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Warsaw, Jan. 30.

THE Council of War has; since the beginning of this month, met several times in the presence of the King of Poland at Zolkiew, to direct the preparations for the Campaign, and

in pursuance of the Resolutions there taken, Orders have been sent to the several Palatinates, and to the Officers commanding the Forces of the Crown in their Winter-quarters, to have their Troops ready to take the Field in the beginning of May. The advices from the Ottoman Quarters say, the *Turks* make their preparations for the Campaign with extraordinary diligence, that they may be in the Field as soon, if not before the *Poles*; That the Cham of *Tarsary* has promised to join them with 50000 Men the next Summer; And that they have put both Men and Provisions into *Caminiac*, which place they think now sufficiently provided with all things necessary for its defence. The *Cossacks*, in the Service of this Crown; have sent some of their Officers to *Zolkiew*, to sollicite the payment of the Sums of money that have been promised them, that they may be able to put themselves into a condition to continue their Services; The Pope's Nuncio, its said, has given them 50000 Florins, and has assured them that they shall have 50000 Florins more before they begin the Campaign.

Raab, Febr. 17. The *Hussars* of this place, *Comorra*, *Gran*, and *Vesprin*, having joined together to the number of about 800 Men, made lately an Incurſion into the *Turkiſh* Territories, towards the Bridge of *Eſſecke*, from whence they returned with 600 head of Cattle, and 60 Prisoners, notwithstanding they passed between *Buda* and *Alba-Regalis*. The Prisoners report, that the *Turks* have quite repaired that part of the Bridge of *Eſſecke* which the *Imperialiſts* burnt the last year, and that there are posted 6000 Men for the guard of it.

Vienna, Febr. 28. A Treaty is at last concluded with the *Transſylvanian* Deputies, the chief Articles of it are; That the Principality of *Transſylvania* shall be under the Emperor's Protection; That Prince *Abafii*, and his lawful Heirs, shall be confirmed in the Hereditary Succession thereof; And the States in all their Rights and Priviledges. In consideration of which, they promise to pay to his Imperial Majesty yearly 100000 Crowns, and 100000 Measures of Wheat, and the same quantity of Oats, for the subsistence of his Troops. The Letters from *Zolnocke* of the 15th, and from *Caschaw* of the 17th Instant, say, that the 4000 *Turks* which had advanced towards *Gyula*, were retired towards *Lippa*, and had repassed the River *Matos*, upon the News they had that General *Caraffa* was marching towards them with 6000 M.n. That General *Caprara* had reinforced the Blockade of *Montatz* with 4000 Men, under the Command of

the *Sieur Hussani* General of Battalia; And was preparing a Train of Artillery, in order to attack that place, which, we are told, he intends to do in the beginning of the next Month. They write from *Gran*, that 1000 *Turks* are arrived at *Buda*, from the Bridge of *Eſſecke*; And that the Visier of that place had sent a Detachment to *Agria*, to reinforce the Garrison there, which, it's said, consists at present in 4000 Men. The City of *Dobreeen*, upon the first News of *Teckeley's* arrival at *Waradin*, made some difficulty to pay their Contributions to the *Imperialiſts*, but have since continued their Payments as before; It's said, that some *Hungarians* that were quartered there, are gone back to *Teckeley*; And that some others who attempted it, have been taken by the *Imperialiſts*. By a Courier arrived this afternoon from *Hungary*, we have advicē, that General *Caraffa* having with the Troops under his Command attacked the Fortrels of *St. Job*, a Body of *Turks* commanded by *Teckeley* and a *Baſſa*, endeavoured to relieve it, but were so vigorously received by the *Imperialiſts*, that they were forced to retire with considerable loss; after which, the said Castle was surrendered to General *Caraffa* upon Articles.

Berlin, March 2. The great Chancellor of *Poland* is arrived here in his return home from *France*; His business at this Court is, to demand succors against the *Turks*. The Troops our Elector is to send to the Emperor's assistance, will certainly begin their march before the end of this month; The *Sieur Grankul* is gone to *Vienna*, to make the necessary Provision for them.

Cologne, March 9. The 5th Instant dyed here the Prince of *Mourbach*, after a long Sickness; He was Great Master and Chamberlain to the Elector of *Cologne*, and Prevost of the Cathedral Church of this City. The Bishop of *Strasbourg*, who is at present at the Court of *France*, will, it's not doubted, upon the News of the death of his Nephew, hasten his return hither. The Imperial Commissioners have this week examined some of the chief of those that are now Prisoners here, and particularly the late Secretary *Fuden*, whose Process they have ordered to be made. The House *Gulicke* lived in is demolishing, and upon the Ruines of it will be erected a Pillar, with an Inscription, shewing his Crime and Punishment. We are told from *Duseldorfe*, that the Electoral Prince *Palatin* is expected there the 20th Instant, from *Vienna*, to be present at the Assembly of the States of that Countrey, which are appointed to meet the 25th. After they are separated, it's believed his Highness will return to *Heydelberg*, and from thence to *Vienna*. The Letters from *Basle* of the 4th Instant tell us, that the 13 *Swiſſe Cantons* have at their General Dyet at *Baden*, promised mutually to assist each other, in case any of them be attacked upon any Pretence whatever. And that the Cantons of *Zurick*, *Berne*, *Basel* and *Schaffhausen*.

