Whereas by the Act eleventh and twelfth Victoria, cap. 123, intituled "An Act to renew and amend an Act of the tenth year of Her present Majesty for the more speedy removal of certain nuisances, and the prevention of contagious and epidemic diseases," and by virtue of an Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the 27th day of March 1849, directing that the provisions of the said Act be continued in force throughout the whole of Great Britain; of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, We, the General Board of Health, are authorized bearing date the 27th day of March 1849, directing

And whereas it is provided in the fifth section of the aforesaid recited Act, that nothing hereinbefore contained shall apply to any district, parish, or place in which the Public Health Act 1848, or any part thereof, shall be in force, unless and except in so far as the General Board of Health, by order in writing, sealed with the seal of such Board, and signed by two or more members thereof, or (in case there be no such Board in existence) as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by order in writing under his hand, shall otherwise direct;

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the said Act shall continue in force throughout the several parishes and places within the borough of Leicester, for the space of three calendar months from and after the date of this Order, notwithstanding the application of the Public Health Act to Leicester;

We, the General Board of Health, do hereby order and declare, that the various provisions and powers of the above-recited Removal of Nuisances and Prevention of contagious Discases' Act shall remain in force within and throughout the several parishes and places within the said borough of Leicester, for the aforesaid period of three calendar months from and after the date of this present Order.

Now we, the General Board of Health, do in further exercise of the power vested in us as aforesaid, issue the following directions and regulations to extend to the parishes and places comprised in the Neath Union

That the said Board of Guardians, having provided houses of refuge and other appropriate places, shall be authorized and empowered to remove the families of such necessitous persons as have been attacked with cholera, and also such necessitous persons living under the same roof, or in the vicinity of persons so attacked, as the medical officers acting under the authority of the said Board may deem it necessary to remove; the houses, rooms or dwellings from which persons may have been removed to the houses of refuge to be cleansed and purified by the owners or persons having the care or ordering thereof, or in their default by the said Board of Guardians.

to remove; and that the places from which such persons have been removed be forthwith effectively cleansed and purified.

2. That an inspector of nuisances be immediately appointed, and that he see to the removal forthwith of all such nuisances as shall be certified either by the medical superintending inspector, or by either of the union medical officers.

We, the General Board of Health, do hereby order and declare, that the Guardians of the Poor of the Falmouth Union shall, by themselves or their officers, enter the said vessels or any other vessel coming into the said port, in which cholera or other epidemic disease has occurred, and examine the sanitary condition of the same, and inquire into the health of the crew or crews, and, if need be, order cleansing, purification, and all other necessary measures for the prevention of disease which are authorized or required to be adopted in any dwellings on land by the General Regulations of the Board of the 4th day of April 1849, issued to the Guardians of the Poor throughout England and Wales.
