

Reverend Charles Brodrick, sometime Archbishop of Cashel, deceased, brother of George, fourth Viscount Middleton, father of the said George Alan, late Viscount Middleton; whereby the younger brothers and sisters of the said Charles, now Viscount Middleton, cannot, according to the ordinary rules of honour, enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to them had their late father, the said Most Reverend Charles Brodrick, Archbishop of Cashel, survived his nephew the said George Alan, late Viscount Middleton, and thereby succeeded to the said title and dignity of Viscount Middleton; Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare, that George Brodrick Clerk, William John Brodrick Clerk, Albinia, widow of the Honourable James Ashley Maude; Louisa, wife of James Smyth Scott, Esquire; and Francis, widow of Henry Dunbar Tolley, late a Major-General in the Army, and Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, deceased, the younger brothers and sisters of the said Charles, now Viscount Middleton, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence which would have been due to them had their late father survived his said nephew George Alan, late Viscount Middleton, and succeeded to the said title and dignity of Viscount Middleton:

And Her Majesty has been further pleased to command, that the said royal order and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto John Watlington Perry, of Moor-hall, in the county of Essex, Esq. in the Commission of the Peace for the said county, only son of Thomas Perry, late of Moor-hall aforesaid, Esq. by Maria Jane, his wife, daughter of George Watlington, sometime of the Inner-temple, London, and late of Caldecot-house, in the parish of Aldenham, in the county of Herts, and of Upper Bedford-place, in the parish of St. George, Bloomsbury, in the county of Middlesex, Esq. all deceased, Her royal licence and authority, that he and his issue may, in compliance with a proviso contained in the last will and testament of his maternal Grandfather, the said George Watlington, henceforth assume and bear the surname of Watlington in addition to and after that of Perry, and also bear the arms of Watlington quarterly in the first quarter with those of Perry; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise Her Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Patrick Robert Gordon, of Home-lodge, near Woodstock, in the county of Oxford, Esq. and to Maria, his wife, eldest of the two daughters and coheirs of Robert Canning, late of Foxcote, in the county of Warwick, and of Hartpury, in the county of Gloucester, Esq. deceased, Her royal licence and authority, that they may take and henceforth use the surname of Canning in addition to and after that of Gordon, that the said Patrick Robert Gordon may bear the arms of Canning

quarterly with those of his own family, and that such surnames and arms may in like manner be taken, borne and used by the issue of their marriage; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the law of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office; otherwise Her Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
