REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE, AT ST. JAMES'S-PALACE.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who purpose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, on Monday, 26th May, before twelve o'clock, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall be made at the Levees but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half-past one o'clock.

Some irregularities having taken place, notice is hereby given, that no Officer of the Army or Navy, nor any Civilian, to be presented to the Queen at the Levee, can be admitted to the state apartments for that purpose, whose presentation card has not been previously sent to the Lord Chamberlain's Office according to the above regulations.

The name of any Gentleman not adhering to the regulation, must be excluded from the presentation book, and the reason entered for so doing; viz.—The contravention of the regulations.

Notice is hereby given, that all persons having Petitions or Addresses to present to Her Majesty at the Levee, are to send a card (having on it their names, a statement of the object of such Petitions or Addresses, and the names of the persons from whom they come) to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, on Monday, 26th May, before twelve o'clock; and that two other cards, having on them precisely what is written upon that sent to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, are to be taken to the Levee; one of the two cards to be delivered to the Page in the Ante-Room, and the other to the Lord Chamberlain, who will read its contents to Her Majesty; and, on these occasions, no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for raising the sum of seventeen millions seven hundred and fifty-six thousand six hundred pounds, by Exchequer bills, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

An Act to indemnify such persons in the United Kingdom as have omitted to qualify themselves for offices and employments, and to extend the time limited for those purposes respectively.

An Act for the better protection of persons under the care and control of others as apprentices or servants; and to enable the guardians and overseers of the poor to institute and conduct prosecutions in certain cases.

An Act for building a bridge over Ouseburn, with approaches thereto, in the borough and county of Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

An Act for the improvement of the sewerage of the borough of Leicester, and for making other provisions for the sanitary regulation of such borough.

An Act to make the limits of the Dewsbury Gas Act commensurate with the whole of the parish of Dewsbury and the township of Batley, in the parish of Batley, and to authorize the raising of a further sum of money.

An Act for repairing and managing the roads from the Brighthelmston Road, at Pyecombe, to Hand Cross, and from Pyecombe to the Henfield Road, at Poyning's Common, in the county of Sussex.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS the mails passing between the West Indies and the United States of America are about to be landed at the island of Saint Thomas, and sent from thence to their places of destination.

Now we, the undersigned, being two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do, in exercise of the power and authority in us for such purpose vested in and by an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," and of all other powers and authorities enabling us in this behalf, direct that letters transmitted by packet-boat between any ports in Her Majesty's colonies, or between any port in Her Majesty's colonies and any foreign port, or between one foreign port and any other foreign port respectively, landed at the island of Saint Thomas and sent on from thence to their places of destination without passing through the United Kingdom, shall be charged with the same rates of postage only as would have been chargeable thereon if the same had been sent direct to their places of destination without having been first landed at the said island of Saint Thomas.

And we direct that printed newspapers (whether British, Colonial, or Foreign,) transmitted by packet-boat between any port in Her Majesty's colonies and any foreign port, or between one foreign port and any other foreign port respectively, landed at the island of Saint Thomas and sent on from thence to their places of destination without passing through the United Kingdom, shall be charged with the same rates of postage only as would have been chargeable thereon if the same had been sent direct to their

places of destination without having been first landed at the said island of Saint Thomas.

And we direct that the several terms and expressions used in this warrant, shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act of the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.

And we hereby declare and direct that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any two of them, by warrant under their hands, at any time hereafter, to alter or repeal any of the regulations hereby made, and to make and establish any other regulations in lieu thereof.

Metropolis Water Bill.

IN compliance with a resolution of the Select Committee on Standing Orders, agreed to by the Honourable the House of Commons, on the 16th day of May instant, notice is hereby given, that a Bill has been brought into that Honourable House, intituled "A Bill for the better supply of water to the Metropolis," and that by such Bill it is proposed to be enacted that the Governor and Company of the New River, brought from Chadwell and Amwell to London, commonly called the New River Company, the Company of Proprietors of the East London Water-Works, the Southwark and Vauxhall Water Company, the West Middlesex Water-Works Company, the Lambeth Water-Works Company, the Governor and Company of

Chelsea Water-Works, the Grand Junction Water-Works Company, the Company of Proprietors of the Kent Water-Works, and the Hampstead Water-Works Company, shall, after a day to be specified in the said Bill, be dissolved, and that the several persons and corporations who on such day may be proprietors of shares in the said Companies to be dissolved, or of the several capitals or joint stocks thereof, shall be one body politic and corporate, by the name of "The Metropolitan Water Company," for making, maintaining, and continuing all such works and conveniences as the said dissolved Companies, or any of them, are now authorized to make, maintain, or continue, and also all such other works and conveniences as may be necessary for conveying a sufficient supply of water to the places which the Metropolitan Water Company are by the said Bill authorized to supply; and that the said Metropolitan Water Company may have perpetual succession, and a common seal, and may sue and be sued, and have power to take, purchase, and hold lands for the purposes of the said Bill. And that the said Metropolitan Water Company may supply with water all places and parts which all or any of the said dissolved Companies are now authorized to supply with water. And that from and after the day so to be specified as aforesaid, all the lands, streams, waters, aqueducts, reservoirs, and rights in relation to land, and all water-mains, pipes, engines, machinery, plant, and works, and all moneys, goods, chattels, effects, bonds, deeds, securities, books, plans, and writings, and all other property whatsoever, which on such day may belong to the said dissolved Companies, and all rights of drawing water from the river Thames, the river Lea, or elsewhere, and all rights auxiliary thereto, and all other powers, liberties, rights and privileges relating to the procuring or the supply of water then vested in or exercisable by such Companies under the Acts in the said Bill mentioned, shall belong to and be exercisable by the said Metropolitan Water Company; and that by the said Bill it is intended to make provisions that the capital of the said Metropolitan Water Company shall consist of a consolidated capital stock, to be allotted as therein mentioned to the several companies to be dissolved under the said Bill, and be divided amongst the persons and corporations constituting the said Metropolitan Water Company, the amount of such consolidated capital stock so to be allotted to be determined by arbitration; and that such capital stock shall be personal estate; and that the said Metropolitan Water Company may borrow money on mortgage and may purchase by agreement or take on lease any streams, springs, lands, rights, or easements which may be necessary for the purposes of the said Bill, and to sell and dispose of any lands or other property not wanted for the purposes of the said Bill; and may demand rates for the supply of water in the districts now supplied by the dissolved Companies; and that in certain cases the churchwardens and overseers of any parish within such districts may levy rates for the supply of water; and that by such Bill it is proposed to empower the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury to purchase the property, works, and rights of the said Metropolitan Water Company, on the terms therein mentioned.

And that by the said Bill it is intended to repeal, amend, or alter the several Acts following, that is to say: Acts relating to the New River Company, 12 Geo. II., cap. 32; 3 Geo. IV., cap. 109. Acts relating to the East London Water-Works Company, 47 Geo. III., cap. 72; 48 Geo. III., cap. 8; 10 Geo. IV., cap. 117. Acts relating to the Southwark and Vauxhall and Vauxhall Water-Works
