as aforesaid, there shall be paid by us to the said William Stephen Gilly, in each and every year, so long as he shall continue to hold the said canonry, and until the end of the capitular year in which he shall vacate such canonry, the annual sum of twenty-two pounds, on the twenty-eighth day of September, a proportionate part only of the said sum of twenty-two pounds being payable on the twenty-eighth day of September next.

“ And whereas it is by the herein thirdly recited Act, amongst other things, enacted, that, notwithstanding the charge by that Act created (being a charge created in favour of the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne), all the same and the like powers and rights of ownership as are possessed and enjoyed respecting and over any lands, tenements or other hereditaments whatsoever, by any absolute owner thereof, shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over all or any lands, tithes, rent charges, tenements or other hereditaments vested in us, under certain Acts therein mentioned (being the Acts under which the property hereinafter described is vested in us), and may, subject to the provisions of the same Acts and of the now reciting Act, be exercised by us by proper instruments in writing duly executed according to law, with a certain proviso respecting the application of every sum of money received as the consideration or purchase money for the sale, transfer and conveyance by us of any of such lands, tithes, tenements or other hereditaments, or of any estate or interest therein; and with a further proviso, that none of such lands, tithes, tenements or other hereditaments be sold, transferred or conveyed except by the authority of a scheme, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying the same:

“ And whereas all the separate estates and endowments formerly belonging to the said second canonry in the said cathedral church, comprising,

among other estates, certain lands and hereditaments situate in the vicinity of Durham, and described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and numbered 2, became vested in us on the suspension of the said canonry:

“ And whereas application has been made to us for the purchase of all our estate and interest in the lands so described in the said schedules; and after due consideration it appears to us to be expedient, that we should be empowered to dispose of our interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us to be advisable:

“ We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that we may be authorized and empowered, by deed or deeds duly executed under our common seal, to sell and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all the said lands and hereditaments described in the said schedules hereunto annexed, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons or body corporate desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs, successors or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and enquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority vested in the said Commissioners under the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid

before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the third day of August instant, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Saint Mary, Whitechapel, in the county of Middlesex, and within the diocese of London, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Jude, situate in Commercial-street, in the said parish of Saint Mary, Whitechapel, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners by the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should be named, " The Chapelry District of Saint Jude, Whitechapel," with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned :

" The chapelry district of Saint Jude, Whitechapel, is bounded on the north by the parish of Spitalfields; on the east by Osborn-street; on the south by High-street, Whitechapel; and on the west by the parish of Saint Botolph, Aldgate; the eastern and southern boundaries being, respectively, the middle of Osborn-street and High-street, Whitechapel aforesaid, as such proposed chapelry district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereto annexed, and thereon coloured green :

" Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that it also appears to them to be expedient, that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings should be solemnized or performed in the said church of Saint Jude; and that the fees arising therefrom should be paid and belong to the incumbent or minister thereof for the time being :

" That the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Lord Bishop

of London (as Bishop of the diocese) has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Charles James Lord Bishop of London has signed and sealed this representation :

“ Your Majesty’s said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased; by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, and churchings, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is hereby pleased to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board, a report of the Right Honourable the Lords of a Committee of Council, dated the tenth instant, in the words following, viz.

“ Your Majesty having been pleased by your Order in Council, of the thirtieth day of October last, to refer unto this Committee for consideration an Act, passed in the tenth year of your Majesty’s reign, intituled “ An Act for the more easy recovery of small debts and demands in “ England,” with directions to report to your Majesty, what order, in their opinion, it might be proper to make for paying the Judges and certain Officers of the County Courts, established under the provisions of the said Act, by salaries, instead of fees :

“ The Lords of the Committee, in obedience to your Majesty’s said order of reference, have taken the said Act into consideration, and having ascertained that, in accordance with the provisions

of the said Statute, the Lord High Chancellor of England had appointed sixty Judges to preside over the whole of the said County Courts, are pleased humbly to report, as their opinion, to your Majesty, that an Order in Council, to the effect following, should be made for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say :

“ That, from and after the thirtieth day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, the sixty Judges of the Courts, held under the provisions of the said Act of the tenth year of your Majesty’s reign, should be paid by salaries; and that each of such sixty Judges should be paid one thousand pounds per annum, at such times and in such manner as the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty’s Treasury may think fit to direct.”

And whereas notice was given and published in the London Gazette, on Tuesday the second day of November last, that, after the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of that notice, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, would take into consideration the propriety of making an order, under the provisions of the said Act, for paying the Judges, Clerks, Bailiffs, and Officers of the said Courts, by salaries instead of fees, or in such other manner as might be deemed expedient :

Her Majesty, having taken the premises into consideration, is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the thirtieth day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, the sixty Judges of the Courts, held under the provisions of the said Act, shall be paid by salaries instead of fees; and that each of such sixty Judges shall be paid, as and for his salary, one thousand pounds per annum, at such times and in such manner as the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty’s Treasury may think fit to direct.

Swansea Valley Railway.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Commissioners of Railways, by a warrant under their seal, bearing date the 17th day of August now last, and made in pursuance of an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, intituled “ An Act to give further time for making certain

railways," have ordered and declared, that the period of time limited by the Swansea Valley Railway Act, 1847, for the completion of the railway and branch railways described in the said warrant (that is to say), a railway, commencing in the parish of Ystradgunlais, in the county of Brecon, and terminating at or near the harbour of Swansea, in the parish of Swansea, in the county of Glamorgan; also a branch railway, diverging from and out of the last-mentioned railway, in the parish of Llansamlet, in the county of Glamorgan aforesaid, and terminating at or near the Old Rolling Mill, on the Lower Forest Farm, in the same parish; and also a branch railway, diverging from and out of the said firstly hereinbefore-mentioned railway, in the parish of Killybebill, and terminating at or near the Cwmtwrch Railway, at or near the wharf on the north side of the Swansea Canal, in the parish of Ystradgunlais aforesaid; and also a branch railway, diverging from and out of the said firstly hereinbefore-mentioned railway, in the parish of Killybebill aforesaid, and terminating at or near the Yniscedwyn Iron Works, in the parish of Ystradgunlais aforesaid, shall be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said period so limited by such Act; and also that the period of time limited by the same Act, for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purpose of constructing the hereinbefore-mentioned railway and branch railways, shall (except in respect of such of the lands mentioned and described in the plans of the said railway and branch railways and the books of reference thereto, deposited with the Clerks of the Peace of the counties of Brecon and Glamorgan, as are wholly or in part the property of Howel Gwyn, Esquire) be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said last-mentioned period so limited by such Act, and shall, in respect of such of the said lands as are wholly or in part the property of the said Howel Gwyn, be extended for the further period of one year from the expiration of the said last-mentioned period so limited by such Act; subject nevertheless to all such savings, exceptions, and provisions whatsoever as are contained in the said Act of the present session of Parliament.—Dated this 18th day of August 1848.

Shrewsbury and Hereford Railway.