Jansen, were sending several Thousand Men to *Geneva*, for the defence of that City in case of need.

Hamburg, *March 11*. Things continue here much in the same state, as I told you in our last; The *Lübenburghers* are still posted about *Barsdorf*; The *Danish* Forces not far from the Frontiers of *Holfstein*, and those of *Brandenburgh* in the County of *Lauenburgh*, but in all probability it will not be long before they all retire; for its believed the Emperor will interpose his Authority for the putting an end to the differences between the Duke of *Zell*, and this City. Colonel *Mancken* and Captain *Pietersen*, who commanded the Troops of this City, that were sent out the 8th of the last Month, to succor the Fort of *Heskenkaten*, and behaved themselves so ill in that occasion, that upon their return hither they were made Prisoners; having been tried by a Council of War, were yesterday sentenced, the first to be beheaded, and the other to be shot to Death. The Duke of *Holfstein Gottorp* is at present at *Lubecke*. They write from *Stockholm*, that the Troops the King of *Sweden* has promised to assist the Emperor with, are to Rendezvous on the Frontiers of *Courland* towards the end of *April*.

Hague, *March 12*. Her Royal Highness parted from hence yesterday for *Dieren*, whither the Prince went on Thursday last. Prince *Waldecke* is gone to his house at *Culembourgh*. And Lieutenant General *Spaen* will return the next week to *Cleves*. Four Men of War are fitting at *Amsterdam*, one at *Rotterdam*, and one in *Zealand*, which are designed for the *Streights*, under the command of the Count de *Strum*. We are told that the Magistrates of *Hamburg* have written to this State, and to several Princes of the Empire, in answer to the Letters they had received from them, to thank them for their offered Mediation, and to declare their readiness to accept of the same, and to agree to a Conference, in order to compose amicably the Differences depending between the Duke of *Zell*, and their City, so soon as the said Duke shall have withdrawn his Troops out of their Territories. The Marquis de *Castel Moncayo*, the Spanish Envoy, is gone to *Amsterdam*, where he intends to stay a few days, after which he will return hither, and take his leave of the States General. The *Hess. Hoffs* having presented a Memorial concerning some Disputes arisen between the City of *Liege* and that of *Maastricht*, about their respective jurisdictions, an Answer has been given him thereunto by Order of the States General. The Letters from *Vienna*, tell us, that a Treaty was concluded with the Envoys from *Transylvania*, by which Prince *Abafsi*, and the States of that Countrey, do accept of the Emperor's Protection, and promise in consideration thereof a yearly Tribute; And that General *Caraffa* had taken the Castle of *St. Job*, having first defeated 1500 *Turks* who came to the Relief of it under the Command of Count *Teckelej*.

Brussels, *March 12*. Our Governor General, who went the 6th Instant to *Malines*, and from thence to *Antwerp*, to settle the payment of the Bills he received by the last Courier from *Madrid*, returned hither the 9th, and parted again this Evening for *Flanders*, intending to be to-morrow in the Afternoon at *Ostend*, to see a new Ship of 60 Guns launched there; In his return, his Excellency will stay one day at *Bruges*, and two at *Gaunt*, and is expected back here in the beginning of the next week. The 9th Instant arrived here an Envoy from the Elector of *Palatin*, who had Audience of his Excellency the next day; it is not said what his Business is. They write from *Paris*,

that the Gallies that are fitting out at *Marfeilles* will be commanded by the Duke of *Morsemar*, and that with these will join Seven or Eight men of War from *Toulon*; And that the Marschal d'Esree is to command in the Ocean a Squadron of 12 men of War; whereof Six are fitting at *Brest*, Four at *Rochefort*, and Two at *Heure de Grace*. We are told from *Coblenz*, that 1500 Men are daily at work to fortify the Castle of *Eerenbrefeyn*, which belongs to the Elector of *Trier*, and that the *Gariloa* has been lately reinforced with 200 Men. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 28th of the last month tell us, that a Treaty was concluded with the *Transylvanian* Deputies, by which, Prince *Abafsi* and the States of that Countrey, have put themselves under the Emperor's protection, and have promised to pay yearly for the subsistence of the Imperial Troops, that shall have their Winter-quarters on that side, 100000 Crowns in money, and 200000 Measures of Corn. The advices from *Upper Hungary* say, that the Inhabitants of *Debreccn* being inform'd of *Teckelej's* arrival at *Great Waradin*, had refused to pay their Contributions according to the Agreement they had made with the Imperialists, but that understanding afterward that *Teckelej* was not strong enough to protect them, they had taken other Resolutions. That General *Caraffa* having attacked *St. Job*, *Teckelej* with 1500 Men endeavored to succor it, but was beaten back by the Imperialists, who having afterwards with their Bombs set the Magazine within the place on Fire, the *Turks* were obliged to capitulate, and marching out 600 strong, were conducted to *Great Waradin*.

Paris, *March 13*. The Troops which the King has ordered to march towards *Savoy*, will make a Body of 8000 Men; They are to be commanded by Monsieur de *Castimur*, in the Quality of Lieutenant-General, and under him by Monsieur de *Melac*, Monsieur de *Nave*, and Monsieur de *Louguevyl*, as Brigadiers. The *Swissers*, it's said, have put 4000 Men into *Geneva*. The King has made the Marschal d'Esree Viceroy of his Dominions in *America*, that Command being vacant by the death of the Marschal d'Esrades.
