## Madrid, Fannary 18.

HE Government of Sardinis, wacant by the removal of the Count de Fuenfalida to that of Milan, is not yet disposed of. The 10th Inftant was performed the Ceremony of giving the Golden Fleece to Count Mansfelt, the Emperor's Ambassador at this Court, at which all the Knights of that Order, which were here, affifted. The King has ratified the Treaty the Count de Melgar, Governor of the Milaneze, hath lately concluded, with the State of Venice for 3000 Men, which are to be fent to the affiliance of that Republick. By a Veffet arrived at Cadiz from the West Indies, we have Advice, that the Galeons would be ready to fail from Cartagens in the baginning of March, and that their Lading would atabunt to 20000 Millions in Silver, besides Merchandizes; And that most of the Pyrats who went into the South were dellroyed. The extraordinary Council that was held the laft week in the King's prefence, was, we are told, to regulate feveral matters concerning his Majefilies Revenues:

Genoua, fan. 14. The Duke of Monaco is fill here, but intends to part from hence the beginning of the next week for France. The Marquis de Marini, late Envoy Extraordinary from this Republick at the Court of France, arrived here two or three days ago in a Gally from Marfeiller. By a Vellel arrived from the Coaft of Barbary, we are informed that fix Men of War of Tripoli, who had ferved in the Grand Signior's Fleet the laft Summer, were returned home, and that two of them were gone out again to cruife.

Liebon, Jan. 1. The roth of the laft Month. the Sieur Amelor, Ambassador of France, had his Publick Audience of the King of Porthgal (who is perfectly recovered of his late Indiposition) and afterwards of the Infanta. We have Advice that two Portuguese Ships bound for Brazile and Angola, have been cast away near O Porto, their Lading, which was all loss, being valued at 500000 Crowns.

Legborne, Fan. 16. The Great Duke of Tuftany has given Orders for the arming four Galibts at Pila, which are to cruife on these Coasts, to secure them against the Pyrats of Barbary. Five English Merchant Ships arrived here this week.

Venice, Jan. 18. The 12th Inflant the Senate made choice of Prince Maximilian of Brunfwicke, to be General of the Forces of the Republick, with a yearly Penlion of 6000 Ducats; And the

fame day gave a Commission to Colonel Maravi, to raile 1000 Men in the Ifle of Corfica; The S .nate have likewife appointed three extraordinary Governors of the Galcancs, who are Signior Bar tolomeo Contarini, Signior Philippo Doria, and Signior Aleffandro Beregani. We have Alvice, that the Two thousand Turks which we told you in our laft, had appeared in the Neighborhood of Coron, increasing afterwards to 4000, had formed a defign upon 'Coron, for which purpole they expected fome Cannon from Modon; but that Signior Moline, who was Cruiling with a Squadron of Men of War in the Gulph of Coron, having notice thereof, he had, after having taken the necelfary measures with the Governor of Coron, fent an Officer alhore to affemble the Greeks and Maynotes, of which having got together a confiderable Body, he cauled them to embark in Imail Boats which he had provided, and to land again in the Night not far from Goron, who being joined by the Garilon of that place, they covironed the Turks, and charged them fo vigoroully, that most of them were killed or taken Prifoners, and the reft put to flight, the Venetians remaining Masters of their Baggage, and a great quantity of Arms and Ammunition. The Letters from Rome of the 12th of this Month tell us, that the Pope's Indifpolition still kept him from giving any Audiences; And that his Holiness had for some days been troubled with the Gout in I is hand of

Warfaw, Jan. 10. The Turks, as the laft Letters from Zolkiew inform us, do endeavor to amule the Court of Poland, and to flacken the Preparations that are making in this Kingdom, by their repeated Overtures of Peace, which they have not only made by the hands of the Polifh Minister at Adrianople (where he has been detained ever fince the prefeat War) and the Envoy of the Cham of Tartary, but likewile by other ways; but they have been all rejected in a manner that will let the Ortomans fee how vainly they endeavor to divert the King from a vigorous profecution of the War, or to feparate him from his Allies. The Palijh Officersare now making their Recruits, belides which feveral new Regiments will be raifed ; Towards the charge whereof, the Pope has by his Nuncio at this Court, contributed a confiderable Sum of Money, and has given the King an alfurance of yet greater Supplies. It is certain the Campagne will be begun on this fide much fooner this year than it hath yet been finces the War; And, it's faid, that. the 12th of May is already appointed for the general Rendezvous of the Army. We have an account from Lembergh, that the Sieur Mobila, General of the Coffacks, in the Service of this Crown, underfilming that 300d Tarrars were drawn together ncaŕ

