were brought from Dufeldorpe to Mulheim, where s Sentence of Death was the faine day pronounced againft them; And, it's faid, they will be executed to morrow. The Letters from *Pienna* of the 13th Inflant fay, they had advice from *Opper Hun*gary, that Count Teckeley was come to Lippa at the Head of a confiderable Body of Turks, and that he had from thence fent to the Princels Ragotzi, to let her know that he fhould be very fuddenly in a condition to relieve Montgatz.

The Duke of Zell has Hamburgh, Febr. 19. written a Letter to the Magifirates of this City, wherein he tells them, that the Orders he had given for the quartering fome of his Forces within their Territories, would feem lefs firange to them, if they confidered with what undutifulnels they have flighted the feveral Orders and Mandates of the Emperor, and how infufferable their carriage has been towards him ( the Duke of Zell ) having continued the Prohibition of all manner of Commerce with his Dominions, notwithflanding his repeated Admonitions to them to the contrary, and his Declaration that he would release their Ships; And that the way to keep things from coming to the last Extremities, is for them to yield due Obdience to the Emperor's Mandates; and particularly to that which requires them to reflore the Councellor Meurer to his Effate and Employment, and to make him (the Duke of Zell) speedy reparation for what is past; adding, that he expected from them a politive Answer, and such as he might rely upon; and that he had given farther directions in these matters to Monsieur Chauver Lieutenant-General of his Forces, who would appoint fome of his Officers to meet and confer with -fuch perfons as fhould be by them deputed for that purpole. This Letter being read in the Senate, and in the Council of Thirty, after a long debate, it was refolved to fend back the Melfenger without any answer to it. The Letters from Copenhagen affure us, that the King of Denmark hath order'd 7 or 8 Batallions, and fome Dragoons, to march this way. And we are told from Berlin, that the Elector of Brandenburgh, if there be occasion, will likewife affift this City. These Magistrates, in the mean time, continue to raife Men ; They have already a confiderable Body in their Service, which is poffed about two English Miles from hence, and feveral finall Veffels have been armed out to cruile on the-Elbe.

Hague, Febr. 19. The States of Holland and Weiffriefland are now affembled, and, it's believed, before they leparate, they will take a final refoution about the difcharging the Debts contracted during the laft War The Sieur Hunnicken, who refides-here on the part of the Duke of Hanouer, prefented this week a Memorial to the States General, demanding the payment of the Arrears of Sublidies due to his Mafter from this State. Prince Waldecke arrived here the 11th Inflane from Germany.

Hague, Febr. 26. The States of Holland have not yet been able to agree about the raifing a Fond to discharge the Debts contracted during the last War, and, it's believed, they will adjourn again without coming to a final refolution in this matter. The States General have ordered that Copies of the Memorial lately prefented to them by the Sieur Hunnicken, the Lunenburgh Minister, shall be fent to the feveral Provinces, and that it beat the fame time very carnefly recommended to shem to take care that the Arrears of Sublidies due to the Dake of Hanouer from this State may be forthwith paid The Deputies of the Admiralties have had feveral Conferences with those of the States Genetal, and upon their report, the faid States have, we well rewarded.

are told, refulved that a Squadron of 7 or 8 Mcn of War tha 1 be fitted out, and fent to the Streights, under the Command of the Count de Stirum, for the fecurity of our Commerce against the Pyrats of Barbary. The Heer Van Spaen, Lieutenant Ge-neral of the Elector of Brandenburgh's Forces, arrived here on Friday last from Cleves; It is faid that his Electoral Highness is going to form a Camp of 14 or 15000 Men on that fide; There is likewife a discourse, that part of the forces of this State will encamp this Summer near Breda. Prince Waldecke is preparing for his return to Vienna, being to command the Imperial Forces in Hungary under the Duke of Lorrain; he is treating with feveral Ingeniers and Bombardiers, who are defirous to enter the Emperor's Service. The last Letters from Hamburgh told us, that the Lunenburgh Troops had quitted Heskenkaten Fort, as likewile a Work they had caft up to fecure a Pais called, The Red Bridge; And that they drew their whole Force together near Barsdorf, which, it's believed, they have done, upon the News of the march of the Danish Forces.
