

## CONTRACT FOR POLICE CLOTHING.

Department of the Comptroller for Victualling and Transport Services, Somerset-Place, December 28, 1850.

**T**HE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that, on Thursday the 16th January next, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering into Her Majesty's Victualling Stores, at Deptford, all such articles of

## POLICE CLOTHING,

for the use of the Police Force employed in Her Majesty's several Dock and Victualling Yards, as shall from time to time be demanded for twelve

months certain, and further, until the expiration of three months' warning.

Patterns of the articles, a form of the tender, the conditions of the contract, may be seen at the said Office.

No tender will be received after one o'clock on the day of treaty, nor any noticed unless the party attends, or an agent for him duly authorized in writing.

Every tender must be addressed to the Secretary of the Admiralty, and bear in the left-hand corner the words "Tender for Police Clothing," and must also be delivered at Somerset-place, accompanied by a letter, signed by two responsible persons, engaging to become bound with the person tendering in the sum of £500 for the due performance of the contract.
