THAT We, the Council of the borough of Dublin, do most respectfully and humbly convey to Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen, and to His Royal Highness Prince Albert, our deep sympathy and sincere condolence upon the melancholy event of the decease of Her late Majesty the Queen Dowager—a lady highly distinguished for her charities and her domestic virtues.
