It is particularly requested, that in every case *written cards only* be delivered.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the

sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the "spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words and figures following; that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of 'populous parishes,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for compensating certain spiritual persons whose emoluments have been diminished by reason of proceedings under the said Act:

"Whereas the said Act, together with the Acts therein recited, authorize the assigning at any time, and from time to time, to the incumbent of any church or chapel whose fees, dues, or other emoluments shall be diminished by or in consequence of any proceeding under the provisions of the first-mentioned Act, of such an annual sum as shall upon due inquiry appear to be a just and reasonable compensation for such diminution:

"And whereas by certain duly gazetted Orders of your Majesty in Council for confirming certain schemes prepared by us, pursuant to the same Act, certain new parishes have been duly constituted, and the perpetual curates thereof respectively have become entitled to receive certain fees, dues and other emoluments arising therein, and we deem it just and reasonable, that compensation should be made to the incumbents of the churches or chapels hereinafter mentioned whose fees, dues or other emoluments have been diminished by or in consequence of such proceedings, and that the annual sums hereinafter mentioned should be assigned to such incumbents:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that in respect of the new parishes mentioned in the first column of the schedule hereunto annexed, there shall be paid by us, to the several incumbents named and described in the second column of the same schedule, so long as they shall respectively remain such incumbents, and no longer, the annual sums mentioned in the third column thereof, by way of such compensation as aforesaid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November

in each year, and that proportionate payments shall be made on the first day of May next, calculated from the respective days on which the fees, dues and other emoluments became so as aforesaid receivable by the perpetual curates of such new parishes respectively.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for assigning the right of patronage of the district of Pensnett, in the county of Stafford and diocese of Lichfield, and the new parish of Manningham, in the county of York and diocese of Ripon:

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority therein pro-

vided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council ratifying such scheme), at any time to assign the right of patronage of any district or new parish constituted under the provisions of the said Act, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity, or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole, or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons, contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion and in such manner as shall be approved by the like authority:

"And whereas by schemes duly prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council by us, and Orders ratifying the same, made by your Majesty in Council, bearing date respectively the third day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four and the twenty-seventh day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and duly gazetted, the districts of Pensnett and Manningham were duly constituted:

"And whereas the said scheme and Order relating to the said district of Pensnett contained no provision respecting the right of patronage of such district; and the first minister has been appointed thereto in the manner provided for by the said recited Act:

"And whereas the Right Honourable William Baron Ward has already made large contributions, amounting together to the value of five thousand five hundred pounds, towards the erection of a church within the said district of Pensnett, and has agreed to make further contributions towards the completion of the said church:

"And whereas by the said scheme and Order relating to the said district of Manningham, the right of patronage of the said district for the two first nominations of a minister or perpetual curate thereto was, in consideration of a benefaction of three thousand pounds towards the erection of a church for such district and a repairing fund,

assigned to John Hollings, of Manningham, Esquire; and the said scheme and Order contained no provision respecting the right of patronage of the said district or new parish after such two first nominations :

" And whereas the said John Hollings has contributed a further sum of one thousand pounds towards such last-mentioned church, and the same has since been duly completed and approved by us, and consecrated as the church of the said district for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district has accordingly become, under the provisions of the said Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said John Hollings has also contributed towards the erection of a house of residence for the perpetual curate of the said new parish :

" And whereas it has been proposed to us, and it appears to us to be just and expedient, that in consideration of the aforesaid contributions, the future patronage of the said district and new parish should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned :

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that the right of patronage in perpetuity of the said district of Pensnett, and of the said parish of Pensnett, when the same shall become such, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate of such district and parish, shall be assigned to and absolutely vested in the said William Baron Ward, and his heirs and successors, according to the limitations contained in the last will and testament of John William Earl of Dudley, deceased ; and that the right of patronage in perpetuity of the said new parish of Manningham, and the nomination of the perpetual curate thereof, shall be assigned to and absolutely vested in the said John Hollings, and his heirs and assigns for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the dioceses of Lichfield and Ripon.

Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-second day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words following; that is to say:

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,' have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme relating to the archdeaconry of Liverpool, in the diocese of Chester, and the archdeaconry of Manchester, in the diocese of Manchester.

