Madrid, November 24.

HEIR Catholick Majefties are still at the Buen Retiro, and it's believed will continue there till after Chrismas. Orders have been sent to the Viceroy of Naples, to permit the Republick of Venice to raise 1000 Men in that Kingdom. The Troops that are reformed in the Milaneze, are ordered to be sent to Catalonia.

Genoua, Novemb. 24. Th: Governor of Milan departed from hence the 21st instant, with an intention to return hither against the Carnavall. This week arrived here the Zant and Kesolution, in 40 days from Newfoundland, where they have had a plentiful Fishing.

Leghorn, Novemb. 21. The 15th Inflant in the Evening arrived in this Road the Galleys of Spain, Naples and Sicily: The Governor of this place fent an Officer to Complement the Marquis de Cogollado, who Commands them, and to let him know, that he would folute him the next morning with the fame number of Guns as had been formerly practifed; but the Wind being fair, the Galleys failed again in the Night, being bound for Naples. By a Veffel arrived from Tunin, we are informed, That the two Brothers, Haly and Mehemet Beys, were Encamped with their Forces very near that City, which was defended by the Dey Achmet, who having discovered a Correspondence the Beys had in the Town, in order to surprize it, had cut off the Heads of several of the most confiderable of the Divan and the Militia, whom he fuspected of favouring that De-fign. The Beys are affished by the Government of Argiers.

Cracow, Novemb. 11. The Forces of this Crown are gone into their Winter-quarters, which have been affigned them, as near as conveniently they could to the Frontiers. The King who is now at Zolkiew, has it's faid fummoned all the Senators of the Kingdom to meet the beginning of the next month, to confult about the Preparations for the next Campagne, and has in the mean time declared, that he will Command his Army in Person the next Summer, and that he intends to be in the Field towards the end of April, or the beginning of May. The Troops are at prefent in no very good condition, having fuffered very much by the continual skirmishes and engagements they had with the Jurks and Tartars, for 10 or 12 days together, and through the flarcity of Provisions, which, being advanced fo far, as they were into the E-nemics Country, they could not without great difficulty be supplyed with. The Colonels have Orders to make all the hafte they can to recruit their feveral Regiments, and it's faid Commissions will be given out for a further Levy both of Horfe and Foot. The Amballadors deligned for Moleovy, have orders to haken their departure, upon the

advice the King has received of the disposition the Czars are in, not only to determine amicably the differences that have to long depended about the Limits, but farther to make a perpetual Peace, and defensive Alliance with this Crown. There are Letters from Lemburgh, which fay the Turks have belieged Niemirow, where General Mohila is with a good Garison of Coffacks; if this news be confirmed, it will oblige our Forces to take the Field again to relieve this place, which is of no finall importance.

Vienna, Novemb. 29. The Sicur Meninski the Emperors chief Interpreter, is come back from Comorra. He had Orders to open the Letter the Aga Achmet was charged with, which he did ; and having Interpreted it, fent it hither, with an Account, That the Aga had declared to him, That the Grand Signior did defire to Re-effablish a Peace or Truce between the two Empires, and wilhed his Im7 perial Majefty would fend Commissioners to Budg or Conflantinople, to begin a Negotiation for that purpole; adding, That the Viner of Buda had in the mean time Orders not to exercise any Hostilia ties against the Imperial Troops ; and 'that Count Teckeley had been Seized by the Grand Signiors Command, as being the Author of this War, and all the Calamitics that have attended it. The Viller of Buda's Letter was much to the fame effect : Upon which, Directions have been fent to the Sicur Meninski to return, as we are told, this Aufwer to the Aga ; That the Emperor did not intend to fend Commissioners or any other Ministersto the Port, nor to enter into any Negotiation of Peace or Truce, without the participation of his Allies. The Envoy from the Prince of Transilvania continues to follicite an Exemption of Quarters on the behalf of feveral Villages on the Frontiers of Hungary, which belong to that Principallity, and offers in lieu thereof to furnish a certain quantity of Forage and Provisions for the Imperial Troops. The Chevalier de Lubomirski has quitted his Regiment, and in confideration thereof, the Emperor has given him a yearly Penfion of 3000 Crowns; It is faid, that the faid Regiment with thole of Thunn, Holstein, Richardi and Keri, will be reform'd and incorporated into other Regiments, which are not compleat. His Imperial Majefty has declared the Prince of Savoy and Colonel Nigrelli Major Generals of Foot. Count Leflie being very infirm, has defired leave to retire; and its believed the Count de Staremberg will Command the Impetial Forces in Croatia the next Campagne. The Treaty with the Elector of Saxony, about the Troops he has offered to affift the Emperor with against the Turks, is not yet perfected. There is a like Negotiation on foot with the Elector of Brandenburg, and with the Landtgrave of Heffe Caffel. The Prince's Ragotzi is unwilling to put the Calle of Mongatz into the Hands of the Imperialists, having all her Richer there, and feveraì

The last Letters from Hungary tell us, that the Bar in de Mercy and colouel Heufler, hal put their Troops into their Winter-quarters; That there was a Garilon of 2000 Men in Zulnock, and that the Emperor had given the Government of that place to Colonel Heuster. That Gen ral Gaprara but fent 3000 Men to block up the Laffle of Mongatz, upon the Princels *R*₁gotzj's refufing to r. ceive an Imperial Garilon. That there was a report, that the Turks had abandoned *Giula*; And that the \sqrt{vere} preparing to do the like at Agria but this needs a confirmation The Letters from Vienna ipeak of the great preparations that are making for the hext Campagne, and affure us, that the Imperialists will be v-ry early in the Field, and that the Emp. for will have two Armies in Hungary, one Commanded by the Elector of Bavaria, and the other by the Duke of Lorrain.

Francfort, Decemb. 4. The States of the Circle of Suabia are to meet this week at Ulm, to feitly the Winter-quarters for their Troop, which are returned from Hungary, as well as to take the neceffary Refolutions concerning the recruiting them against the next Campagne.

Hamburgh, Decemb 6. The Count de Noffitz. Amballador from the Emperor to the King of Sueden, arriv.d here some days ago; He has sent his Train to Lubecke, to Embark there for Stockbolm, whither he intends to go himself by Land. The differences between the Duke of Zell and this City continue in the f.me State. The Baron de Keunitz the Brandenburgh Minister, is rot returned to Berlin as was reported, but it's believed he will be very fuddenly recalled, because of the great difficulties he meets with in this Negotiation. The Electoral Prince and Prince's of Brandenburg are arrived at Hanouer. They write from Stockholme, That the King of Sueden has given the Velt Marchchal Coningsmarke leave to Command the Forces of the R-publick of Venice the next Campagne, according to the Agreement he lately made with the Venetian Amballador at Vienna.

Amfterdam, Decemb. 10. We have had of late a great deal of bad weather, and we hear o', leveral Ships being caft away on our Coafts, most of which came from the Baltick. The Ships from Arch angel are come in, except two, which it's feared are loft. By a Veffel arrived from the Wift-Indles, We have advice, that the Spanish Fleet Sailed' the 16th of Fuly last from Panama for Lima, bot that the Mart will not be kept at Porto Felo till Fannary next fo that the Gallons cannot be expected in Spain till
