**Manchester Improvement Bill.—Township of
Beswick.**

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the
Poor of the parish of Epping, in the county
of Essex;

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the
Petty Sessions held for the division or di-
visions in which the said parish is situate;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of
Epping, in the county of Essex, according
to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:
And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the
said parish, held, after public notice in that behalf,
on the thirty-first day of October, one thousand
eight hundred and fifty, it was resolved,—

That the Churchwardens do apply to the Poor
Law Commissioners to put in force, within
the said parish, so far as the appointment of
a vestry clerk is concerned, the Act of Par-
liament passed in the 13 and 14 Victoria,
cap. 57, sect. 7, and intituled "An Act to
prevent the holding of vestry or other meet-
ings in churches, and for regulating the
appointment of vestry clerks."

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said
parish have made their application in writing to
the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above re-
solution.

Now, therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board,
under the authority of the several Statutes in that
behalf made and provided, do hereby order and
direct, that so much of the Act aforesaid as relates
to the appointment of a vestry clerk, shall forth-
with be applied to, and be put in force within, the
said parish of Epping.

And we do hereby order and direct that a copy
of this order shall be published in the London
Gazette.
