Malter, January 2. H E great Malter has given Orders for the firting out with all diligence eight Galies, which are to ferve againft the Turks the next Summen, under the Command of the Coun de Herberglein: They will have on Board them 900 Land-Soldiers, and a Company of 100 Kuights; And will be ready to fall about the end of April. A Maples, Jan.ya. Yelferday failed from hence three Marchart Ships bound for Calic, having on

Naples, Jan. ye. Yelferday failed from hence three Marcha & Ships bound for Cadiz, having on Board 500 Soldiers railed in this Kingdom, to recruit the Neapolitan Regim nts in the Service of the Spanif Netherlands; At Cadiz they are to embark on other Velfels for Oflend. The Darch Convoy who arrived here the last week; dailed again the 27th Inflant, bound for Smirna. The Marquis de Flori, who has at his own Charge fitted out a Ship of 50 Guns to ferve again't the Turks, is now in this Port, to fupply himfelf with Provisions and other Neceflaries. The Duke of Turks is arrived at Gaeta with the Squadron of Gallies under his Command to pais the reft of the Winter there.

Milan, Febr. 6. The Treaty our Governor lately concluded with the Senate of Venice being ratified by the King of Spain, and the Republick, the Troops his Excellency was thereby obliged to fend to the affiftance of that State, began their march the laft week, confifting in three Regimen's of Foot, and one of Dragoons, making together 3300 Men.

Venice, Febr. 9. The Letters from Corfou, by the way of Otranto, inform us, that the Captain General having refitted h's Ships and Gallies, had refilved to fail from thence with the whole Fleet to altack, as was reported, Napoli de Malvasia; And that he had in the mean time fent Signior Delfino 50 cruile with 15 Men of War in the Archipelagob By a Saique arrived from Zara, we have advice, that newith flanding the continual Rains they have had of late in those Parts, the Morlaques had made an Incussion into the Turkish Territories, and advanced as faires Lapax; That they had plundered and burnt three or four confiderable places; and returned with 2000 Heid of Gattle, and a great quaptity of Forage; and other confiderable Booty.

The Letters from file Court at Zolkiew inform us, that an Express arrived there the 22 d Inflant with Letters from the, Reliff Refutent in Persia, wherein he gives the King an actou t, that the Sophy having heard of the raifing of the Siege of Fienna, and of the entire Defeat of the Ottoman Army commanded by, the Grand Viller, which he did not do till a year after, had thereupon refolved to break with the Tarks? that accordingly he had declared Wart against abem, and had commanded his Generals to march with all his Forces towards the Tarkif Territories to befiege Babylon; And the faid Express fays, he met above 30000 Persian Horle that were marching to

the General Rendezvous. He adds, that publifiing this important News in his pallage through Molcouy, the great Men of that Countrey did very much rejoyce at it, and that coming to Moscow, fome of the Czar's chief Minilters hal fent for him, and feeming very well pleafed with theaccount he gave them, had charged him with a Commidion, to d.fire the Amba ladors of this Crown; in cafe he met them, to halten their Journey to Moleon, which he had performed, having met them on the Frontiers of Molcovy. The preparations that are making in this Kingdom for the profecution of the Wan, save (carried on with all the vigor and application imaginable; The King will be very early in the fields He will) not begin the Campagne with the Siege of Gaminice, as has been reported, but istends to pass the Niefler, and to advance in-to Moldavia and Valachia, to bring these two Provinces under the fubjection of this Crown ; And for that purpole Boats are providing to make a Hy-

ing Bridge on the Niefler. Vienna, Febr. 10. They write from Opper Hungary, that feveral Turkish Troops were come to Lippa, and that it was faid Count Teckeley was with them, to try to regain the Hungarians that have abandoned him fince his Imprilonment. The Emperor has given the Count de Peterbass, for his late good Services, a Gold Chain, and his Picture fet with Diamonds, and has ordered Prefents for all the Officers, according to their feveral Queities, and three Months Pay for the Soldiers, under his Command; The Pope's Nuncio has likewife made the Count de Peterhafi a Prefent of a Gold We have an account from Agris, that the Chaia. Turis of that place fearing they shall be attackt at the opening of the Campagne, work night and day to put themfelves into the best posture of defence, they can; That they have undermined all th ir Works, and have our down all the Trees and Vincs round the Town. They write from Zaimar, that General Caraffa, who has his Quarters there, was preparing for fome important Enterprize, which we expect a farther account of in few days. We are told from Croatia, that there is fuch a Dearth in those Parts, that the Inhabitants of feveral Villages joining together, had forced one or two Callles where the Gen lemen, to whom they belonged, had fecured their Corn, upon which fome froops had been feet out to difperfe them. The laft Letters from Palands confirmed the News of the Perfuns having begun a War against the Turks; And fay further a that they have great hopes the Moleovites will thereupon enter into an offentive and defentive Alliance with the Grown of *Boland*.

(Cologne, Febr. 22. The Imp-rial Sub-Commiffioners parted from hence the 1-3th Inflant for Dufeldorpe, once more to examine the three Prifoners Gulicke, Sacks and Mechovius, who returned hither the 17th; And yesterday the faid Psifoners were
