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Genova, Novemb. 29.

THE Spanish Gallies arrived the 15th Instant in the Road of *Legborne*, but the Wind being fair, sailed again the Night following, being bound for *Naples*, where they are to winter: By a Vessel arrived from the Coast of *Barbary*, we have Advice that *Haley* and *Mehemet* Beys are encamped with their Forces very near the City of *Tunis*, and that in all probability they will make themselves Masters of it.

Milan, Novemb. 30. The Orders our Governor the Count *de Melgar* has received from *Spain* about making a Reform in the Forces of this State, will not, as we are told, be put in Execution, till the Courier his Excellency sent lately to *Madrid* be returned, who it's expected will bring farther directions in this matter.

Venice, Decemb 1. General *Morofini* has put the Forces of this Republick into their Winter-quarters; He was himself, according to our last Advices, at *Corfu*, from whence it's believed he is since gone to *St. Maura*, intending to winter there or at *Prevesa*. The Preparations for the next Campaigne are carried on with all the diligence and vigor imaginable; Commissions have been given out for the raising several new Regiments, and the Officers employed therein, are obliged to have their Levies complete by the end of *March*. The Republick does likewise Treat with some of the Princes of the Empire for a Body of Men, and we are assured that the Treaty with the Elector of *Saxony* for this purpose is already concluded. At the same time the *Turks* make great Advancements towards a Peace, which they are forced to by the ill condition of their Affairs, but the Overtures they have hitherto made as well to the Emperor as to this Republick have been rejected. By a Vessel arrived from the *Levant*, we have Advice that the Plague rages very violently at *Constantinople*; and that Provisions are so scarce there, that the Inhabitants are hardly able to subsist; That the Grand Visier makes his utmost Efforts to raise Men and Money for the carrying on the War, but that the Success does not answer his Expectation, especially as to the Levies, the People being everywhere under such Discouragement, and Consternation, that the promises of Double-pay and other advantages cannot engage them into the Service. We have an account from *Dalmatia*, that the Veyvode *Franco* hath made an Incurfion with four or five thousand Men into the Province of *Bosnia*.

Warsaw, Novemb. 24. We have an account from *LeMBERGH*, that the *Turks* were retired from

before *Niemirov*, which place we told you in our last, they had invested, with intention as was thought to attack it; And that the *Tartars* are gone home. The Ambassadors of this Crown are on their Journey for *Moscow*, and we have great reason to believe they will succeed in their Negotiation, for all the Letters we have of late had from that Court, assure us, the Czars do desire to make a perpetual Peace and Defensive Alliance with this Crown, and that they will the next Summer employ their Forces against the *Turks*. The Prince of *Lubomirski* is returned from *Vienna*, having quitted the Command he had in the Imperial Army, to attend the King of *Poland* the next Campaigne, his Majesty having declared, that he will then Command his Forces in Person. The King has written to the Elector of *Brandenburgh* to desire him to hasten the succors he has promised to send him against the *Turks*, so as that they may be able to joyn his Army in the month of *April*, for that he purposes to be in the Field before the end of that month, or in the beginning of the following.

Vienna, Decemb. 6. The Letters from *Upper Hungary* give an account that General *Caprara* is gone to *Esperies*, to settle the Affairs of that City in the same manner as he has done at *Caschau*. That the Troops he sent to *Mongatz* had invested that Fortress, and that the *Hungarians* in Garrison there had fired upon them, but that after all it was believed the Princess *Ragotzi* finding she cannot excuse herself from receiving an Imperial Garrison, will entirely submit to the Emperor's Orders. They write from *Zolnocke*, That some Parties of that Garrison had been engaged with like Parties of the Enemy, and that they had taken several Prisoners. Three thousand Men of the Elector of *Cologne's* Forces which are to be incorporated into the old Imperial Regiments, are marching towards *Upper Hungary*, where their Winter-quarters are assigned them, the rest are returning home. We have an Account from *Croatia*, that Count *Franco Erdedi* had made an Incurfion with 5000 Men into the *Ottoman* Territories, where he had plundered and burnt several places, and amongst others the Town of *Czazin*; In this Expedition he had but 3 Men killed, and 9 wounded. What was said of the *Turkish* Aga's being sent back to *Buda*, proves a mistake, he is still at *Comorra*, and will, it's said, be kept there, till the Emperor can know the mind of his Allies concerning the Answer that is to be given him.

Hamburg, Decemb. 11. The Count *de Nostritz* Ambassador from the Emperor to the King of *Sweden*, parted from hence this week for *Stockholm*. The Baron *Kamnier*, the Elector of *Brandenburgh's* Minister, is returned to *Berlin* to give his Electoral Highness an account of the difficulties that retard
