WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the tenth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,' and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for substituting a money payment to the prebendary of Dultincote, in the cathedral church of Wells, for the property of his prebend.

"Whereas, by and under the provisions of the said Acts, the whole of the separate estates and endowments belonging to the said prebend will (excepting any right of patronage), upon the first avoidance of the said prebend, become absolutely vested in us, for the purposes of the said Acts, and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required:

"And whereas it was by the same Acts enacted, that by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement might from time to time be made, with the consent in writing under the hand of any prebendary of any cathedral church, for the sale, transfer, or exchange of any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments belonging to such prebendary, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes, or other hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting, in any case, any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments:

"And whereas it has been agreed between us and the Reverend Charles Milman Mount, the present prebendary of the said prebend of Dultincote, that, with a view to sooner carrying into effect the purpose of the said recited Acts hereinbefore particularly mentioned, the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council:

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles Milman Mount, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose, that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law, other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of such gazetting, all lands, tithes and other hereditaments whatsoever (except any right of patronage) now belonging to the said prebendary of Dultincote, as aforesaid, or to or in which he has or ought to have any estate, right, title or interest, shall, together with all such estate, right, title and interest therein (except as aforesaid) be and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by and from the said Charles Milman Mount, to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us, for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or leases thereof, or of any part or parts thereof; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance, there shall be paid by us to the said Charles Milman

Mount so long as he shall continue to be the prebendary of the same prebend, and no longer, the annual sum of fifty pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of April and the first day of October, and that the first such half-yearly payment shall be made on the first day of April next; provided that no renewal of any lease, nor any new lease of the said lands, tithes or other hereditaments or of any part thereof shall, since the eighth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six have been or shall be granted or made by the said Charles Milman Mount or any of his predecessors; and that if the next avoidance of the said prebend shall happen on any other day than one of the said two half-yearly days of payment, then a proportionate sum only shall be paid to the said Charles Milman Mount or his representatives:

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bath and Wells.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled ‘ An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes,’ have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for assigning the right of patronage of the district of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, in the county of Kent, and diocese of London.

“ Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority therein provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying such scheme), at any time to assign the right of patronage of any district or new parish constituted under the provisions of the said Act, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual

curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation aggregate or sole or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion and in such manner as shall be approved by the like authority:

“ And whereas by a scheme duly prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council by us, and an Order ratifying the same, made by your Majesty in Council on the twenty-sixth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and duly gazetted, the said district of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, was duly constituted out of the parishes of Charlton and Woolwich, in the county of Kent:

“ And whereas no provision has yet been made under the said enactment respecting the right of patronage of the said district or new parish:

“ And whereas by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twelfth and thirteenth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled ‘ An Act to enable Sir Thomas Maryon Wilson, Baronet, to grant the site of a church for the district of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, in the county of Kent, and for other purposes,’ it was among other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the said Sir Thomas Maryon Wilson, by deed, under his hand and seal, to give, grant, and convey to us and our successors the piece of land particularly described in the schedule annexed to the same Act, to be appropriated and used as the site for the church of the new parish of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, which the said district will become upon a church being built therein, and consecrated, and approved by us, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, and for a churchyard to be annexed and appurtenant to such church, and for the site of the parsonage house of such district or new parish, in exchange for the patronage and right of nomination of the minister or perpetual curate of the same district or new parish, to be assigned by the said authority by the herein firstly-recited Act provided in manner hereinafter mentioned.

“ And whereas under the provisions of the said secondly-recited Act the said Sir Thomas Maryon Wilson hath accordingly, by deed duly executed, given, granted, and conveyed to and vested in us the said piece or parcel of land for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that in consideration of such grant the patronage of the said district or new parish of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, and the right of nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof, shall be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Sir Thomas Maryon Wilson and the person or persons for the time being entitled to the estates in the said parish of Charlton devised by the will of Sir Thomas Maryon Wilson, Baronet, deceased, as mentioned in the said secondly-recited Act.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any and every other power or authority vested in them by the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation bearing date the twenty-second day of January one thousand eight hundred and fifty, in the words following; that is to say:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Saint Philip and Saint Jacob, Bristol, in the city of Bristol, and diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Luke, situate at Barton-hill, in the said parish of Saint Philip and Saint Jacob, Bristol, under and by virtue of the power or authority for this purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the last session of parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes,' or under or by virtue of any and every other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners by the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should be called 'The Chapelry District of Saint Luke, Barton-hill,' with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned.

"The boundary of the chapelry district of Saint Luke, Barton-hill, commences at the Tollbar-gate, on the south-east side of the Packhorse Inn, on the road to Bath, and proceeds in a south-easterly direction down the centre of Packhorse-lane, and along the eastern walls of the Cotton Factory, as far as the water called the Feeder, along which water it proceeds in a westerly direction as far as a lane or passage at the western extremity of the Bristol Ironworks, up which lane or passage it proceeds north-westerly, and turning in a northerly direction enters Cook's-lane; it then proceeds north-westerly up Cook's-lane, as far as Kilbear-street, and then turning eastwardly proceeds in a straight line along Oxford-place, and proceeding

up the middle of Oxford-road, enters Barton-hill-lane, up the middle of which lane the boundary then proceeds in a north-easterly direction as far as Folly-lane, up the middle of which it proceeds in a north-westerly direction as far as the stream of water; it then follows the course of that stream in a north-easterly and northerly direction to the Packhorse Inn, and leaving the said stream proceeds in a direct line in a north-easterly direction to the toll-bar where the boundary commenced, as such proposed chapelry district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty that it appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said church of Saint Luke, and that the fees to arise therefrom should be reserved for and paid over to the Reverend Samuel Emery Day, Master of Arts, the present vicar or incumbent of the said parish of Saint Philip and Saint Jacob, Bristol, during his incumbency of that parish, and that upon his avoidance thereof the said fees should belong to the minister or incumbent for the time of the said church of Saint Luke, at Barton-hill aforesaid.

"That the consent of the Right Reverend James Henry Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol (as the Bishop of the said diocese) has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned: in testimony whereof the said James Henry Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol has signed and sealed this representation.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith enrolled, pursuant to the said Acts, and registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.
