ALTERATION OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT; AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of an Act passed in the 13th year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

RICHARD MAYNE, one of the Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, being appointed by one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State to do all things by the said Act authorized to be done by the Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby increase the number of carriages at each standing as is specified, and within the boundaries set forth for each standing, provided that no hackney carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.
