WHEREAS the population of the parish of Mortlake in the county of Surrey, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons: And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held, after public notice in that behalf, on the twenty-ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, it was, amongst other things, resolved,—

That the Churchwardens do apply to the Poor Law Commissioners in England for an order that so much of the Act 13th and 14th Victoria, cap. 57, as applies to the regulating the appointment and payment of vestry clerks, be applied to and be put in force within the parish.

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the said resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct that so much of the Act aforesaid as relates to the appointment of a vestry clerk, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Mortlake.

And we do hereby order and direct, that a copy of this order shall be published in the London Gazette.
