REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING-ROOM.

The Ladies, who purpose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing-Room, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names legibly written thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

And those Ladies, who are to be presented, are hereby informed, that it is absolutely necessary that their names, together with the names of the Ladies who are to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, on *Tuesday, the 1st of April next, before twelve o'clock*, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall take place unless the name of the Lady presenting, together with that of the Lady to be presented, shall appear on the card to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, which names shall correspond with those previously sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested, that in every case *written cards only* be delivered.

Board of Green Cloth, St. James's-Palace, March 28, 1851.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the carriages proceeding to Her Majesty's Drawing-Room, on Thursday the 3rd of April, are to fall into line and come down the left-hand side of St. James's-street, enter at the iron gate nearest the Palace, set down at the Arcade, turn round, and go out by the iron gate nearest Marlborough-house, to wait in St. James's-square. When called, they are to pass from the square through Charles-street, into Regent-street and Jermyn-street, come down St. James's-street as before, take up, and go away through Pall-Mall.

No hackney carriages will be admitted within the gates.

For all persons having the privilege of the *entrée*, tickets will be delivered at the Board of Green Cloth, on Tuesday next, from eleven till three o'clock; their carriages are to pass through

Constitution-hill-gate, into St. James's-park: those belonging to the Ambassadors and Foreign Ministers are to set down at the Ambassadors'-entrance in Marlborough-court, at the east end of St. James's-palace, and wait there till called: those belonging to the Cabinet Ministers and Great Officers of State are to set down in the Middle-court, and wait there: the carriages of all other persons having the *entrée* are likewise to set down in the Middle-court, and wait in the Stable-yard, or St. James's-park, till called: they are then to take up in the same order as they had set down, and pass away up St. James's-street.

No carriage will be admitted with company a second time with the same ticket; to prevent which, it must be produced at Constitution-hill-gate, and Stable-yard-gate also, where a corner of it will be torn off by the Marshalmen in attendance; and no person can be allowed the privilege of the *entrée* by any other approach to the Palace than as above directed.

THE Corporation for preserving and improving the port of Dublin, hereby give notice, that a lighthouse has been erected on Mine Head, Co. of Waterford, and another Lighthouse on Ballycottin Island, Co. Cork, from which lights will be exhibited on the night of the 1st of June 1851,

and which will thereafter be lighted every night from sun-set to sun-rise.

Specification given of the position and appearance of the lights, by Mr. Halpin, Inspector of Lighthouses.

Mine Head Lighthouse is in Lat. 51° 59' 33" N. and Long. 7° 35' 8" W. and bears

from Hook Tower Lighthouse, W. b N. distant 25½ nautic miles.

„ Coningbeg Rock, W. b N. ¾ N. distant 35¾ nautic miles.

„ Cable Island (South Point), E. ½ N. distant 12 nautic miles.

„ Ballycottin Island Lighthouse, E. ¼ N. distant 17¾ nautic miles.

„ Old Head of Kinsale (South Point), E. ½ N. distant 42½ nautic miles.

The light will be intermittent, eclipsed once in every minute, appearing of its full brightness during 50 seconds, and obscured during 10 seconds.

The lantern is 285 feet over high water level. The light will be shown from NE. by E. ¼ E. seaward, to W ¾ S. and in clear weather will be visible at the distance of 7 leagues.

Ballycottin Lighthouse is built on the outer island, west side of Ballycottin Bay, in Lat. 51° 49' 30" N. and Long. 7° 59' W. and bears

from Mine Head Lighthouse, W. ½ S. distant 17¾ nautic miles.

„ Cable Island (South Point), W. ½ S. distant 6 nautic miles.

„ Smith's Rock, E. ½ N. distant 1½ nautic miles.

„ Old Head of Kinsale, E. ½ N. distant 24½ nautic miles.

The light will be a flashing light, showing a bright flash once in every 10 seconds, or six flashes in each minute.

The lantern is 195 feet over high water level. The light will be shown from E. ½ N. seaward, to W. ½ N. and the flash will be visible at the distance of 6 leagues in clear weather.

The tower is circular, of stone colour. The projecting gallery and blocking under lantern sash, will be coloured red.

The bearings stated are magnetic—Var. 28½° W.
