one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such
persons as may be willing to contract for supplying
and delivering into Her Majesty's Victualling
Stores at Deptford,

15⁰⁰ tons New Iron Butt and Plate Hoops; half
to be delivered by the 31st July, and the
remainder by the 30th September next.

tualling-yard at Deptford, and the conditions of
the contract may be seen at the said Office.

No tender will be received after one o'clock on
the day of treaty, nor any noticed unless the party
attends, or an agent for him duly authorized in
writing.
