The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for enabling Ecclesiastical Corporations, aggregate and sole, to grant leases for long terms of years," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,' and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act for enabling Ecclesiastical Corporations, aggregate and sole, to grant leases for long terms of years,' have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for determining the portion of the improved value to be made payable to us in a certain lease of a coal mine about to be granted by the Rector of Middleton, in the county of Lancaster :

"Whereas by the said last-recited Act it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole (with certain exceptions, which do not include Rectors), from time to time, with the consent or consents thereby required, to grant or demise by lease, in manner hereinafter mentioned, any mines, minerals, quarries, or beds belonging to such corporation, together with the right of working or of opening and working the same :

"And whereas by the same Act it is further enacted that in case of any lease of mines, mine-

erals, quarries, or beds granted thereunder, such portion of the improved value accruing under such lease, as by the authority provided in the first-recited Act shall be determined, not being more than three fourth parts nor less than one moiety of such improved value, shall forthwith, and from time to time as the same shall accrue, be paid to us, and shall be subject to the provisions relating to monies payable to us:

"And whereas, with the consent required by the said Act, and otherwise in accordance with the provisions thereof, it is proposed by the Reverend Richard Durnford, the present Rector of Middleton aforesaid, to grant or demise by lease certain lands and minerals situate in the township and parish of Middleton aforesaid, belonging to him as such Rector:

"And whereas the improved value to accrue under the lease so proposed to be granted as aforesaid will, according to the meaning of the same Act, be the whole of the rents, royalties, or other reservations which will become payable by virtue of such lease:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that three fourth parts of the whole net amount of the reservation or reservations to be made in the said lease so to be granted, whether consisting of rent, royalty, or otherwise, shall, by such lease, be made directly payable to us; and that we shall have all the like remedies in respect of such three fourth parts of any such reservation as aforesaid, as if the same were a separate rent reserved to us as lessors or grantors and reversioners of the premises comprised in such lease, independently of the rights and remedies of the said Richard Durnford and his successors, Rectors of Middleton, in respect of the remaining one fourth part thereof, without any priority or preference between us and the Rector for the time being: and, further, that we shall have full benefit and advantage, either jointly with or separately from the said Richard Durnford and his successors, Rectors of Middleton for the time being, of all or any of the covenants, conditions, and agreements in the said lease to be contained on the lessee's part, in like manner as if we had been grantors, lessors, and reversioners as aforesaid, and as in such lease shall be expressed; and that, for effectuating such objects, the said lease shall and may be framed in such manner, and contain all such clauses and provisions, as we shall approve, and shall have full force accordingly, any rule of law, statute, or custom to the contrary notwithstanding:

"And we further recommend and propose, that we be authorized, with the consent of the said Rector for the time being, and also of the Patron for the time being of the said Rectory of Middleton to apply, from time to time as we shall think fit, all or any part of the monies which shall be received by us by virtue or on account of the reservation or reservations aforesaid (after deducting therefrom all costs, charges, and expenses which we may have incurred in respect of the premises) towards making better provision for the cure of souls within the present limits of the parish of Middleton:

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been given to the said Richard Durnford, as such Rector as aforesaid, in accordance with the pro-

visions of the first-recited Act, and he has made no objection thereto.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Manchester.

#### **NOTICE TO MARINERS.**

*Hoy Sound Lighthouses.*

**T**HE Commissioners of the Northern Lighthouses hereby give notice, that two Lighthouses have been built upon the Island of Graem-say, lying in Hoy Sound, opposite Stromness, in Orkney, the Lights of which will be exhibited on the night of Thursday the 15th of May 1851, and every Night thereafter, from Sun-set till Sunrise.

The following is a specification of the position of the Lighthouses and of the appearance of the Lights, by Mr. Alan Stevenson, Engineer to the Commissioners :

The High Lighthouse is in N. lat. 58° 56' 09", and W. Long. 3° 16' 33". By compass, the Lighthouses bear from each other S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. and N.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. The High Light, towards the western entrance of Hoy Sound, is a Fixed Red Light, and the Low Light is a Fixed Bright Light. When seen in one line, they lead through the western entrance to Hoy Sound, in the fairway, between the dangerous rocks of Bow, off the Hoy Shore, and Kirk Rock, off the Stromness Shore. After running in on this line to a point half a mile off the Low Light, where the depth is about 8 fathoms, the High Red Light will be suddenly eclipsed by the land; and it is then time to haul towards the Stromness Shore, when the Red Light will immediately reappear.

The High Light is elevated 115 feet above the sea; but, being a Fixed Red Light, it will not be seen at a greater distance than about 10 nautic miles. It illuminates a small arc toward the S.E.

from S.E. by E. to S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. facing the western entrance to Hoy Sound. Toward Stromness, the High Tower shews a Fixed Bright Light, from S.S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. to W.S.W.

The Low Light, as already stated, will be known to mariners as a Fixed Bright Light. It is elevated 55 feet above the sea, and will be seen at the distance of 7 nautic miles, and at lesser distances, according to the state of the weather. The arc illuminated by this light extends from E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. to W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. and faces northward.

As a guide for vessels approaching Stromness from the Southward, it is also intended, in the course of a few weeks, to exhibit a light towards the Island of Cava, when a notice and description of the lights, illustrated by a tracing of the coast, will be given.

N.B. The variation of the compass is 27° 47' W.

The Commissioners hereby further give notice, that by virtue of a warrant from the Queen in Council, dated 14th August 1850, the following tolls will be levied in respect of these Lights; viz :

"For every vessel belonging to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland (the same not belonging to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, or being navigated wholly in ballast), and for every foreign vessel which, by any Act of Parliament, Order in Council, Convention, or Treaty, shall be privileged to enter the ports of the said United Kingdom, upon paying the same duties of tonnage as are paid by vessels belonging to the United Kingdom (the same not being navigated wholly in ballast), which shall arrive at, or depart from, the port of Stromness or its dependent creeks in Orkney, or which shall pass in either direction through the Pentland Firth, between the Island of Pomona or the mainland of Orkney, and Dunethead in Caithness, the toll of one Farthing per ton of the burden of every such vessel, for each time of passing or deriving benefit from the said Lights, if on a coasting voyage, and double the said toll for passing or deriving benefit on an over-sea voyage; and for each foreign vessel navigated as aforesaid not privileged in manner hereinbefore mentioned, double the amount of the respective tolls hereinbefore specified."
