**T**HE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that, on Thursday the 31st instant, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering into Her Majesty's Victualling Stores, at Deptford, the undermentioned articles; viz.:

Rum (the produce of the British Possessions, and not less than half to be the produce of the British Possessions in the West Indies), 50,000 gallons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Sugar (the produce of the British Possessions), 100 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Cocoa, 100 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Soap (Mottled), 40 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Tobacco (Virginia), 20 tons; half to be delivered in a fortnight, and the remainder in a fortnight afterwards.

Rice (Bengal, White), 15 tons; half to be delivered in a fortnight, and the remainder in a fortnight afterwards.

Peas, 600 quarters; half to be delivered in a fortnight, and the remainder in a fortnight afterwards.

Oats (Scotch potato), 300 quarters; to be delivered within ten days.

Tea (Congou), 30,000 lbs.; half to be delivered in a month, and the remainder in two months.

The rum, sugar, cocoa, tobacco, rice, and tea to be exempted from the Customs' duties.