near Caminico, with a defign to make an Incursion into the Polijb Territories, gave notice thereof to the Crown General, and defired fome Troops might be fent to his affifiance, which being done, he matched with these, and a Detathement of Coffacks, towards the Enemy, and fell upon them with that Courage and Success, that the Tartars were entirely routed, and the greatest part of them flain upon the place. We have Letters from Mof cow of the beginning of the last Month, which fo far confirm our former Advices, as to fay that there is a great disposition at that Court to adjust the Differences they have with this Crown about the Limits; but withal add, that according to all appearance, the Czars will not engage in the War against the Turks.

Rativbonne, Jan. 25. The Letters from Vienna of the 20th Instant inform us, that the Deputies from the Prince and States of Transilvania ( had the 16th Audience of the Emperor, to whom they represented the great Burthen that Principality at prefent lies under, by being obliged to give Winter-quarters to 8000 Men, and to raife befides Contributions in Money, and to furnish Provisions for the Imperial Troops quartered about Zolnocke, and prayed his Imperial Majefty to withdraw his faid Troops; That two or three days after they had another Audience of the Emperor, but it's not known what they then proposed. The Count de Herberstein, Governor of Carelstads, parted from thence the 31 of the laft Month for Segna, to embark there on a Venetian Man of War which is to carry him to Malta , and the Count de Strafoldo is appointed by the Emperor to be Governor of Carelflads, during the absence of the Count de Herberstein, who is to command the Gallies of Malta the next Summer against the Turks. The Forces which the Elector of Brandens burgh is to fend to the Emperor's affiftance, will confift in twelve Troops of Horic, fix Troops of Dragoons stand five Regiments of Foot, making together 7400 Men ; They will begin their march the first of April. His Electoral Highness has likewise promised to affist the Emperor with feveral pieces of great Cannon and Mortars. They write from Hungary, that General Caprara had fent 1500 Foot to reinforce the Treops that block up the Caffie of Montgatz.

Hamburgh, Fan. 29. They write from Zell, that a Reform will be made in the Troops of the Dukes of Lunenburgh; Those Princes intending to keep in their Pay only 1 5000 Foot and 2000 Horle, befides the Troops which the Duke of Hanouer has fent to the Affiliance of the Republick of Venice. The Differences between the Dake of Zell and this City, continucin the fame flate, all the Endeavors that, have been used to compose them, has ving been hitherto ineffectual. The Letters from. Poland hardly speak of any thing, but the preparations that are making there for the Campagac.

Hague, Febr. 8. The Letters from Vienna of the 27th paft, do not confirm the news we had by the Post before, of the Defeat of 3000 Turks wear Segedim and of Mejor-General Heufier's being mortally wounded, but give the following Account. That Lieutenant-General derivatives and General Heufter marched from Zolaoche, on the first of the

last Month, with 4000 Germans and Hungarians, and naving raif-d tome Contributions in th Encmi s Country, advanced towards Segedin, and after Nome refiltance, made themfelves Mafters of that Tows, which having Plundered and Burnt, the wet Weather hindering them from attacking the Calile, into which the Garilon had retired, they returned with the Booty they had got to Zolno ck.

The King intends, we are told, Paris, Febr. 8. that his Troops shall encamp this Summer, as they did the laft in three Bodies, one in Alface, another in the Franche Comte, and the third on the Saar. They write from Madrid, that the Pope's Nuncio at that Court has defired that the Money taken out of the French Snip at the Groyne, may be reftored to the Owners thereof, they giving fecurity at Madrid to fubmit to what his Holinefs thall determine in that matter. The Letters from Cadiz tell us, that the Galcons are expected there in May.

Whiteball, Febr. 2. The Marquis de Capponi, Envoy Extraordinary from the Great Duke of Tufcany, hath had his Audiences of Leave of their Majeflies, being Conducted by Sir Charles Courel Master of the Ceremonies.
