Naples, March 5.

Oloncl Vespassano has already raifed 300 Men in this kingdom for the Service of the Republick of Venice, (which he has sent to the Levant) and hopes before the end of this month to have quite finished the Levy he

is to make. Genoua, March 9. We have an account from Leghorne, that fix Gallies, and three Gallots, are fitting out there with great diligence, which are to serve with the Pope's Gallies, and those of Malta, against the Turks By a Vellel arrived from Cadiz, we are informed, that Sixteen spanish Men of War are ordered to go and meet the Galconsthat are expected home in fune The Letters from Provence co firm that the French Gillies are firting at Marseillet, and a Squadron of Men of War at Toulon, which are to join tog ther under the Command of the Duke de Mortemar. The Sieur d'Obbeville, Envoy from France, had this week Audience of the Doge, but we do not know the Subject of it. The Mafter of a Veffel which arrived here this week from Corfou, assures us, that the Venetian Fleet would be ready to I'i from thence before the end of this Month, and that it was believed the Captain-General would begin the Campagne with the Siege of Mor don or Larta. The Advices from the Levant say the Turks make great Preparations for the Cam-Pagne in Hungary. The Count de Fuensalida is Expected here the next M nih from Sardinia, in his way to Mi.an; and in the mean time the Palace of Prince Doria is preparing for him.

Venice, March 15. By a Vellel which came late. ly from Zara, we are informed, that before her departure from thence, several Galeasses arrived there from Corfou, to tak. on Board the Vene-Fian Troops that have had their Winter-quarters on that fide. And by Letters of the 30th of the last Month from Corfon we are informed, that the Caphin-General hath sent a Squadron of Men of War to Cruise in the Archipelago, under the command of Signior Pisani, and that he would part from thence himself with the whole Fleet, so soon as the great Convoy he expected from hence was prrived there. On Thursday last Count Coningsmarks, General of the Forces of this State by Land, had sudience of the Senate: He will part from hence ry suddenly for the Levant. The Troops of the Filaneze are embarqued; and those of Hanouer re expected at the Lido before the end of this ionth. On Monday last arrived here a Barque om Spalairo, with advice, that the Sangiac of Al-nia having affembled what Troops he could, as marched with them towards Pastrorick with

fign, as was believed, to attack that place; and the Venetian Forces in those quarters did fore draw together to oppose him. The ditore General Cornaro is preparing for his departure ato go and take possition of his Government of Dalmatia. This week was madent trial of several Fire-works invented by the segenier Veltrin which incceeded so well, that the Smare have given him a yearly Pension of 400

Vienna, March 17, An Officer arrived her yesterday from Upper Hungary, who says General Caprara was before Mongage with 4000 Foots 00 Horse, six Mortars, and as many pieces of Counon for Battery; and that there was in the placera strong Garison, who seemed resolved to defind it to he last, having had fresh assurances of Relief fr. Count Teckeley; but if we may give Credit to th Advices we have as well from Caschaw as Zolnocke he has promified them what he canno perform for though the Turks may be able too drew together from Great Waradin, and the Neighbouring Gari fons, a Body of 5 or 6000 Men, to allit him for the fuccoring of that Fortress, yes being very narrowly observed by the Imperialists, who have their quarters on that fide under the Command of Lieutenant General de Merey, and Major Géneral Heuster, they can no sooner begin to move (as they have more than once attempted during this-Winter) but these will be ready to oppo e them. The Heer Grunckau, the Brandenburgh Commissar ry, will part hom neace to morrow, to return to Berlin, having finished the Commission he was fent hid er upon; He has affured the Imperial Mi+ nisters, that the Brandenburgh Forces will be in Hungary by the 13th of April, which is confirmed by the Letters we have from Berlin; They will be 8000 fighting Men, belides a confiderable number of Gunners and Fire-workers. We had a report here the last week, that the Turks bing very much diffatisfied with Teckeley, had carried him back to Belgrade, to keep him there, till they had the Grand Signior's farther Orders concerning him; but the last Letters from Upper Hungary make no mention therof, but on the contrary fay, that according to the freshest News they had of him, he was still at Great Waradin, having with him about 800 Hungarians, who have returned to him fince his Liberty. Viceroy of Croatia has had this week feveral Conferences with the Prince of Dietrichstein, President of the Chamber of Gratz, with others of the Emperor's principal Ministers, with whom, it's faid, he has concerted the matters he came hither about, concerning the Forces that are maintained by that Countrey for the Emperor's Service, fo. that it's believed he willrow in few days return to his Government; The Marquis de Parella, who has a Regiment in Growia, is likewise, on his departure. General Caraffa has sent an actount hither, That he has received for Contributions from the City of Debrecen 200000 Floring, and 1000 Sacks of Corn; And that the Bassa who commends the Ottoman Forces on the other fide of the Teiffe, bas had the Title of Scrafquier conforced upon him

by the new Grand Visier Solyman. We have Rewise Advice, that the Cham of Tartary has Orders to fend, besides the Troops he is to join with the Turks against the Poles, a Body of Tartars to ferve in Hungary the next Campagne. The Letters from Buda continue to say, that the Grand Visier is expected the next month at Belgrade, and that the Turks talk of having a very great Army in Hungary. We are told from Cracow, that the Count Chieki, who went with a Commisfion from the Emperor to the Prince of Valachia, was come back to the Court of Poland, not baving been admitted to fee him, but only to confer with some of his Ministers, who shewed no disposition to embrace his Proposals; in his return he was followed by a Party of Tartars, but having notice of it he escaped them.

Benne, March 20. The Elector of Mentz is expected here in a Fortnight or three weeks, to confer with our Elector about the present juncture of affairs. The Bishop of Strasburgh is likewise expected about that time from France. Count Emanuel de Furstemberg, Brother to the Prince of Mourback lately deceased, is arrived here from Vienna.

Cologne, March 26, The Electoral Prince Palatine returned this Evening to Dufeldorpe, where the States of Juliers and Bergs are to meet to morrow. The Imperial Sub-Commissioners are expecting farther directions from Vienna concerning Juden, and the rest that are now Prisoners here, who in the mean time have been several times examined by them. The Officers that are raising Men in these Parts for the Emperor's Service have almost compleated their Levics. The Bishop of Strasburgh is expected in few days at Bonne.

Hamburgh, March 26. The 24th inflant, Colonel Van Bancken was carried under a good Guard to the Hornwork, where he was shot to death by three Officers, according to the Sentence that had been given against him; And at the same time was likewise executed the Sentence against Lieutenant Pietersen, whose Sword was broke over his head. The King of Denmark, the Elector of Brandenburgh, and other Princes, do employ their offices for the putting an end to the differences between the Duke of ZeB and this City.

Hague, March 29. The States of Friesland have, by their Deputies in the Assembly of the States General, declared their Confint to the State of the War for this present Year, 'upon Condition that their Quota for the Fortifications be employed as they themselves shall direct for the repairing the Fortifications of several places within that Province. It has been proposed in the States of Holland to raise the 200 Penny, for the paying off part of the Debts contracted during the last War, which the City of Amsterdam is inclined to, but Leyden, Delfe, and some other Towns oppose it. The Deputies that are come hither from Zealand, have had several Con ferences with those of this Province, and are preparing to return home. They write from Zell of the 23d instant, that an Envoy was arrived there from the Elector of Brandenburgh, to endeavor to compose the differences between the Duke of Zell and the City of Hamburgh. Prince Waldecke and Lieutenant General Spaen are still here,
