To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the township of March, in the county of Cambridge;

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said township is situate; And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the township of March, in the county of Cambridge, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas a meeting of the Vestry of the said township was held on the eighteenth day of October last, in pursuance of a notice, for the following purpose; that is to say,—

"That, if thought advisable so to do, to resolve "and order, that the Churchwardens apply "to the Commissioners for administering the "laws for the relief of the poor in England, "to make an Order, under their seal of office, "that an Act of Parliament made and passed "in the last session of Parliament, intituled " "An Act to prevent the holding of vestry "or other meetings in churches, and for regulating the appointment of vestry clerks," "shall be applied to, and put in force within, "the said township."

And at such meeting a resolution was passed, in the following terms; that is to say,—

"That the Churchwardens be and they were "authorized to make application, pursuant to "the said Act of Parliament, to you, the said "Commissioners for administering the laws "for the relief of the poor in England, requiring you to make an Order, under your "seal of office, that the said Act might be applied to and put in force in this township."

And whereas the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said township have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:

ART. 1. That the whole of the aforesaid Act shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within, the said township of March.

ART. 2. That a copy of this order shall be published in the London Gazette.
