At the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 21st day of *May* 1849.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament, held in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for the appointment of convenient places for the holding of assizes in England and Wales," it was declared and enacted that His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Most Honourable Privy Council, should have power from time to time to order and direct at what place or places, in any county, in England or Wales, the assizes and sessions under the commissions of Gaol delivery and other commissions for the despatch of civil and criminal business shall be holden; and whereas by another Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, after reciting that the holding of the summer assizes for the county of Buckingham, at the town of Buckingham, is inconvenient to the inhabitants of the said county, and that it would conduce to the more cheap, speedy, and effectual administration of justice if some other place or places were appointed for the holding of the said assizes, but by reason of an Act of the twenty-first year of the reign of King George the Second, intituled "An Act for holding the summer assizes, for the county of Buckingham, at the county town of Buckingham," that object could not be effected under the provisions of the said first-above-recited Act, it was so enacted that all the powers and provisions of the said first-above-recited Act shall extend and apply to the said county of Buckingham, and every place therein; any law, statute, matter, or thing to the contrary notwithstanding:

And whereas the winter assizes for the said county are usually holden at the county town of Aylesbury, in the same county.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth hereby, under and in pursuance of the said recited Acts, order and direct that the summer assizes for the county of Buckingham shall not hereafter be holden at the said town of Buckingham, and that all assizes and sessions under the commissions of Gaol delivery and other commissions, for the despatch of civil and criminal business, which shall be hereafter holden in and for the county of Buckingham, shall be holden at the said town of Aylesbury, and not at any other place within the said county.

And the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