" Whereas it was by the said Act enacted, that any archdeaconry might, subject to the consent of the bishop, be endowed (amongst other modes) by augmentation out of the common fund in the said Act mentioned, but not so as to raise the average annual income to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds :

" And whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the tenth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and duly gazetted, the archdeaconry of Liverpool was constituted in the diocese of Chester, and the Venerable Jonathan Brooks was duly appointed thereto, and still is archdeacon of Liverpool :

" And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the fees and emoluments accruing to him as such archdeacon do not exceed the average annual sum of fifty pounds ;

" And whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-third day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and duly gazetted, it was provided that the annual sum of one hundred pounds should be paid by us to the archdeacon of Manchester for the time being, so as to augment the income of his archdeaconry to the annual average amount of two hundred pounds :

" And whereas it has been made to appear to us that by reason of the alterations made upon the foundation of the see of Manchester, on the first day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, the fees and emoluments accruing to the archdeacon of Manchester for the time being, are diminished by the average annual amount of forty pounds :

" We, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Chester and James Prince Bishop of Manchester, in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose that there be hereafter paid by us on the first day of January yearly to the present and every future archdeacon of Liverpool the annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, and that, instead of the sum of one hundred pounds in the said first-mentioned Order mentioned, the annual sum to be hereafter paid by us, to the present and every future archdeacon of Manchester shall be one hundred and forty pounds, and that proportionate payments shall be forthwith made to the first day of January last, computed in the case of the archdeaconry of Liverpool from the date of the collation of the said Jonathan Brooks, and in the case of the archdeaconry of Manchester, from the said first day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures

relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act, and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the dioceses of Chester and Manchester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for making better provision for the cure of souls in the parish of Wols:anton, in the county of Stafford, and diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, with an especial view to the better care of populous parishes, that arrangements may from time to time be made by the authority therein provided for improving the value or making a better provision for the spiritual duties of ill-endowed parishes or districts, by means of such alterations in the exercise of patronage as may be agreed upon by patrons, with the consent of the bishop:

"And whereas, under the authority of other provisions of the same Act, we have from time to time prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council certain schemes, in which we have recommended and proposed that certain grants should be made in augmentation of the incomes of certain benefices and churches, in certain classes, and subject to certain limitations, therein mentioned, and the said schemes have been ratified by Orders of your Majesty in Council, and such orders have been duly gazetted:

"And whereas on the sixth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, we found it necessary to suspend, until further notice, our recommendations of further grants, with certain specified exceptions:

"And whereas the church of St. John, Goldenhill, in the said parish of Wolstanton, falls within one of such exceptions, but by reason of its being in private patronage, is not within the provisions of the said several Orders of your Majesty, so far as such provisions relate to unconditional grants; and in order to bring it within such provisions, Smith Child, of Rownall-hall, in the county of Stafford, Esquire, the patron thereof, desires to transfer his right of patronage in such church in manner hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lichfield, and of the said Smith Child, testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this scheme, that the patronage of, and right of nomination to, the said church shall, upon and from the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such gazetted Order, become and be transferred to and absolutely vested in, the said John Bishop of Lichfield and his successors Bishops of Lichfield for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the incumbent for the time being of the said church the fixed annual sum of forty pounds by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November, in each year; and that two such payments shall be made on the first day of May next.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent the further augmentation of such benefice, if it shall be deemed fit, when there shall be sufficient means for that purpose; and that if it shall appear to us to be expedient, at any future time, that instead of the annual sum then in course of payment by us to the incumbent of such benefice, or instead of any part of such annual sum, any land, title or other hereditament should be conveyed to such benefice in fee, nothing herein or in any other scheme contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing such substitution."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lichfield.

liament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words following; that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,' and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for substituting a money payment to the dean of the cathedral church of Saint David's, for certain property belonging to him as such dean.

