FURTHER REGULATIONS AS TO POST-OFFICE MONEY ORDERS.

1. WHEREAS certain regulations relating to Post-office Money Orders were made and issued, bearing date on or about the 12th day of September 1848; and whereas it is expedient to make and establish other regulations relating thereto; Now I, Ulick John Marquess of Clanricarde, Her Ma-jesty's Postmaster-General, by and with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby order, direct, and declare that the said regulations, bearing date the said 12th day of September 1848, shall be and remain in force as to all money orders heretofore granted or issued, save and except so far as the same shall or may be altered by the regulations hereby made; and that so far as the same shall be so altered, or shall be inconsistent with the regulations hereby made, the said regulations of the 12th September 1848, or so much thereof as shall be so altered or inconsistent, shall, be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. And whereas it sometimes happens that Post-offices on which money orders are drawn become vacant, and the business thereof is suspended or impeded by reason of the denth, resignation, dismissal, or otherwise, of the deputy, sub-deputy, or receiver, and sometimes application is made for the payment of money orders to be transferred from the Post-office on which they have been drawn to some other Post-office, and it is expedient to make provision for the payment of such money orders; Now I do hereby, by and with such consent as aforesaid, further order, direct, and declare that the Postmaster-General for the time being may, from time to time, as he shall think fit, order and direct that the payment of any money orders which have been at any time heretofore issued or granted, or which shall be at any time hereafter issued or granted on or payable at any Post-office shall be transferred to, and that such money orders shall be paid and payable at any other Post-office the said Postmaster-General shall for that purpose direct or appoint.

3. And I do hereby, by and with such consent as aforesaid, further order, direct, and declare, that from and after the expiration of twelve calendar months next, after the month in which any money order shall be hereafter issued or granted by any Post-office, every such money order shall be absolutely void and of no effect, and all liability to pay such money order, or the money in respect of which the same shall be so issued or granted by or on the part of the Post-office revenue, or the Postmaster-General, or the Deputy Postmaster, or other person by whom such money order shall be issued or granted, or upon whom, or upon, or at whose office the same shall be drawn, or in the event of the payment thereof having been transferred to any other Post-office then upon whom, or upon, or at whose office the same shall be subsequently made payable, shall absolutely cease and determine to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

4. And I do hereby, by and with such consent as aforesaid, further order, direct, and declare, that all money orders which have been at any time heretofore issued or granted, or which shall be at anytime hereafter issued or granted by any Post-office, shall be paid at the Post-office upon which the same have been or shall be drawn (or in the event of the payment thereof having been transferred to any other Post-office, then at the Postoffice at which the same have been or shall be subsequently made payable), before the expiration of two calendar months next after the end of the month in which the same have been, or shall be so issued or granted; and that from and after that period no such money orders shall be paid or payable: Provided always, that in every case where any money order at any time heretofore issued or granted, or at any time hereafter issued or granted, shall not have been paid as aforesaid within the period of two calendar months next after the month in which the same hath been or shall be issued or granted, the person or persons

in whose favour any such money order shall have been drawn, or at whose instance the same shall have been so issued or granted, or his or their executors or administrators may, at any time before the expiration of twelve calendar months next after the month in which any such money order shall have been so issued or granted, upon application to the Postmaster-General for that purpose, and his consent thereto having been obtained, receive from any Post-office the Postmaster-General shall think fit a new money order for the same amount as the former money order, or for the same amount less the poundage payable thereon, and every such new money order shall be paid at the Post-office upon which the same shall be drawn, or at which it shall be subsequently made payable as aforesaid before the expiration of twelve calendar months next after the end of the month in which the same shall have been so granted or issued as aforesaid, and no such new money order shall be paid or payable after that period ; and in like manner, after the expiration of the period for payment of any former money order heretofore or hereafter issued or granted, a new money order may, upon such application as aforesaid, be obtained for the same amount as the money order in lieu of which it shall be so issued or granted, or for the same amount less the poundage payable thereon; and for every new money order so issued or granted a fresh poundage according to the regulations in force at the time the granting of such new money order shall be payable and paid by the person so applying for and receiving the same; or, if the Postmaster-General shall think fit, such poundage shall be deducted from the amount of the former order; and in that case, the new order shall be granted for the difference between the amount of such poundage and the amount of the former order: Provided, that no such new money order shall be paid or payable at any Post-office whatever after the expiration of two calendar months next after the end of the month in which the same shall be so issued, nor shall any such money order be issued or granted unless applied for before the expiration of twelve calendar months next after the month in which the money order in lieu of which the same is so applied for shall have been issued or granted; and every new money order shall be subject in every respect to the same regulations as are hereinbefore contained with reference to original orders.

5. And I, the said Ulick John Marquess of Clanricarde, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, do hereby, by and with such consent as aforesaid, further order, direct, and declare that in all cases where any money order at any time heretofore issued or granted, or to be at any time hereafter issued or granted by any Post-office (whether original or renewed) shall have been paid at the Post-office upon which the same shall have been drawn, or at which the same shall have been subsequently made payable as aforesaid, all liability by or on the part of the Post-office revenue or the Postmaster-General, or the Deputy Postmaster, or other person by whom such money order was or shall be issued or granted, or upon whom, or upon or at whose office the same was or shall be drawn, or was or shall be subsequently made payable as aforesaid by reason of the said money order, or of the granting or issuing thereof, or of such payment thereof as aforesaid, by whomsoever the said money order shall have been presented, or to whomsoever it shall have been paid, or in whatever name the money order receipt shall have been signed, shall absolutely cease and determine to all intents and purposes whatsoever, whether such payment shall have been made by or through any forgery, fraud, misrepresentation, or mistake, or otherwise howsoever.
