The ladies to wear black silk or velvet, coloured ribbons, fans and tippets, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuffs, with black ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured swords and buckles.

And on Sunday the 10th of November next, the Court to go out of Mourning.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage or inland postage payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such warrant; and from time to time, by warrant as aforesaid, to alter or repeal any such altered rates, and make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof; and from time to time, by warrant as aforesaid, to appoint at what time the rates that may be payable are to be paid; and it is provided, that the power thereby given should extend to any increase, or reduction, or remission of postage.

And whereas the said Commissioners, in exercise of the power for such purpose vested in them by the said Act, have some time since fixed and established rates of postage on letters passing between the United Kingdom and Oldenburgh.

And whereas, in consequence of communications opened with the Post-office of Oldenburgh, it is considered expedient to fix and establish certain rates of postage on printed newspapers, and other printed papers, conveyed between that country and the United Kingdom, and passing through the United Kingdom to or from the British colonies, or foreign countries.

Now we, the undersigned, being two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do, in exercise of the power reserved to us in and by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf by this warrant under our hands, order and direct that such printed newspapers, printed publications, printed prices current, printed commercial lists, and printed courses of exchange, as are hereinafter mentioned, may be sent by the post according to the regulations and rates hereinafter set forth; that is to say:

British newspapers, and such British publications as are allowed to pass by the post as newspapers in the United Kingdom, may, if posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to Oldenburgh, be sent from the United Kingdom to Oldenburgh direct, or via the territories of Hamburg, Hanover, or Bremen, direct from the United Kingdom to any port in such territories by packet-boat or private ship, free of postage.

Newspapers, and other publications allowed to pass by the post as newspapers in Oldenburgh, published and posted in Oldenburgh, addressed to the United Kingdom, may be sent from Oldenburgh to the United Kingdom direct, or via the territories of Hamburg, Hanover, or Bremen, direct from any port in such territories to the United Kingdom, by packet-boat, free of postage, and by private ship, at the rate of one halfpenny each.

Newspapers, and other publications allowed to pass by the post as newspapers in Oldenburgh, published and posted in Oldenburgh, may be sent from thence to the British colonies and foreign countries through the United Kingdom, and foreign and colonial newspapers, addressed to Oldenburgh, may be sent from foreign countries and the British colonies to Oldenburgh through the United Kingdom (the conveyance, in every case, between the United Kingdom and Oldenburgh being direct, or via the territories of Hamburg, Hanover, or Bremen, direct between any port in such territories and the United Kingdom, by packet-boat or private ship) at a rate of one halfpenny each.

Periodical works (not of daily publication, and not allowed to pass as newspapers), printed, published, and posted within the United Kingdom, addressed to Oldenburgh, and periodical works (not of daily publication and not allowed to pass as newspapers), printed, published, and posted in Oldenburgh, addressed to the United Kingdom, may be transmitted between the two countries direct, or via the territories of Hamburg, Hanover, or Bremen, direct between any port in such territories and the United Kingdom, by packet-boat or private ship at the following rates; namely:

For every publication, not exceeding two ounces in weight, one penny.

Above two ounces in weight, and not exceeding three ounces, six pence.

Above three ounces in weight, and not exceeding four ounces, eight pence.

And for every additional ounce in weight above four ounces up to sixteen ounces (the limit of weight beyond which such publications are not to be sent by the post, except at the letter rates of postage), two pence more; and every lesser weight than an ounce is to be charged as a full ounce.

Printed courses of exchange, printed prices current, printed commercial lists, and such other printed papers as are allowed either in the United Kingdom or Oldenburgh to pass by the post at a reduced rate of postage may, if posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to Oldenburgh, or posted in Oldenburgh, addressed to the United Kingdom, be transmitted between the United Kingdom and Oldenburgh, direct or via the territories of Hamburg, Hanover, or Bremen, direct between any port in such territories and the United Kingdom, by packet-boat or private ship, at a rate of one penny each.

Printed courses of exchange, printed prices current, and printed commercial lists, published and posted in, or addressed to, Oldenburgh, may be sent between Oldenburgh and the British colonies or foreign Countries through the United Kingdom, the conveyance between Oldenburgh and the United Kingdom being direct or via the territories of Hamburg, Hanover, or Bremen, direct between any port in such territories and the United Kingdom, by packet-boat or private ship, at a rate of one penny each.

The said newspapers, publications, printed courses of exchange, printed prices current, printed commercial lists, and such other printed papers as aforesaid, to be forwarded under and subject to the following conditions; that is to say:

Each must be printed in the language of the country in which it is published.

Each must be published in the country from which it is sent, and be sent without a cover, or in a band or cover open at the sides, and there must be no word or communication printed on the paper after its publication, or upon the band or cover thereof, nor any writing, figures, or manual marks upon it, or upon the band or cover of it, except the name and address of the person to whom sent.

