1st. The lands which may be within the distance of ten miles from a point to be specified by the Governor in the town or township of Belfast, in the District of Port Phillip.

2dly. The lands which may be within the distance of ten miles from a point to be specified by the Governor in the town or township of Warrnambool, in the same district.
