PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the third section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the law relative to the assignment of ecclesiastical districts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the thirty-first day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words following; viz.:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty that under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous,' and by virtue of and in conformity to an Order of your Majesty in Council, dated the twenty-third day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, a district, consisting of part of the parish of Chirbury, in the county of Salop and diocese of Hereford, was assigned to the consecrated church of the Holy and Undivided Trinity, situate at Middleton, in the said parish of Chirbury, and that it was ordered that such district should consist of the townships of Middleton, Wilmington, Rorrington, and Priest Weston, and to be called 'The Chapelry district of Middleton,' the same being bounded as follows; that is to say: on the north by the township of Marton, in the said parish of Chirbury, and also by a portion of the parish of Worthen; on the east and south-east by the parishes of Worthen and Shelve; on the south by the parishes of Hissington and Church Stoke; and on the west by the townships of Marrington, Chirbury, Hockleton, and Wotherton, in the said parish of Chirbury, as the same were more par-

ticularly delineated on the map or plan annexed to the representation mentioned in the said Order, and thereon coloured yellow:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioner beg leave further to represent to your Majesty that having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the said parish of Chirbury and the adjacent parish of Church Stoke, in the said county of Salop and diocese of Hereford, it appears to them to be expedient that the boundaries of the said chapelry district of Middleton should be altered and enlarged by adding to such chapelry district a portion of the said adjacent parish of Church Stoke, under the provisions of the third section of an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eleventh and twelfth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to amend the law relative to the assignment of ecclesiastical districts,' and that such altered and enlarged chapelry district of Middleton should have boundaries and be bounded as follows; that is to say: on the west by the townships of Marrington, Chirbury, Hockleton and Wotherton in the parish of Chirbury; on the north partly by the township of Marton, in the said parish of Chirbury, and partly by the parish of Worthen; on the east by the said parish of Worthen and the parish of Shelve; on the south-east by the parish of Hissington; on the south by the boundary line which separates the township of Hurdley from the township of Church Stoke as far as the eastern boundary of inclosure No. 171, on the tithe apportionment map of the parish of Church Stoke, and by such boundary to the northern extremity thereof; and from thence in a straight line north-westerly to the northern extremity of inclosure No. 303 on the said tithe apportionment map; and from thence by the boundary line of the parish of Church Stoke, as far as the township of Marrington, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured blue and pink:

"That the consents of the Right Reverend Renn Dickson Lord Bishop of Hereford (as the Bishop of the diocese), and of the Reverend James Wilding, Vicar or Incumbent of the said parish of Chirbury, and as such Patron of the said chapelry district of Middleton, and of the Reverend Robert Warren, the Incumbent of the said chapelry dis-

trict of Middleton, and of the Right Honourable Edward James Herbert Earl of Powis, the Patron of the said parish of Church Stoke, and of the Reverend Robert More White, the Perpetual Curate or Incumbent of the said parish of Church Stoke, have been respectively obtained thereto as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eleventh and twelfth years of your Majesty's reign; in testimony whereof the said Renn Dickson Lord Bishop of Hereford, and the said James Wilding, Robert Warren, Edward James Herbert Earl of Powis, and Robert More White have, respectively, signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners therefore humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed addition or enlargement be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act; and Her Majesty is further pleased, by and with the like advice, to direct that this Order be forthwith enrolled, pursuant to the said Act, or any other Act of Parliament, and registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Hereford.