There must be no paper or thing enclosed in or with any such newspaper, periodical publication, printed course of exchange, printed price current, printed commercial list, or other printed paper.

The courses of exchange, prices current, and commercial lists must contain merely the names and prices of the goods without mentioning the name or residence of the vendor or sender.

Any newspaper, periodical publication, course of exchange, price current, commercial list, or other printed paper not forwarded in conformity with such conditions, is to be chargeable with the full letter rates of postage.

And we direct that every printed supplement, or additional sheet to any newspaper, shall, for the purpose of charging the postage under this warrant, be deemed a distinct newspaper, unless sent in the same cover, or together with the newspaper to which it is a supplement or addition.

And we direct that in all cases in which any printed newspaper, periodical publication, course of exchange, price current, commercial list, or other printed paper, in respect of which a rate of postage is charged by this warrant, shall pass through a foreign country, any foreign postage payable thereon shall be charged and paid thereon in addition to the British postage.

And we further direct that the term "Oldenburgh," used in this warrant, shall be construed to mean the duchy and territories of Oldenburgh (the principality of Birkenfeld and the possessions of the duchy of Oldenburgh, in Holstein, only excepted), and that the several other terms and expressions used in this warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.

And we do further direct that this warrant shall come into operation on the first day of November 1850.

Provided lastly, and we do hereby declare and direct, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any two of them, by warrant under their hands, at any time hereafter to alter or repeal any of the rates hereby fixed or altered, or the regulations hereby made, and to make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu thereof, and from time to time to appoint at what time the rates that may be payable are to be paid.

Dee Standard Restoration.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session for an Act for the erection, construction, replacing, and restoring a certain pile called "The Standard," in the River Dee, or some other convenient piles or standards for the purpose of measuring and ascertaining the depth of water in the said river, and also check-piles or standards in connection therewith, and for maintaining the said standard and standards. Also to repeal, alter, and vary the tolls, rates, and duties now authorized to be levied in respect of ships, vessels, wares, merchandize, and commodities entering in and using the said navigation, and to levy and raise the same, or other tolls, rates, and duties, and to confer, vary, and extinguish exemptions from the payment of tolls, rates, and duties, and other rights and privileges.

And powers will also be applied for, in the said Act, to enable the said River Dee Company to borrow and raise money on the security and credit of the present tolls, rates, and duties, and the tolls, rates, and duties to be granted by such intended Act, and also on the lands, tenements, hereditaments, and other property of the said Dee Company; and provisions will also be inserted in the said Act for giving further powers to the River Dee Commissioners, and for enabling them to appoint one or more Committee or Committees out of their body; and for the purposes aforesaid the several Acts of Parliament following, relating to the said River Dee Company, and the River Dee Commissioners, will be amended, altered, and enlarged, or repealed, so far as may be necessary for the above purposes; that is to say: An Act passed in the session of Parliament, held in the 11th and 12th years of King William the 3rd, intituled "An Act to enable the Mayor and Citizens of the city of Chester to recover and preserve the Navigation upon the River Dee;" an Act passed in the 6th year of the reign of King George the Second, intituled "An Act to recover and preserve the Navigation of the River Dee, in the county palatine of Chester;" an Act passed in the 14th year of the reign of King George the Second, intituled "An Act for incorporating the Undertakers of the Navigation of the River Dee;" an Act passed in the 17th year of the reign of King George the Second, intituled "An Act for explaining and amending an Act passed in the 6th year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled 'An Act to recover and preserve the Navigation of the River Dee, in the county palatine of Chester;'" and another Act passed in the 14th year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for incorporating the Undertakers of the Navigation of the River Dee, and for repealing the tonnage rates payable to the said Undertakers, and for granting to them other tonnage or keelage rates in lieu thereof, and for other purposes therein mentioned;" an Act passed in the 26th year of the Reign of King George the Second, intituled "An Act for confirming an Agreement entered into between the Company of Proprietors of the Undertaking for recovering and preserving the Navigation of the River Dee and Sir John Glynne, Baronet, Lord of the Manor of Hawarden, and several freeholders and Occupiers of Land within the said Manor, and for explaining and amending three several Acts of Parliament of the 6th, 14th, and 17th years of His present Majesty's reign, for recovering and preserving the Navigation of the said River Dee;" an Act passed in the 31st year of the reign of King George the 3rd, intituled "An Act for confirming an Agreement entered into between the Company of Proprietors of the Undertaking for recovering and preserving the Navigation of the River Dee and certain Lords of Manors and other persons entitled to rights of common upon the wastes and commons, and the old common salt marshes lying on the south side of the said river, below or to the north-east of Greenfield Gate, in the county of Flint, and an award made in consequence thereof;" and all other acts, charters, rights, and privileges, as may be inconsistent with the provisions of the said intended Act; and all such further and other powers will be inserted in the said intended Act as may be necessary and advisable for carrying into effect the objects aforesaid.—Dated the 15th day of October 1850.