"Whereas it was by the first herein-recited Act (amongst other things) enacted, that, subject to the provisions therein contained, all the estate and interest which the holder of any Deanery not suspended by or under the provisions of the same Act, and his successors, had and would have in any lands, tithes and other hereditaments or endowments whatsoever, annexed or belonging to or usually held or enjoyed with such deanery (except any right of patronage) or whereof the rents and profits had been usually taken and enjoyed by the holder of such deanery as such holder separately and in addition to his share of the corporate revenues of such chapter, should, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than the provisions of the same Act, accrue to and be absolutely vested in us and our successors, for the purposes of the same Act; and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required:

"And whereas it was by the said Acts enacted, that by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement might from time to time be made, with the consent in writing under the hand of any Dean of any cathedral church, for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to such dean, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting, in any case, any lands, tithes or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments :

"And whereas it has been agreed between us and the Very Reverend Llewelyn Lewellin, Doctor of Civil Law, the present Dean of the said cathedral church of Saint David's, that, with a view to the sooner carrying into effect the purpose of the said Acts hereinbefore particularly mentioned, the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council:

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said Llewelyn Lewellin, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose, that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law, other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of such gazetting, all the manors, lands and other hereditaments

(except any right of patronage) described in the schedule hereto annexed, and now belonging to or forming part of the endowment of the said deanery, or to or in which he the said Llewelyn Lewellin, as such dean, has or ought to have any estate, right, title or interest, shall, together with all such estate, right, title and interest therein, be and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by and from the said Llewelyn Lewellin to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us, for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or leases thereof; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance as aforesaid, there shall be paid by us to the said Llewelyn Lewellin, in each and every year, so long as he shall continue to hold the same deanery and no longer, the annual sum of one hundred and fifty-six pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the third day of March and the third day of September, and that the first such half-yearly payment shall be made on the third day of September next; provided that no renewal of any lease, nor any new lease, of any part of such manors, lands and other hereditaments as aforesaid, shall, since the fifteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, have been or shall be granted by the said Llewelyn Lewellin, and that if the next avoidance of the said deanery shall happen on any other day than one of such two half yearly days of payment, then a proportionate sum only shall be paid to the said Llewelyn Lewellin, or his representative or representatives:

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

"All that the manor or lordship of Treffgarne, alias Trawgarn, with all and singular its rights, members, and appurtenances, situate, lying, and being in the parish of Saint Dogwell's, in the county of Pembroke, and all that capital messuage, with the appurtenances now in the occupation of William Edwardes Tucker, of Sealy Ham, near Haverfordwest, in the said county of Pembroke, Esquire, and his undertenants; and also all the manor or lordship of Llandridian, with all and singular the rights, members, and appurtenances thereunto belonging, situate, lying, and being in the parish of Saint David's, in the said county of Pembroke, together with all and singular the messuages, houses, buildings, barns, stables, mills, dovehouses, haggards, gardens, orchards, lands, tenements, meadows, leasows, pastures, feedings, woods, underwoods, soil of woods, and hereditaments, with their and every of their appurtenances, unto the said several manors or lordships belonging, or in anywise appertaining, or to or with them, or any of them, used, occupied, or enjoyed, or accepted, reputed, or taken to be part, parcel, or member thereof, or thereunto belonging or appertaining, together also with all the rents of freeholds and copyholds within the said several manors or lordships; and also all views of frankpledge, courts leet, courts baron, perquisites, and profits, fines, amerciaments, ways, estrays, deodands, goods of felons and fugitives and persons outlawed and put in exigent warrens, mines, quarries, furze, heaths, commons, moors, wastes, marshes, turbaries, waters, watercourses, streams, weirs, banks, stanks, floodgates, fishings, winnowing-places, hawking, hunting, and all other royalties,

privileges, profits and advantages whatsoever, to the said several manors or lordships belonging, or in anywise appertaining or therewith used or enjoyed.

“The whole being comprised in a lease granted the fiftenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, to the said William Edwardes Tucker (now bearing the name of William Edwardes), Esquire, for the lives of William Edwardes Tucker, John Owen Edwardes Tucker, and Francis Edwardes Tucker.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Saint David's.

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said Thomas Henry Shepherd, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose, that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law, other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of such gazetting, all the lands, tithes and other hereditaments (except any right of patronage) now belonging to or forming part of the endowment of the said canonry, or to or in which he the said Thomas Henry Shepherd, as such canon has, or ought to have, any estate, right, title or interest, separately and in addition to his share of the corporate revenues of the chapter of the said collegiate church of Southwell, shall, together with all such estate, right, title and interest therein, be and be held to be for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by and from the said Thomas Henry Shepherd to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or
