The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IT is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council, that the Parliament, which stands prorogued to Thursday the second of November next, be further prorogued to Tuesday the nineteenth day of December next.

The Queen has been pleased to approve of Mr. George Dunlop, as Consul at Southampton for the Republick of the Equator.

The Queen has been pleased to approve of Mr. James H. Wolff, as Consul at Southampton for the Republick of Chili.

Whitehall, November 8, 1848.

The Queen has been pleased to nominate, constitute, and appoint Henry Halford Vaughan, Esq. M. A. Barrister at Law, to be Professor of Modern History in the University of Oxford, in the room of the Rev. Doctor John Antony Cramer, deceased.

In pursuance of the directions of an Act, passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts, made in the tenth and fifteenth years of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out writs for the election of Members to serve in Parliament, in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes."

I do hereby give notice, that it hath been certified to me in writing, under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament, that the Right Honourable George William Frederick Howard, commonly called Viscount Morpeth, late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the west riding of the county of York, is become a Peer of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and to whom a writ of summons hath been issued under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom to summon him to Parliament; and that I shall issue my warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new writ for the electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said west riding of the county of York, in the room of the said Right Honourable George William Frederick Howard, commonly called Viscount Morpeth, now a Peer of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and to whom a writ of summons hath been issued as aforesaid, at the end of fourteen days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.
