of any business of or relating to this parish."

"That the Vestry approve of having the pro-"posed vestry-room erected in the south-"western part of the church-yard, and hereby "authorize the Churchwardens to apply for "a faculty for that purpose."

"That the Churchwardens be authorized to borrow a sum not exceeding £2,500, and to distribute the repayment over ten years, as allowed by the Act of Parliament."

No person will be accepted for more than one Canteen, nor any person who is not of unexceptionable character, or who will not undertake bonâ fide to reside in the Canteen and conduct the business thereof in his own person; and two sureties will be required for the payment of the rent, and of all sums which may become due in respect of the Canteen, and for the due performance of the several conditions annexed to the tender, which will be furnished, on application at this office, Sundays excepted, between the hours of ten and four, and by the Barrack Masters at the several barracks, and from whom every requisite information can be obtained.

Persons forwarding proposals will clearly understand that the sale of ardent or spirituous liquors will be strictly prohibited.

Sealed proposals, addressed to the Secretary to the Board of Ordnance, Pall Mall, London, will be received at this Office on or before Monday, the 8th September next, after which day no proposal will be noticed.

The rents of the Canteens, as dwellings, are fixed at the sums stated below, therefore the biddings will be upon what is offered for every ten men per month, exclusive of serjeants, occupying the barracks, the number being ascertained from the Barrack Masters' returns, made up at twelve o'clock at noon on the 1st day of every month.
